

## NARRATIVE ON GERMETER, GERMANY CASE


On 8 April 1947 we proceeded to the Hurtgen Forest Distr. # 88 to disinter the remains of an american deceased, found by forester LUDEIG PRAFFE GERMETER # 9.

LUDWIG PFAFFE found the remains on his regular course as a forester of this district.

The remains consisted of dry bones and remaining G.I. equipment. The deceased was recovered in the vicinity of a German Mine-Belt leading through this district. Wild enimals had access to the remains.

One I.D. tag of JOSEF B. WICKHAM A.S.N. 39905055 was found on remains, but there were also two (2) I.D. tags of the same soldier found on remains twenty (20) yards away, those remains were evacuated with evacuation Number IF - 1271.
