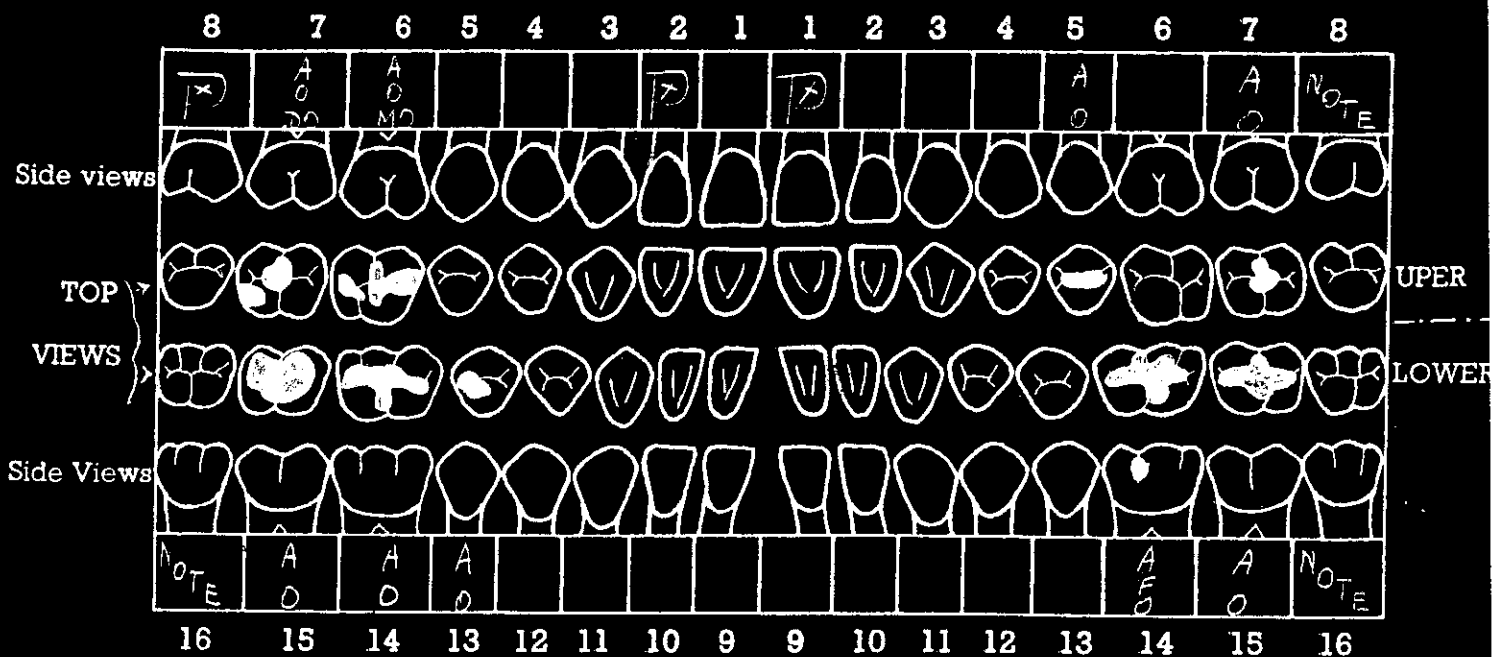

NARRATIVE

The remains of an unknown soldier presumed to be American because of his US Army clothing and equipment were discovered on 7 May 1947 in section 56 of the Wildengurth forest by Mr. Lucien Vanthuyne, technical demining supervisor at Lichtenberg, Bas-Rhin, France.


After this organization was notified a thorough investigation was conducted which however failed to disclose any valuable information as to decedent's identity. No information as to circumstances and date of death were available either as no persons having knowledge of this case could be contacted. Remains were found lying unburied on top of ground.

I, the undersigned, VANTHUYNE Lucien, technical demining supervisor of LICHTENBERG, declare that in Section 56 of the Wildenguth forest I found the remains of what I presumed to be an American soldier, judging from his clothing. I did not find any personnel effects on him and I cannot give any other information. These remains were found on the 7th of May 1947.

