BURGERMEISTERS STATEMENT

Wintermoor, Germany
10 April 1946.

I certify to the best of my knowledge the following Statement is correct:

On the 9 April 1944, as my wife and I were returning home from church the air raid warning sounded and as I looked up I saw a large formation of planes flying westward.

In just a few moments I saw German fighter planes attack this formation of planes and one of the planes started falling. At about this time I saw several men jump from the plane.


The plane crashed in a field near my home and there was three dead Americans found near the wreckage. The plane burned very badly after it hit the ground.

Six (6) of the seven (7) parachutists were captured and turned over to the German Military. So far as I know the other airman was never captured.

The three (3) dead flyers were buried in the civilian cemetery by German Military personnel. A cross was erected with the following epitaph: Unbekannter Amerikanischer Flieger.

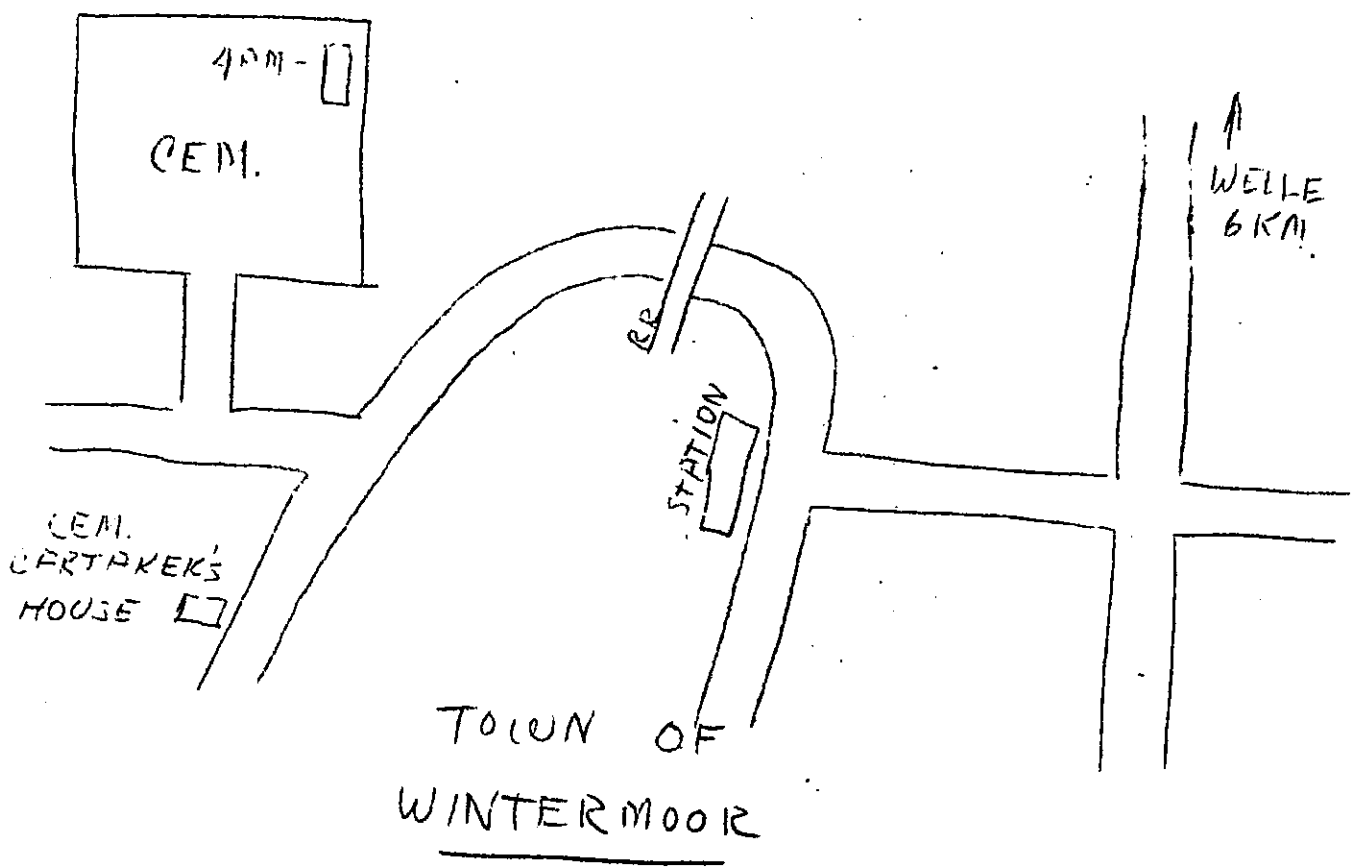
The other American airman buried in this cemetery died on the March 5, 1944. His plane was shot down and as soon as it crashed the German Authorities took charge of it at once and gave no information to any one about it.

