"On or about 16 December 1944 while fighting in Gurzenich, Germany, my tank was knocked out and burned after receiving a direct hit on the fuel container of the flame-thrower. Private Wyley V. Sears, 34263051, tank driver and Private First Class Louis (NMI) Hovitz, 32214144, Light Machine Gunner were killed instantly. Private First Class Clarence (NMI) Watson, 35350588, Cannoneer, was killed while trying to get out of the tank turret by enemy machine gun fire and fell back inside the tank turret. Corporal Walter G. Czerwinski, 35283860, Tank Gunner, and myself, Tank Commander were the only two that succeeded in escaping from the tank."
