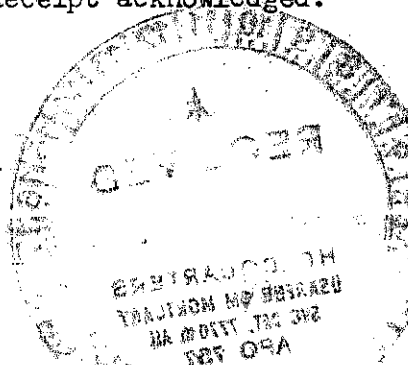

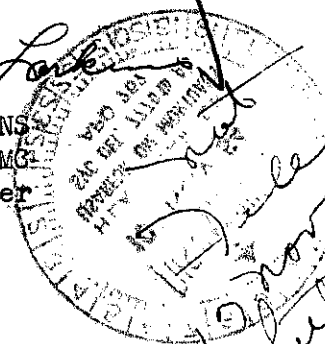

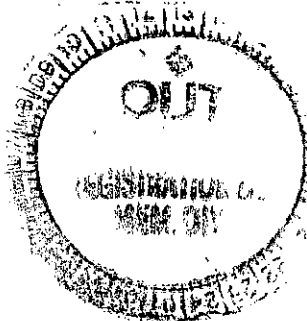

The records pertaining to Unknown X-5520, Plot U, Row 12, Grave 285, USMC Neuville-en-Condroz, Belgium have been reviewed in accordance with par 159, SR-830-110-5; DA dated 3 March 1949, and it is the opinion of the Board of Review appointed by par 1, SO 9, Headquarters, USAREUR QM Mortuary Service Detachment, 7770th Army Unit, dated 19 June 1954, that sufficient evidence is not available to establish the identity of the deceased concerned, and it is recommended these remains be classified as unidentifiable.

2. Report of reprocessing of remains was forwarded to the Office of The Quartermaster General by Transmittal Letter No. 2368 dated 21 July 1947.

CASE HISTORY

Unknown X-5520

Neuville-en-Condroz, Belgium

The remains designated Unknown X-5520 were recovered as IF 7112 from Section 4, Row 3 of the civilian cemetery at Steyregg (O-49/V-98) Austria on 13 March 1947. Remains were disinterred along with three (3) other remains from a mass or common grave numbered 360/361. This grave(s) was marked by a single wooden cross bearing the inscription "Here rest Robert L. Clark, Richard C. Jones, Edgar P. Leonhard, John A. Johnston - 25-7-1944". The narrative of disinterment shows remains were buried in four (4) caskets; two (2) caskets were found side by side in two (2) normal grave spaces with the other two (2) casketed remains directly beneath at a lower level. The remains, X-5520 were removed according to narrative and cemetery sketch from the left bottom position.

The present status of the four (4) decedents as indicated by records on file is as follows:

* Statements by cemetery caretaker and local police is at variance with the above in respect to the arrangement of the decedents by name in the collective grave. However, regardless of what the arrangement may have been, the salient fact is that the remains of four (4) American casualties, by name were recorded as buried in grave(s) 360/361.

The four (4) named decedents were crew members of B-17 A/C # 44-6183 which crashed in the woods between Pulgarn and Steyregg on 25 July 1944. Of the total crew of ten (10), four (4) survived and returned to military control; two (2) were reported according to German records as cremated at the Mauthausen Concentration Camp; and the remaining four (4) casualties as buried in Steyregg cemetery. As indicated above the identifiable

remains of three (3) crew members were recovered from grave 361/361 leaving only one decedent namely: T/Sgt John A. Johnston in an unresolved status.

Processing of the remains (X-5520) records the estimated height as 4' 11 3/4"; the age between 28 and 30 years; the teeth apart from numerous extraction contained only one filling as a distinctive clue for dental comparison; hair is light brown and approximately 4" long. No clothing or equipment was present with the processed remains.

The tooth chart and other identifying characteristics of X-5520 has been compared with like media for all casualties of A/C # 44-6183 with negative results.

Due to the close proximity of grave location where subject remains were recovered to grave 359 where a French POW was recorded as buried, the possibility that the French authorities had erroneously removed the wrong remains was examined.

The French decedent, Albert Mitteau was killed during an air-raid on 19 November 1944 and was exhumed from grave 359 for permanent interment in decedent's homeland 24 September 1948. These dates are subsequent to the burial and disinterment of American decedents. On this basis it would seem illogical to surmise that Graves Registration in their evacuation in March 1947 had in error opened the adjacent individual grave containing the French decedent where as our casualties were grouped together in a block of four (4). Communication with the French authorities disclosed that the induction records for Albert Mitteau recorded the casualty's height as 1 meter 71 (5' 7 1/2"). This factor precludes an association between the French national and subject remains.

Therefore in view of the above findings it is recommended that X-5520 be declared Unidentifiable.

