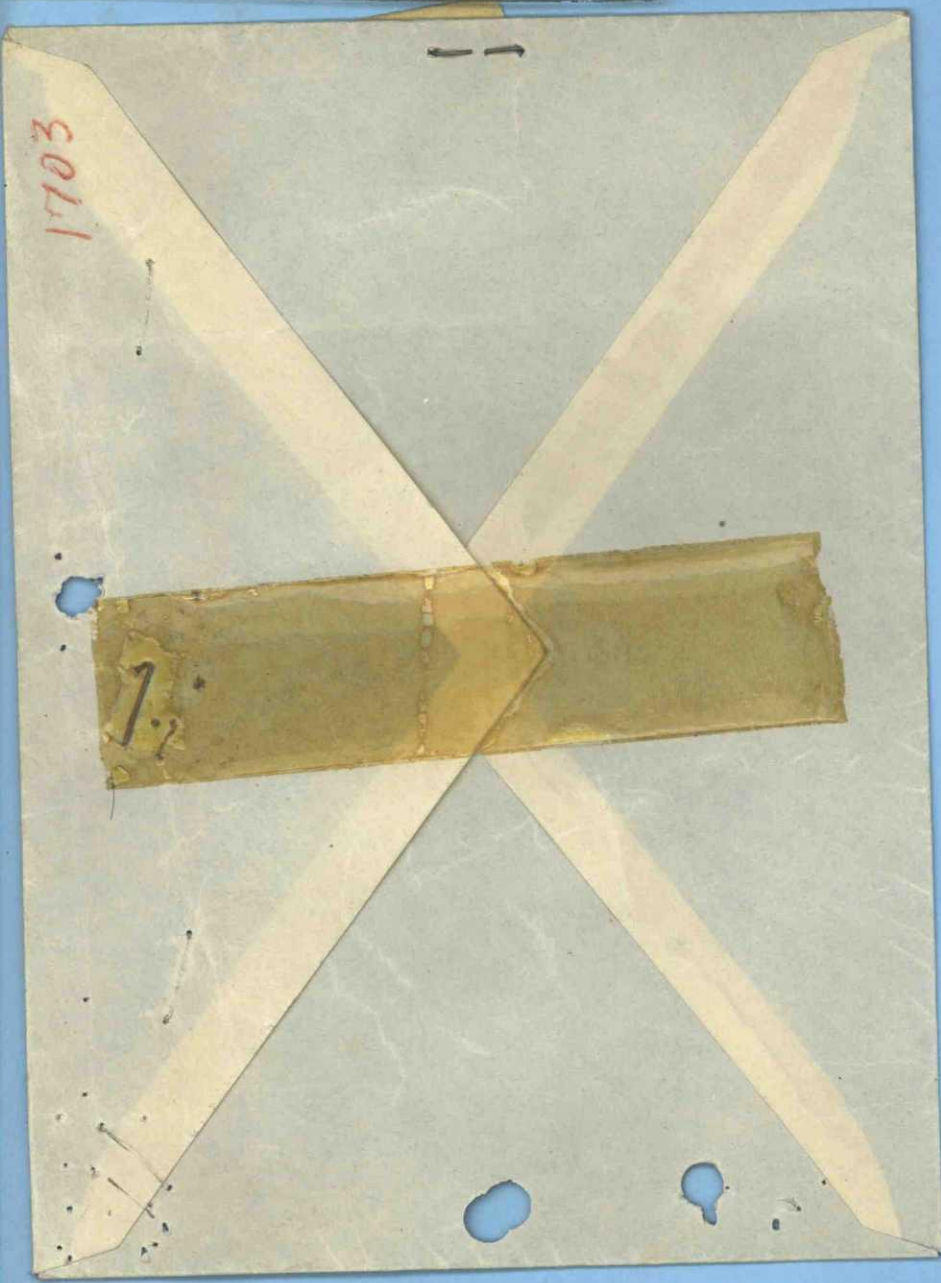

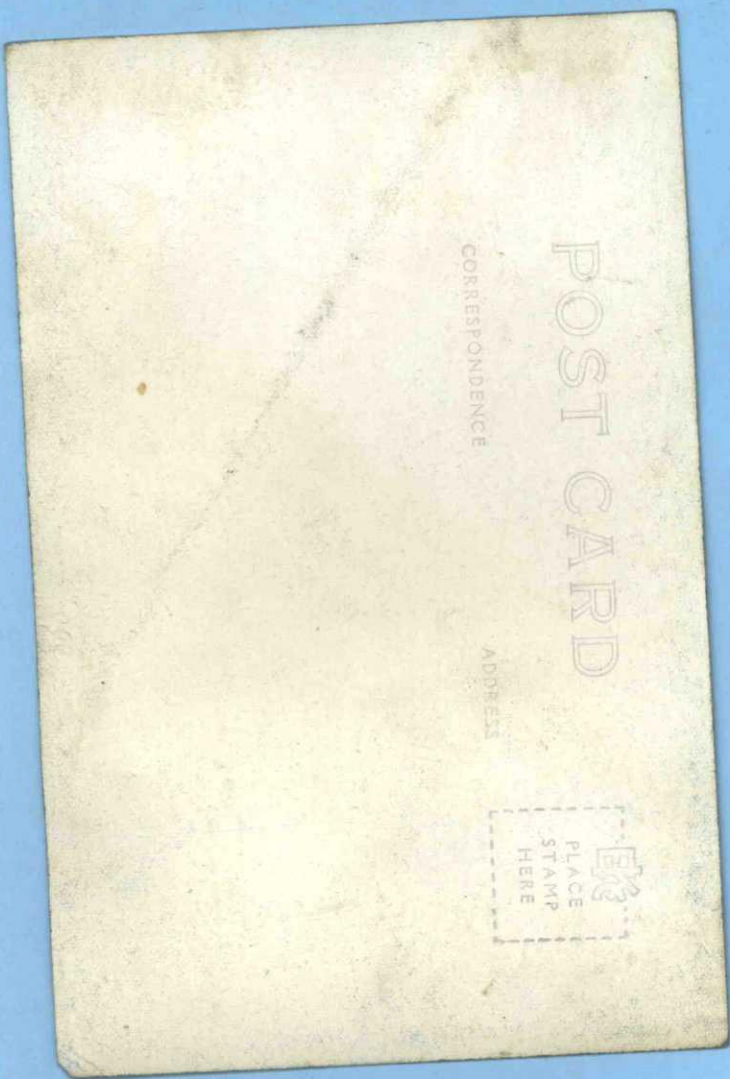

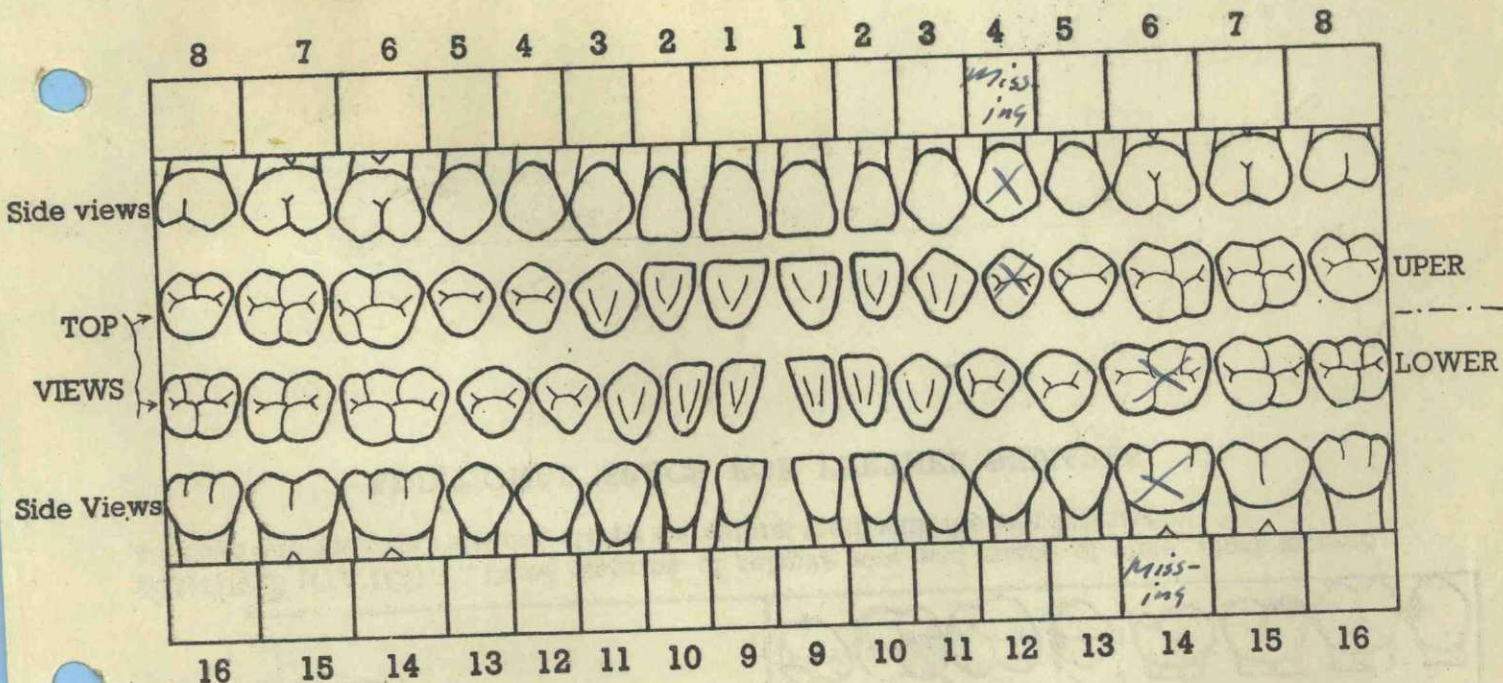

This dental chart is very important and should be filled in with great care. There are 32 teeth to be accounted for, as shown by the numbers on the chart. Beginning at the middle line in both upper and lower jaws, the teeth are arranged symmetrically on either side and classed as incisors (cutting teeth), cuspids or canines (tearing teeth), bicuspid (chewing teeth), and molars (principal chewing teeth). An examination should be made and findings charted to cover the following basic conditions: Lost teeth, crowned teeth, bridge work, fillings, caries (cavities of decay), dentures (plates), and any deformity of jaws found. See reverse side for illustrations.

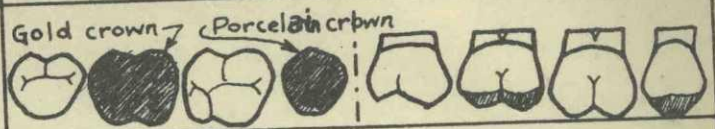

