

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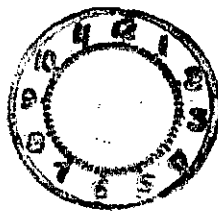

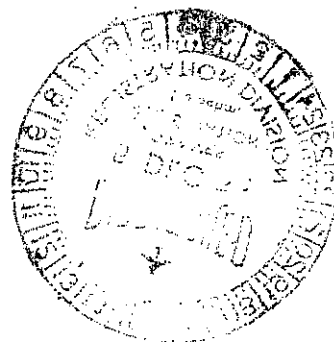

REPROCESSING DIRECTIVE # 3747

NARRATIVE OF REPROCESSING

1. Unknown Remains X-5442 USMC Neuville-en-Condroz, Belgium has been reprocessed for verification of estimated age and tooth chart.

2. This Remains is in skeletal state. The teeth are intact in the skull and the mandible occludes with the maxilla. The skull cannot be definitely articulated with the Remains because the first five (5) cervical vertebrae are missing.

3. The estimated age is based on pubic symphysis, sternal tip of clavicle, sacrum, and closure of skull sutures. The skull suture closures actually indicate an age of approximately forty (40) years of age but this is considered to be excessive considering the moderate amount of wear on the teeth.

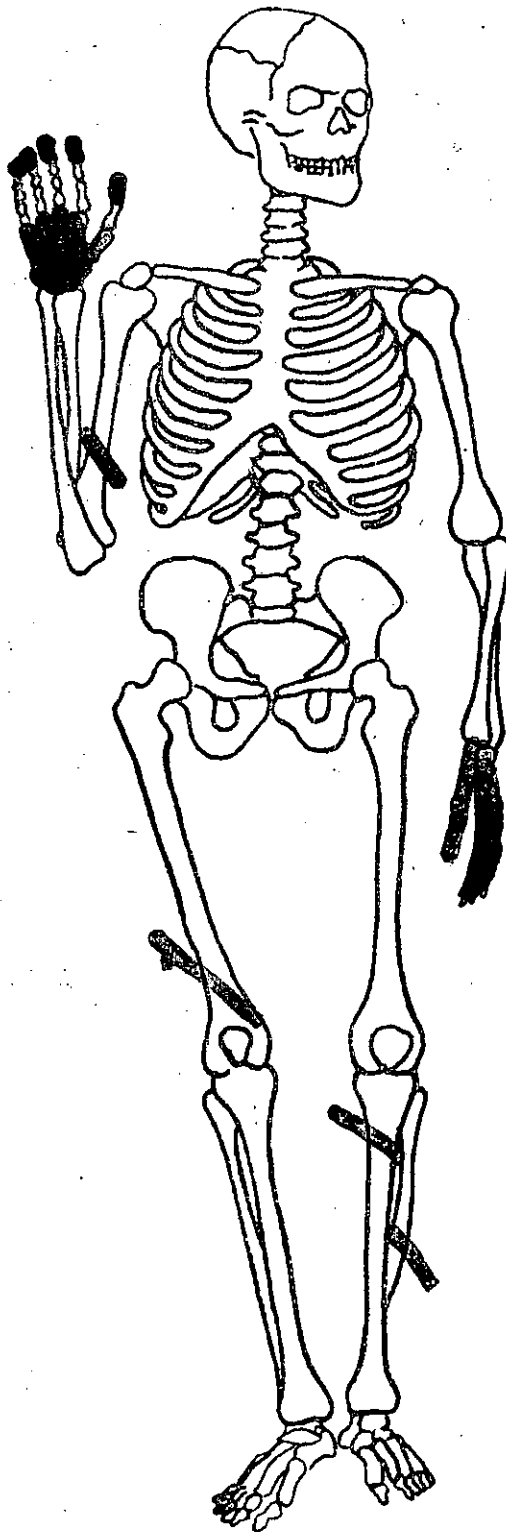

NARRATIVE ON CASE IN HURTGEN FOREST

On 2 April 1947 we proceeded to Hurtgen Forest (District 91B) to investigate and disinter the remains of six (6) American deceased. We received our information from Heinrich Buschmann, who lives at Duren, Germany, Pfennegsweide 13. He is the foreman of a team of woodcutters. He discovered the remains of six (6) Americans while searching for mines in his district of the Hurtgen Forest 91B.

He showed us the remains and we were able to identify them to be Americans by means of their clothing and equipment. The remains consist of dry bones. One of the remains was found in another district. District 92B. It is in the near vicinity of district 91B.