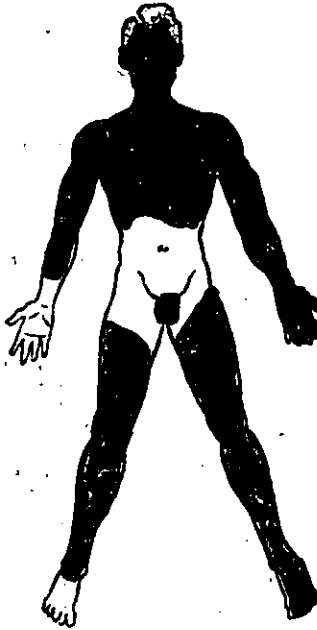





CERTIFICATE OF UNIDENTIFIABILITY

Remains of Unknown X-604 Neuville, were received from the cemetery at Wintermoor, Germany. Cemetery records place the date of death as 3 March, 1944. Cemetery records further state that four (4) Americans were interred in Wintermoor. One fighter pilot on the 5th of March and three (3) casualty crew members of a downed a/c on 9 April, 1944. Dulong records J-625 and Microfilm 120240-1 support this claim.

P-57 B

Possible association of Unknown X-604 was made with Glenn A. Herter, 1/Lt., O-2044891, fighter pilot known to have crashed in his P-57 in the vicinity of Wintermoor on 3 March, 1944. Because of lack of identifying data and the fact that ROB shows a date of death of 9 April, 1944, whereas Lt. Herter's a/c was downed on 3 March, 1944 dispells the ~~(error)~~ possibility of identification as subject casualty.

The three (3) unknown casualties from the 9th April crash have since been identified and repatriated to the US.

Remains of Unknown X-604, last remaining unresolved casualty in Wintermoor cemetery, contained little or no clues towards the identity and consisted of six or seven bone fragments and light brown pubic hair.

Due to lack of identifying clues, this investigator beleives that the remains of Unknown X-604 are UNIDENTIFIABLE.

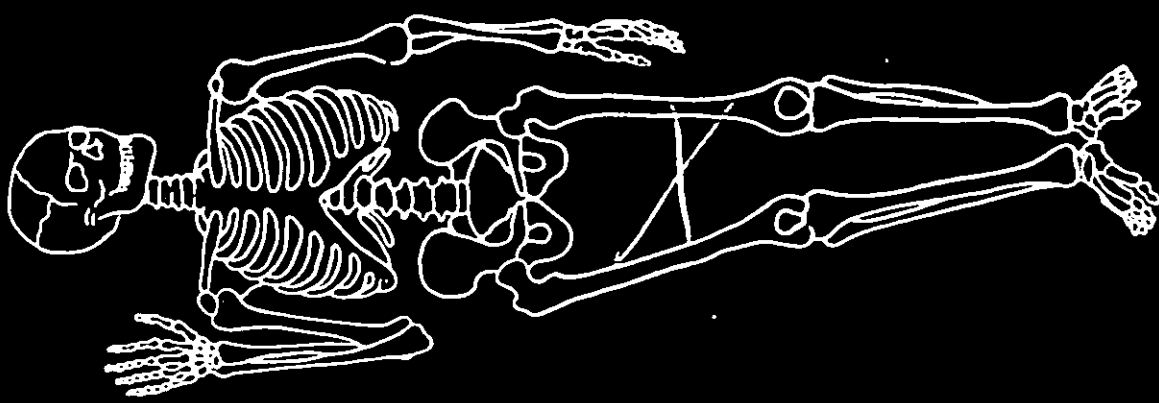

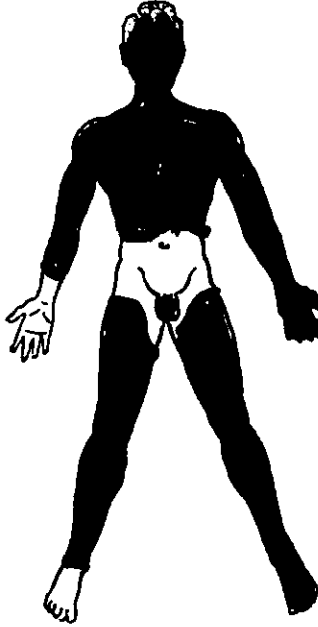

BURGERMEISTERS STATEMENT

Wintermoor, Germany
10 April 1946.

I certify to the best of my knowledge the following Statement is correct:

On the 9 April 1944, as my wife and I were returning home from church the air raid warning sounded and as I looked up I saw a large formation of planes flying westward.

