REPORT OF INVESTIGATION

1. Investigation conducted in the Alton area failed to locate the remains of Lt. Alvin S. Downing, 54215949.

2. Physical search of the Alton area revealed the following vehicles:

a. A-7 (105 AM) no markings except "B 33787 - 4128" on a gun mount available.

b. A-7 (105 AM) bearing markings "1 53 1 15, 4039807."

3. Search of the above vehicles and the surrounding area was made with negative results. Sketch of the location of vehicles is included.

4. Physical search including the journey and vicinity areas failed to locate vehicle "C. 4035371. It is believed that this vehicle has been salvaged and removed from the area.

5. Captain G. G. Downing, son of Alvin S. Downing, who is serving on removal of vehicles from the Alton area. He reports have been from various sources and removed. Sketch of location is included.

6. Interrogation of W. G. Sullivan, Forest Guard, living in Alton, revealed that remains of five (5) American deceased A-7s on previously listed from the Alton area. Sketch is included.

7. Reference is made to A. S. Downing, location of records in that his aircraft indicated that the following American aircraft were received in the Alton area:

a. A-7, bearing markings "B 33787 - 4128" on a gun mount available.

b. A-7, bearing markings "1 53 1 15, 4039807, 4035371, 4035372, 4035373, 4035374, 4035375, 4035376, 4035377, 4035378, 4035379, 4035380" from serial number 4035374 by W. G. Downing.

