

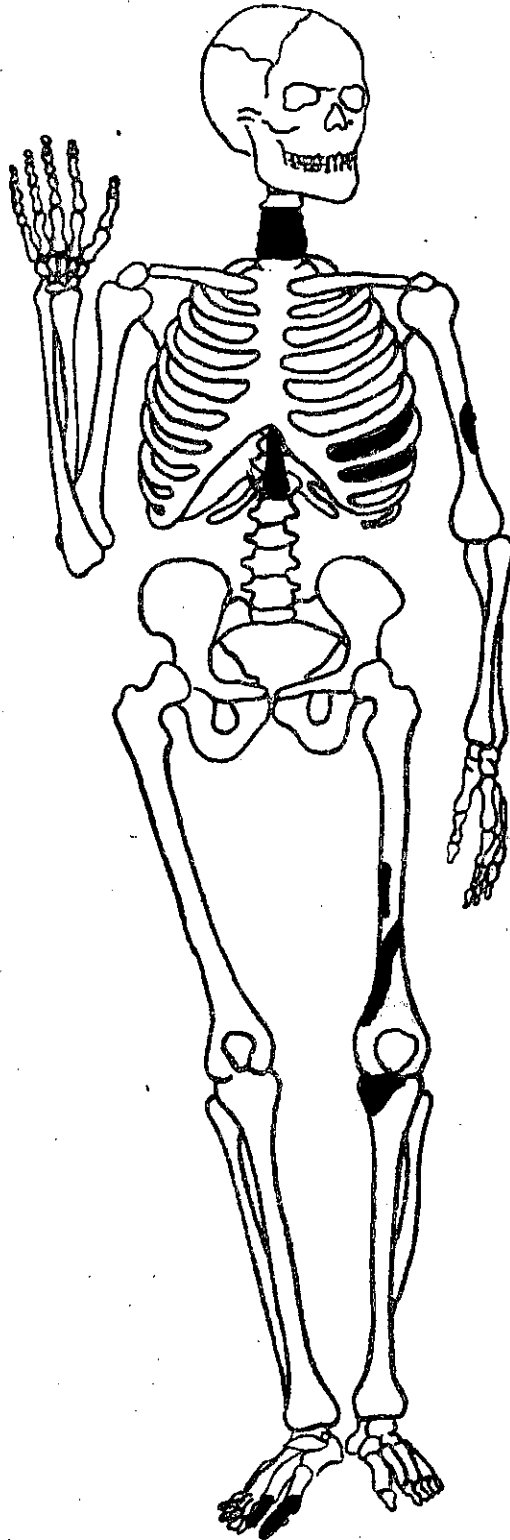



N A R R A T I V E

During a thorough search in the vicinity of Herrlisheim (Bas Rhin department) for the possible presence of American remains in disabled American tanks, a few burnt bones were found in the driver's place of tank USA # 30181591, 12 Δ 23 Δ A 15.

From all appearances this tank, probably of the Sherman type, exploded and burned after it was hit by enemy fire. This accounts for the few remains that were left of the casualty in the driver's seat.

No identification of any kind could be found owing to the intensive heat which must have charred all personal effects.

Fighting in this area from December 1944 till the end of January 1945 puts the death of subject deceased in this period.

I, the undersigned, RISTTER Auguste, proprietor of the field in which the American Tank # 30181591 is located, declare that I do not know anything on the subject of the bones inside of the tank. The whole population of the village was evacuated and they only know that the combat took place between December 1944 and January 1945.