SUBJECT: Isolated Burials.

TO : Graves Registration Officer, Third United States Army, APO 403, U. S. Army.

1. Information received from the Bourgmestre of Tavigny, Belgium, states that eight (8) US personnel are buried at Tavigny (coordinates P600-694, sheet 6, GSGS 4042), six miles Northwest of FOY US Military Cemetery. These men were crew members of tanks stationed in the vicinity. Identification was not possible because the Germans requested all personal effects and means of identification be handed over to them. Graves, which are located in a small meadow belonging to the Castle of Tavigny, are very shallow due to the watery underground.

2. These isolated graves have also been reported to this Headquarters by Detachment F2D2 Co. D, 2nd ECA Regt., but it was stated that nine (9) unidentified US personnel (T-1729 thru T-1737) were buried at Tavigny.

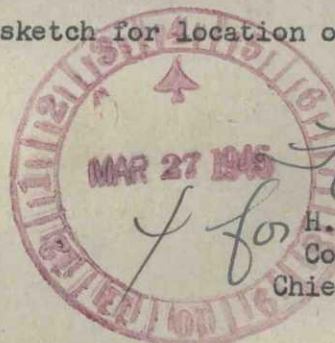
3. Request an investigation be made prior to and upon disinterment in an attempt to identify deceased. The Bourgmestre of Tavigny, who is also the owner of the property where graves are located, should be contacted. Reinterment will be made in the nearest US Military Cemetery in accordance with existing procedure. Check List for Disinterments and GR Form #1 will be attached to this correspondence and returned to this office.

4. "T" numbers are assigned by this office for reference purposes only prior to reinterment in an established US Military Cemetery. "T" number will always be placed in the lower left hand corner of GR Form #1 to which applicable.

5. Inclosed herewith is a sketch for location of the graves.