8. If the above mentioned aircraft were received in Alton, they were received there.

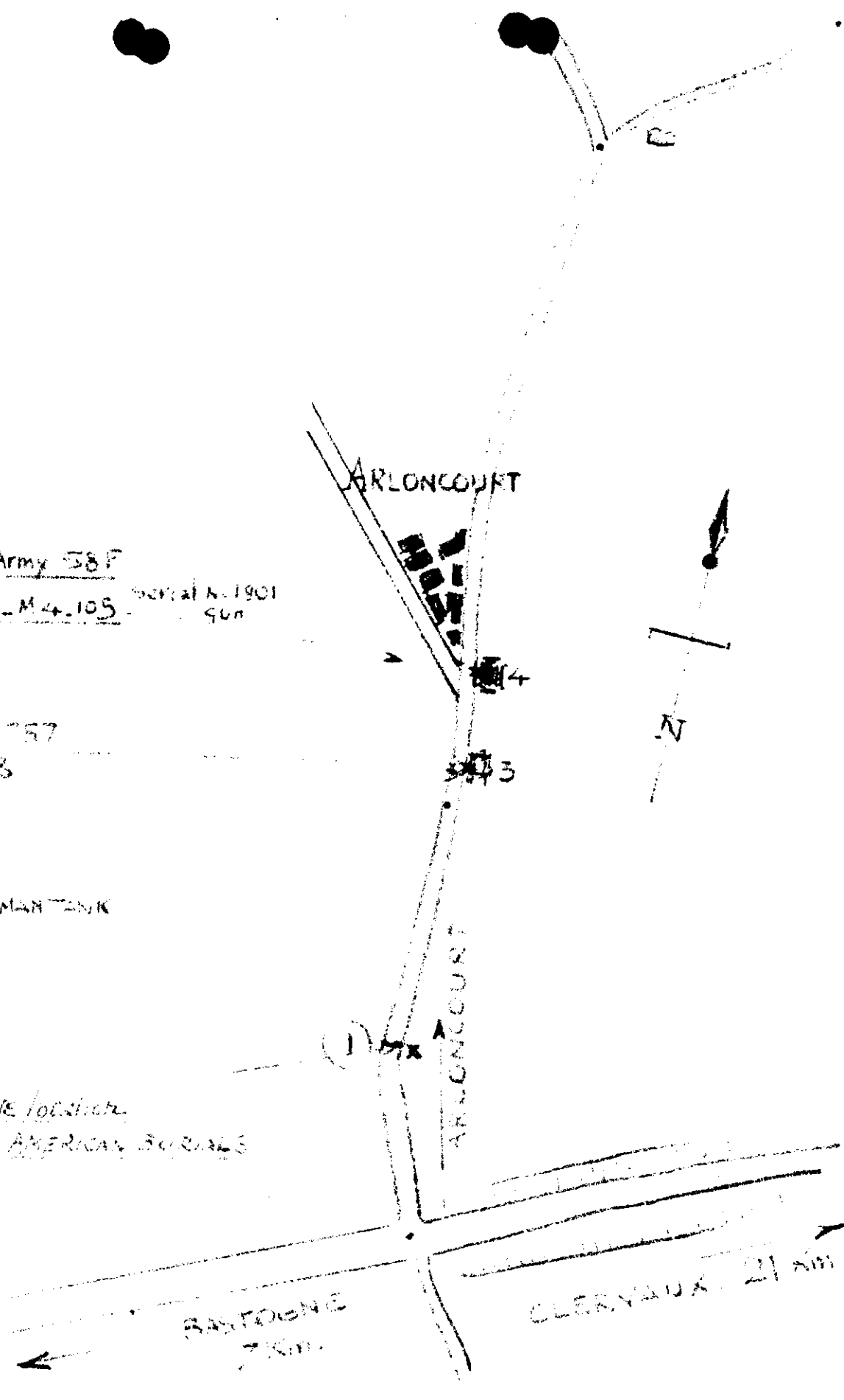

I, the undersigned, policeman in the community of Longvilly, declare that in August 1945, there were five American bodies buried two hundred meters from Arloncourt.

I have reported them to the Officer in charge of the disinterments, and also the presence of bones left in a half-truck. I remember that one of the two bodies buried near the half-truck, in the ditch along the road, was very tall, about one meter eighty-five centimeters, but not very fat.