There is no information as to the exact date they were killed as the town of Hurtgen was evacuated of all residents during the fighting. The deceased were presumed to have been killed in December 1944, as the fighting took place at that time. The cause of the death of most of the remains seems to be by shrapnel, mines or small arms weapons.

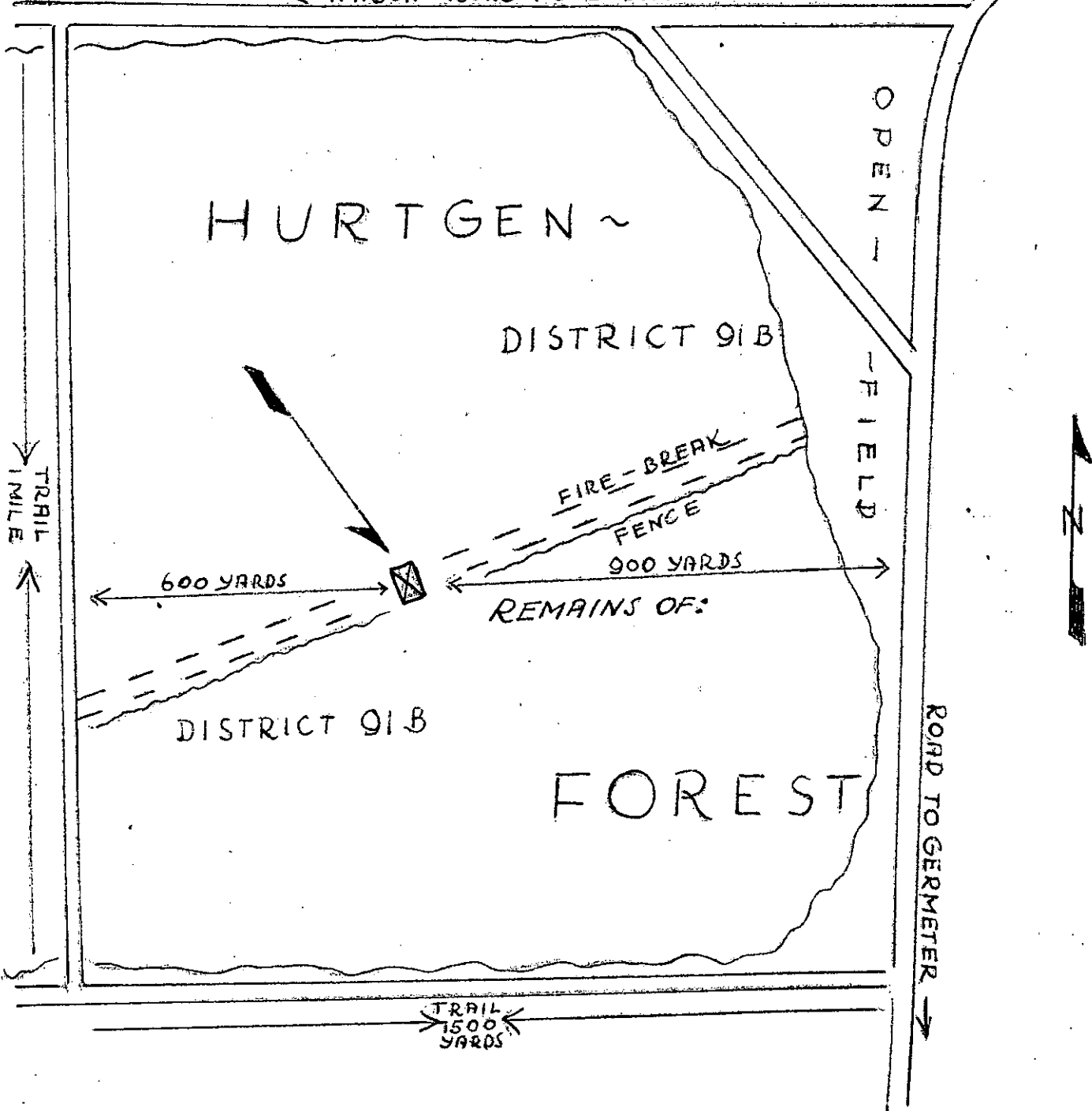

← WAGON-ROAD TO ZWEIFALL

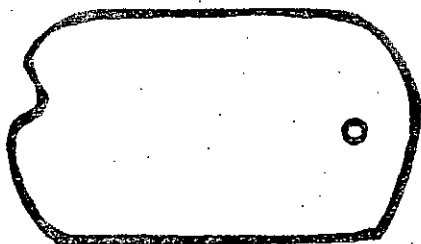
