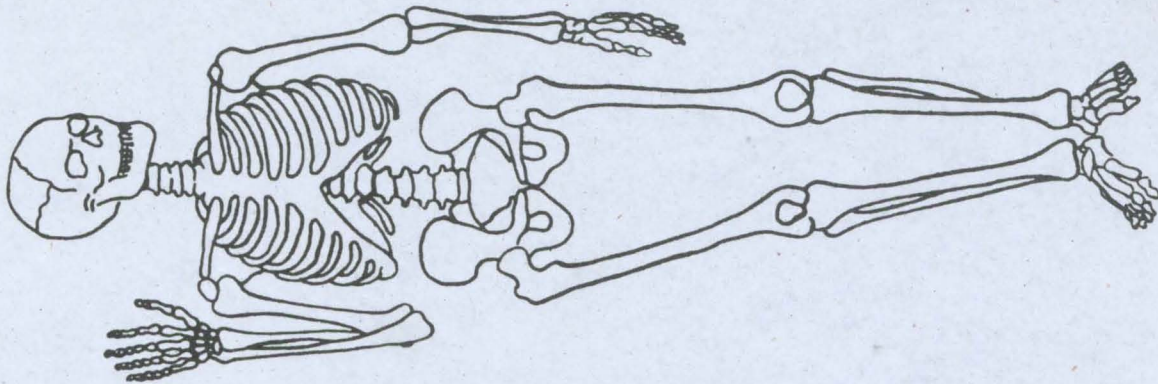



This dental chart is very important and should be filled in with great care. There are 32 teeth to be accounted for, as shown by the numbers on the chart. Beginning at the middle line in both upper and lower jaws, the teeth are arranged symmetrically on either side and classed as incisors (cutting teeth), cuspids or canines (tearing teeth), bicuspid (chewing teeth), and molars (principal chewing teeth). An examination should be made and findings charted to cover the following basic conditions: Lost teeth, crowned teeth, bridge work, fillings, caries (cavities of decay), dentures (plates), and any deformity of jaws found. The remains of X-3323 Neuville were recovered from Ubbergen, Holland. Date of death was estimated as 25 September 1944.

The above remains were associated by this headquarters with Cpl. George K. Black, 35570418 of Co. "C", 325 Glider Inf., 82 Airborne Div. A check of physical and dental characteristics of casualties reported KIA in this area was made with the remains of X-3323 and it was found that there was a similarity in tooth charts of X-3323 with dental data for Cpl. Black reported KIA in the above area 2 October 1944. The estimated height of X-3323 (6'1") is in agreement with height shown on 371 Form for Cpl. Black (6'). A gold wedding ring band inscribed "M.G." was found on second finger of left hand of X-3323.

In view of the above and to substantiate the association AGRC radio 7201 was dispatched to OQMG to contact NOK for additional dental data and information about the wedding band found with remains of X-3323. OQMG letter dated 15 February 1950 was received with copy of letter from NOK. The dental data received was not sufficient to substantiate the identification of Cpl. Black. NOK further advises that Cpl. Balck never wore a ring.

Due to the above and the fact that there are no unresolved casualties listed in the Holland Map Sheet with the initials "M.G." the remains of X-3323 are submitted as Unidentifiable.

I regret the necessity of writing to you with reference to your son, the late Corporal George K. Black.

Every effort is being expended by this Office and the American Graves Registration Service overseas to recover and identify the remains of all deceased American personnel of World War II. I feel sure that you will appreciate the tremendous complexities of this undertaking, as well as the amount of time its proper accomplishment demands. To facilitate this project, complete dental records on an individual are helpful and, in some instances, essential.