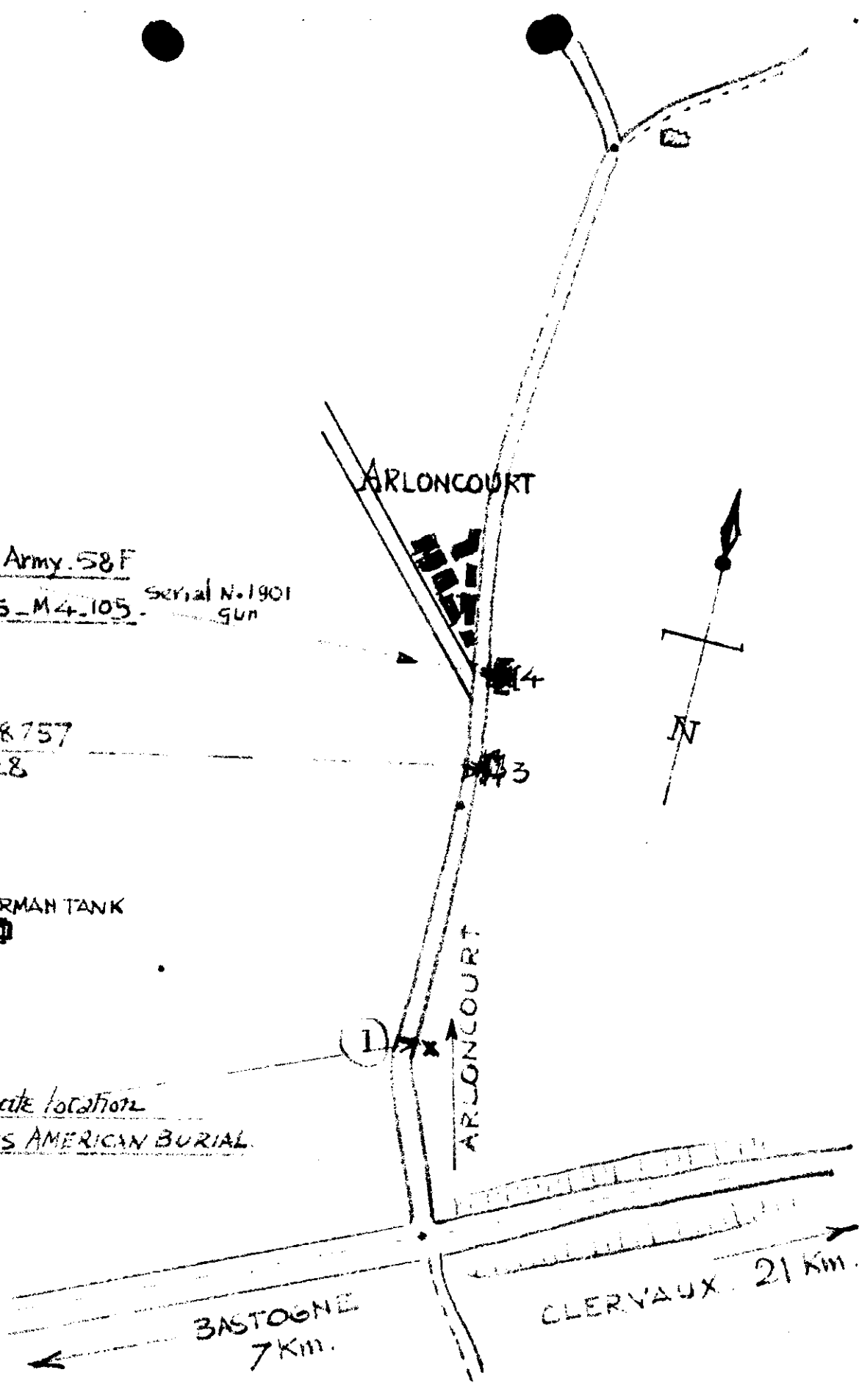

REPORT OF INVESTIGATION

1. Investigation conducted in the Arloncourt area failed to locate the remains of Pfc. Alvin B. HUFFMAN, 34213949.

2. Physical search of the Arloncourt area revealed the following US vehicles:

- a. M-7 (105 MM) No markings except "D 38757 - 4128" on M 4 gun mount available.
- b. M-7 (105 MM) bearing markings "1 A 58 F B 15,  
USA 4039607.

3. A search of the above vehicles and the surrounding area was made with negative results. Sketch showing location of vehicles is inclosed.

4. A physical search including the Bourcy and Longvilly areas failed to locate vehicle No. 4065371. It is believed that this vehicle has been salvaged and removed from the area.

5. Statement was obtained from G. Fiasse of Longvilly who is salvaging and removing US vehicles from the Arloncourt area. No remains have been found during any of his removals. Statement is inclosed.

6. Interrogation of E. J. Rouling, forest guard, living in Arloncourt, revealed that remains of five (5) American deceased had been previously disinterred from the Arloncourt area. Statement is inclosed.

7. Reference is made to Par. 6 above. A check of records in this headquarters indicates that the following American deceased were recovered from the Arloncourt area:

- a. Harmon F. YATES, 34054189 from coordinates P-6160 by the 3043rd QM Graves Registration Co.
- b. Melvin W. PADGETT, 15044190, Bernard P. POSEY 35845440, David SEGAL, 37167378, and Unknown X-90 from coordinates P-618604 by the 601 QM Graves Registration Co.

8. All the above mentioned deceased were reinterred in US Military Cemetery, Foy, Belgium.

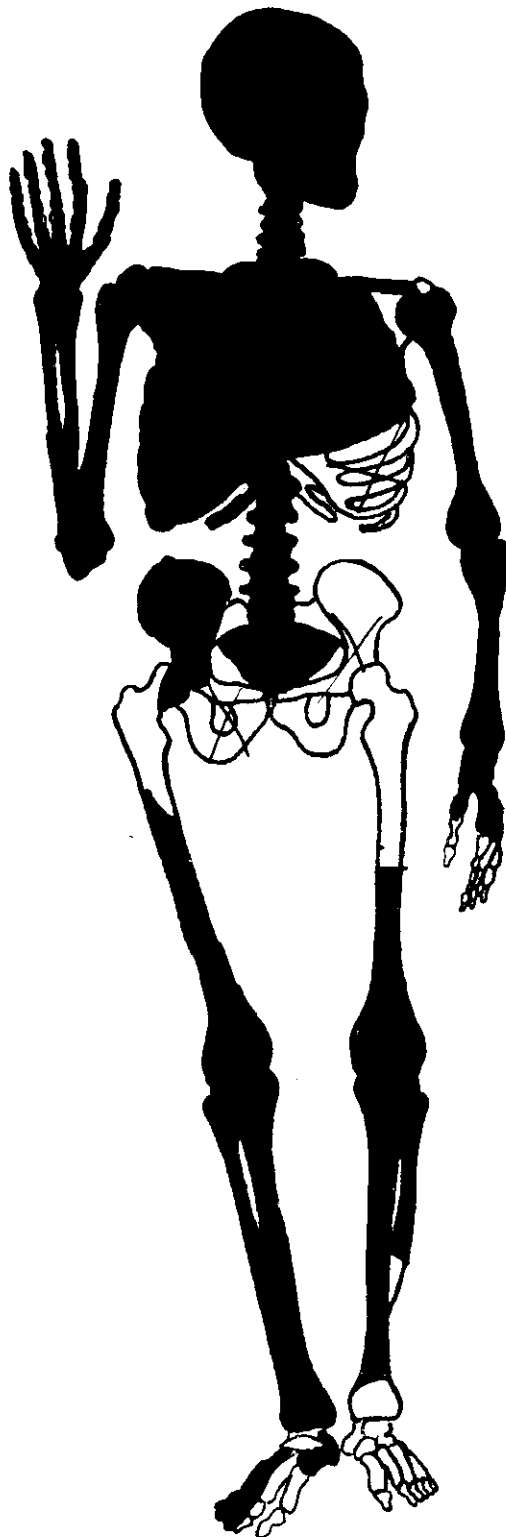
