NARRATIVE
ON GURZENICH, GERMANY CASE

On 16 June 1947 this investigation team proceeded to Gurzenich to disinter the remains of an American soldier. We were informed of the location of the grave by Capt. BUTTEN, S.R.O. in Duren, Germany.

The remains were buried in the Military Cemetery of Gurzenich on 10 June 1947. They were found on 27 March 1947 by Burgermeister Stephan Vogt of Gurzenich in the cellar of a house which was destroyed in November 1944 when fighting took place in this town. (see Exhibit "A").

The remains consisted of dry bones and G.I. equipment. Two (2) Identification tags were found bearing: Archie Funderburke, 34399325.

Burgermeister Vogt wrapped the body in a blanket and brought the Identification tags to the Military Government in Duren.

The deceased is not listed in the Alphabetical Listing of Unresolved Casualties.

While clearing away debris in the house Aachenerlandstrasse # 211 in Gurzenich, the remains of a deceased American soldier were found. The identification tags immediately were forwarded to the Military Government. By order of our burgermeister-office at Duren-Rolsdorf the deceased was buried on the 10th June 1947 at the cemetery Gurzenich, district Duren, with full christian rights. I being present. Today the remains of the deceased have been disinterred by order of 164 QM. Bn. APO 403, and taken away.

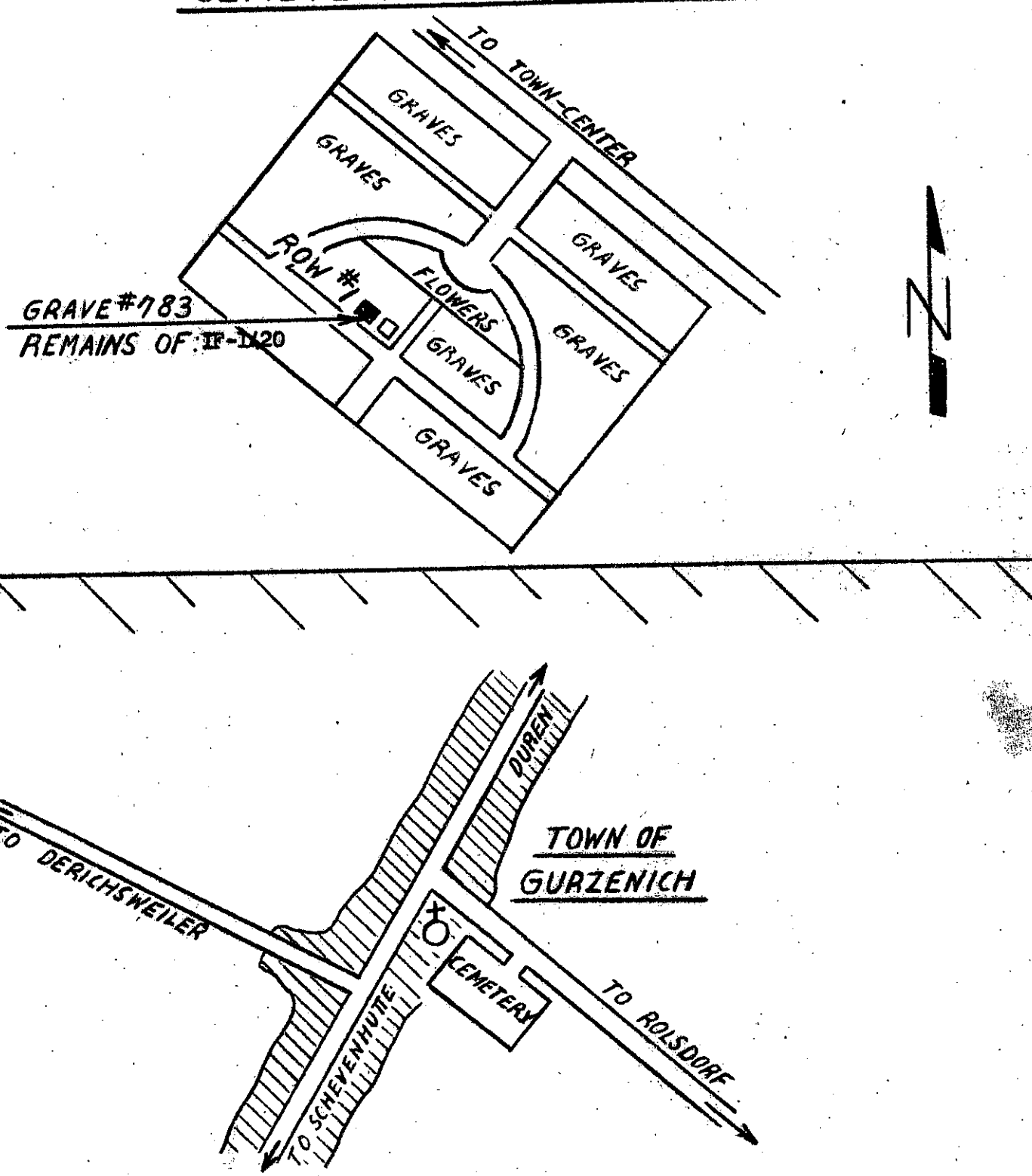

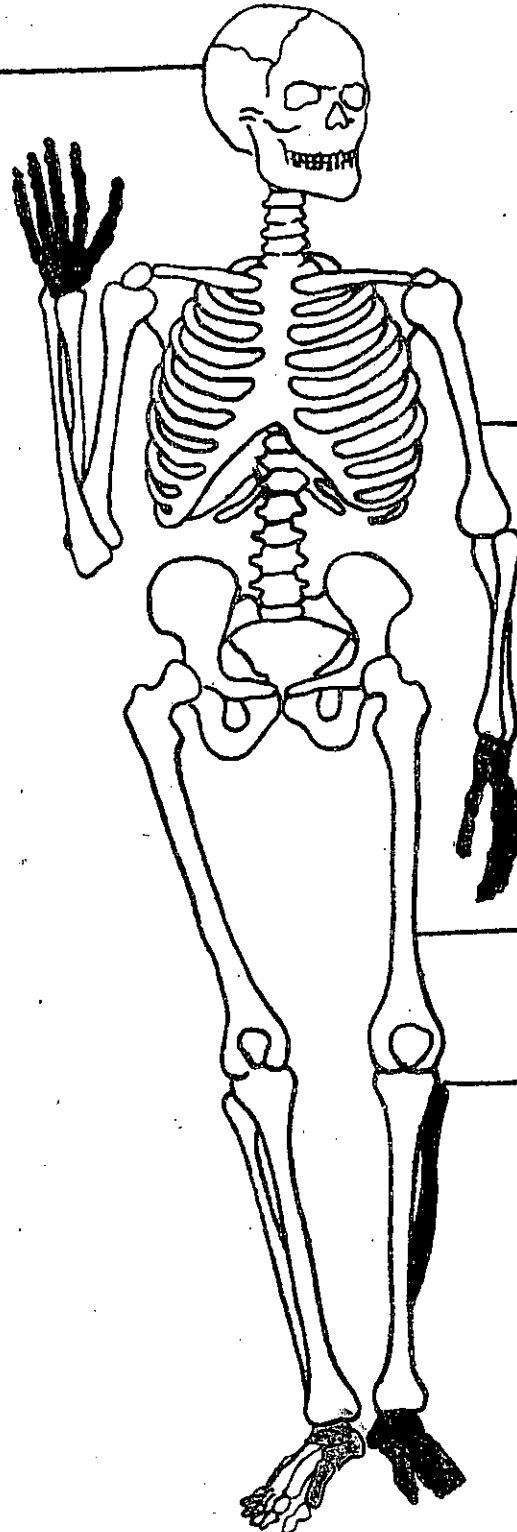

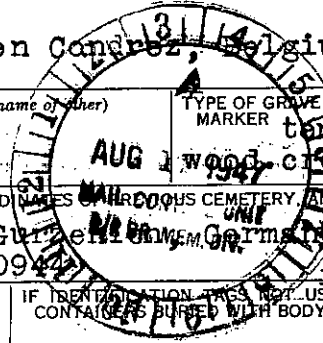