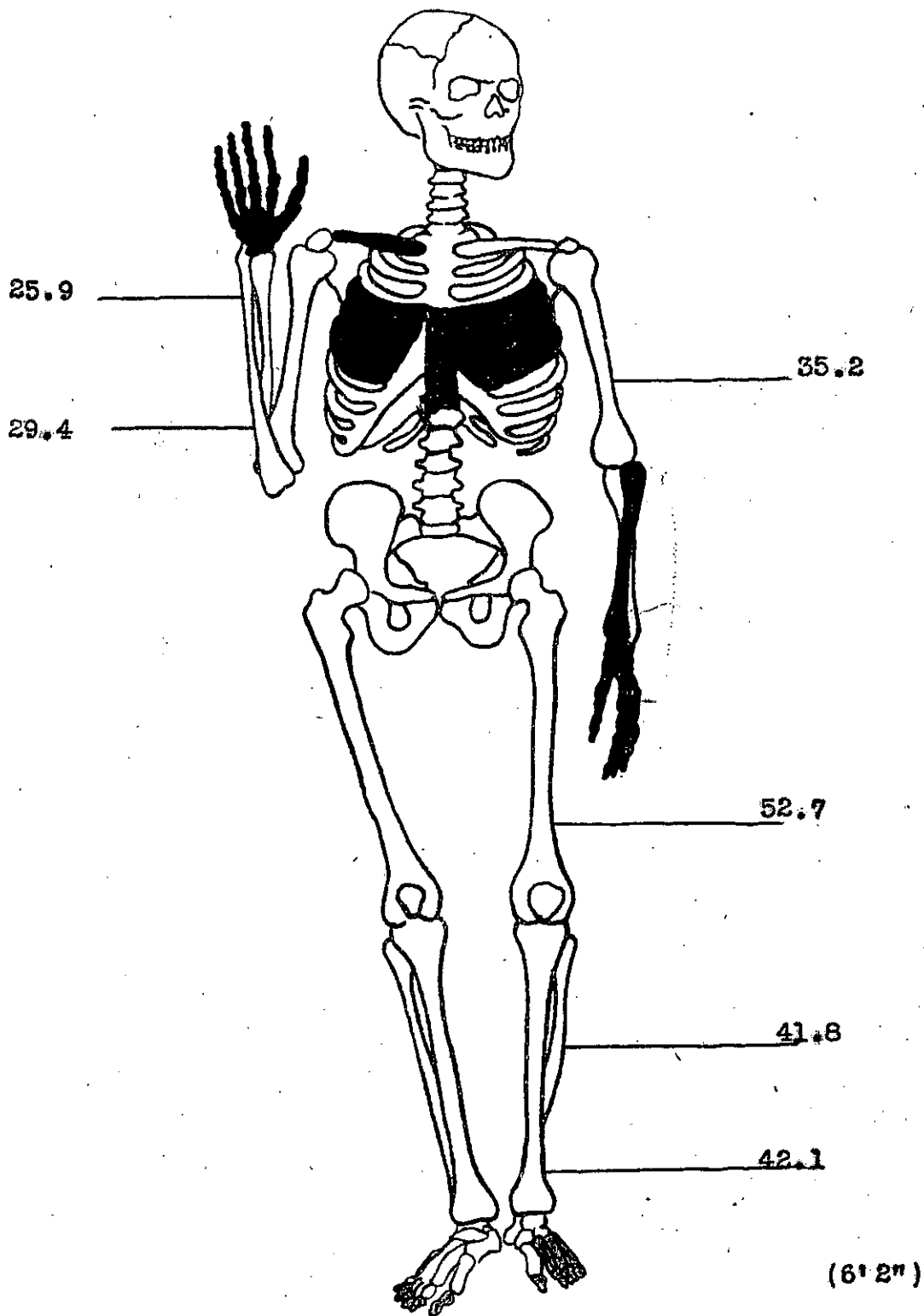