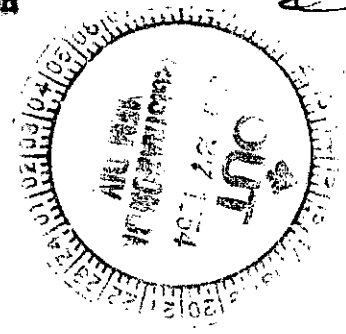

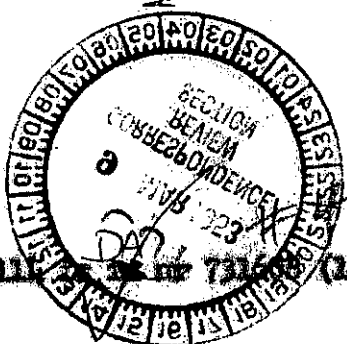

1. Reference is made to Report of Burial and related papers for Unknown X-8416 USMC Neuville forwarded under Transmittal Letter # 5161 dated 10 October 1950 and to Reprocessing Report for Unknown X-5520 USMC Neuville dated 14 December 1950, forwarded under letter dated 9 March 1951.
2. It is believed that the remains identified as a French national, MITTEAU, Albert Pierre, may be those of T/Sgt John A. JOHNSTON ASN 32 505 417, and the remains designated Unknown X-5520 may be those of Mitteau.
3. French authorities were so informed by letter dated 18 July 1951, and tooth chart and physical characteristics of X-5520 were forwarded by letter dated 13 August 1951. No reply has been received to a follow-up letter sent to the French on 4 October 1951.
4. Unknown X-8416 was recovered from the same mass grave as X-5520 and identified crew members of T/Sgt Johnston's plane. Remains consisted mostly of old bones, however one bone was placed with the remains of 2/Lt Clark, and the remains now consist of only left ulna and hand bones. It is believed that a possibility exists that X-8416 may consolidate with the remains now held by the French as Mitteau.
5. In view of the above circumstances, and the delay already experienced and further envisaged in obtaining a decisive answer from the French, it is requested that consideration be given to redesignation of Unknown X-8416 as a CIL remains, which of course would still be available for attempt at consolidation at a later date.

Narrative of Investigation.

On 13 March 1947 I investigated a case in Steyregg, Russian Zone, Upper Austria (V-98/049. I arrived at the scene of the crash, about 2 miles from Steyregg, and found the remnants of what appeared to be an American B 17 bomber. On a connecting rod of a part of the fuselage there was an embossed metal tag about 2x1½ inches reading 2120424 4 June 44 Bottom 14 831 Vologe 24.

On part of one wing, impossible to determine which, was a marking as indicated below :



The police in Steyregg reported that the police of the town in 1944-1 were no longer there, but that witnesses reported two Fortresses crashing in the vicinity during this period, one of which was in July 44. This plane contained the bodies concerned in this case (Incl.# 1 and 2).

The priest of the parish reported, from the official death register that this plane was shot down 25 July 44 and the bodies buried 18 August 44. (Incl.# 3). The manager of the cemetery stated that he received orders to recover the remains on the scene of the crash and bury them and that he did so on 25 July 44. (Incl.# 4 & 4a.) This contradicts the priest's statement but it is believed, that the cemetery manager confused the date of burial with the date of death. He stated that two of the bodies were found at different times. All persons questioned remarked that the remains were indentified by dog tags which were removed by German Army authorities. Upon arriving at the cemetery I found that the four bodies were buried in two plots # 360/361, with one marker listing all four bodies.

NARRATIVE OF DISINTERMENT.

Disinterment was made at the civilian cemetery of Steyregg, Russian zone of Upper Austria on 13 March 1947 at 1100 hours. In Section 4 Row 3, in one grave with two grave numbers four bodies had been buried:

Two caskets on the bottom, two at the top; as there was only one grave there was also only one gravemarker. A wooden cross had the following inscription:

"Here rest Robert L. Clark, Richard O. Jones, Edgar P. Leonhard, John A. Johnston 25.7.1944."

This body was the left bottom body of the four bodies and the only case where we found the complete casket. The remains were raised from a depth of seven feet. The body was naked, partly burned, without identity tags or personal effects. The body was evacuated to the American zone in a new casket.

Name BTB Robert L. Clark is assigned to the remains only according to the statement of the manager of the cemetery.

He was found eight days after the crash about 70 to 80 m from the remnants of the plane. Clark, Robert and Jones, Richard were buried in grave # 360 in the town cemetery Steyregg, Leonhard, and John in grave # 361 on 25.7.44

On July 25, 1944 I received order from the community office Steyregg to evacuate and bury above named flyers.

They have been found completely carbonified in the woods between Fulgarn and Steyregg.

Two men lay about 100 m from the crashed plane and two men were found after the plane has been taken apart,

The corpses were evacuated to the morgue Steyregg by means of a truck.

After the religious ceremonies, which have been celebrated by a catholic priest, the burials were made on 25 July 1944.

I cannot give further details as all the papers have been taken over by the police of this town.

All the corpses were burnt beyond recognition.

My statements are according to the facts.

Above named American flyers were disinterred and evacuated by American soldiers, on this date, 13 March 1947.

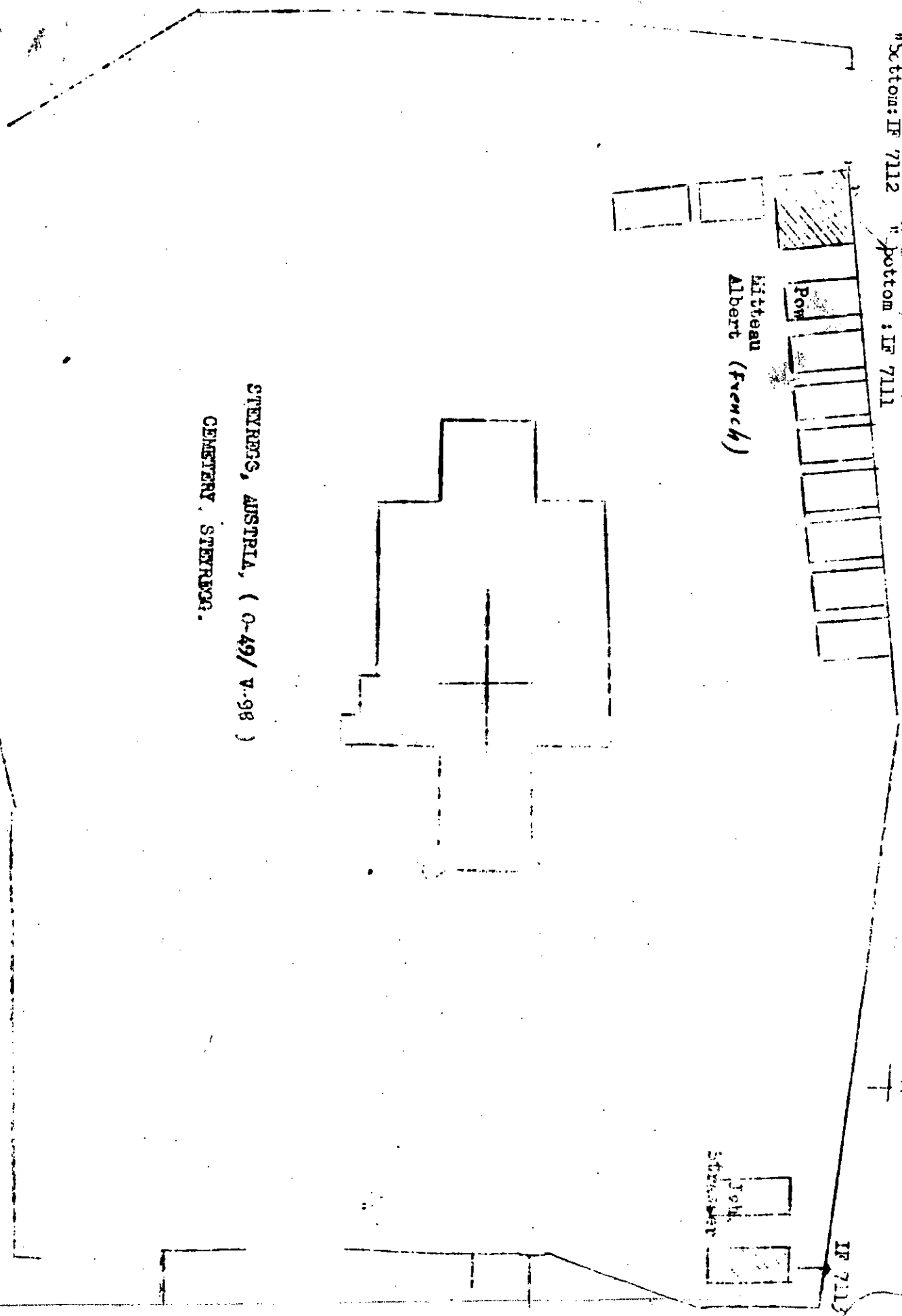

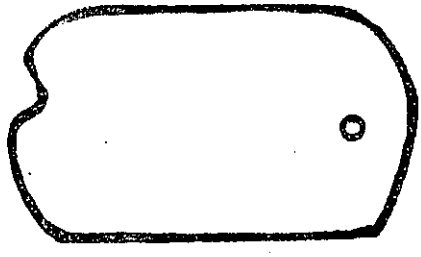

REMARKS

On 25 July 1944 an American Bomber crashed in vicinity of Steyregg. Four bodies were recovered from scene of crash and identification established by civilians by identification tags. Tags were removed by German authorities.

The four bodies were buried in the town cemetery in 4 different caskets but in one single grave marked with a wooden cross inscribed:

"Here rest Robert L. Clark, Richard G. Jones, Edward F. Leonard, John A. Johnston 25.7.1944".

Disinterment team assigned name of Clark, Robert J., 10113198, to these remains only according to cemetery manager's statement.

It is possible that this deceased is Clark, however as processing revealed no positive identifying clues, this case is classified "Unknown".