In just a few moments I saw German fighter planes attack this formation of planes and one of the planes started falling. At about this time I saw several men jump from the plane.


The plane crashed in a field near my home and there was three dead Americans found near the wreckage. The plane burned very badly after it hit the ground.

Six (6) of the seven (7) parachutists were captured and turned over to the German Military. So far as I know the other airman was never captured.

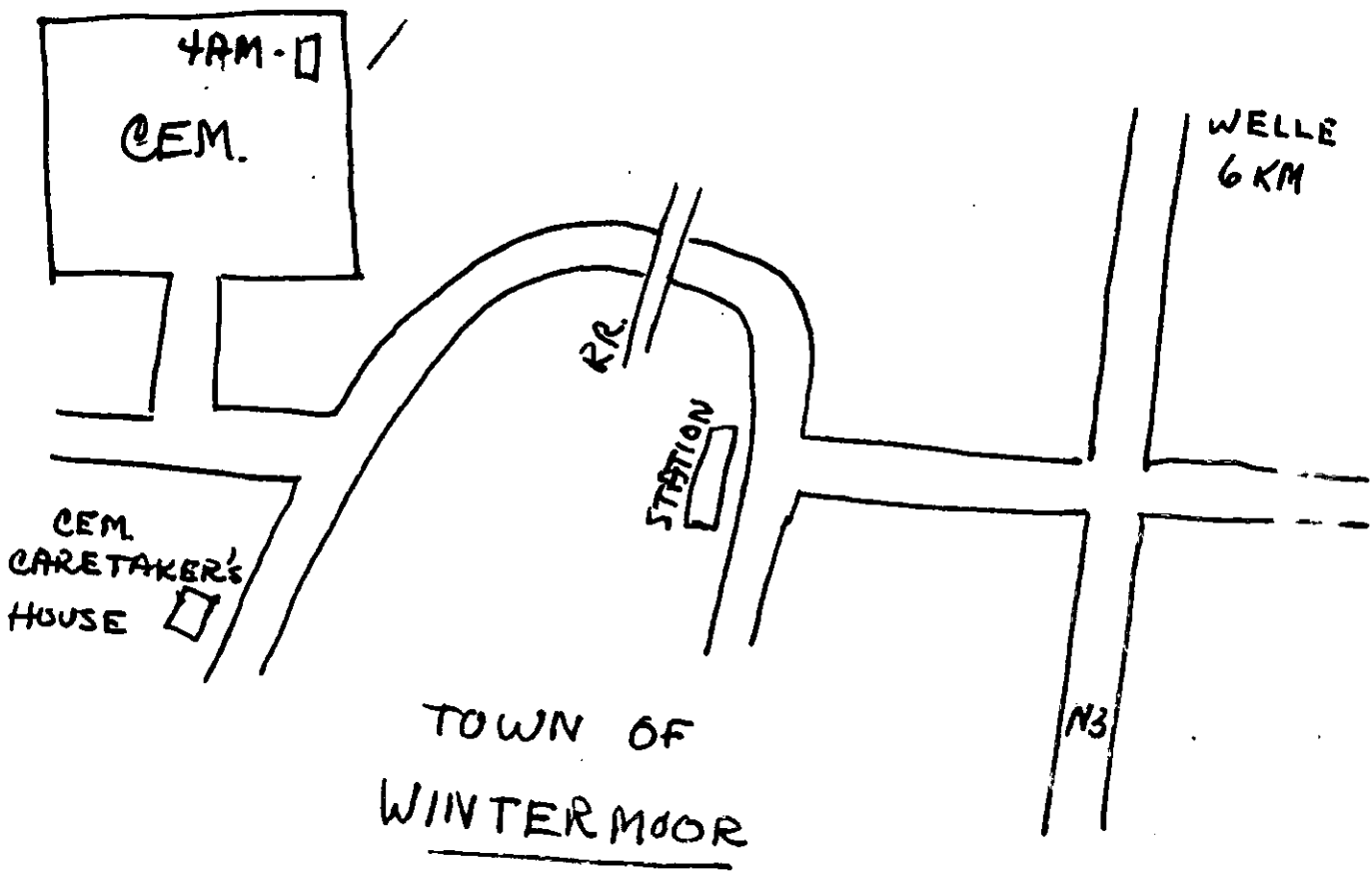
The three (3) dead flyers were buried in the civilian cemetery by German Military personnel. A cross was erected with the following epitaph: Unbekannter Amerikanischer Flieger.

The other American airman buried in this cemetery died on the March 5, 1944. His plane was shot down and as soon as it crashed the German Authorities took charge of it at once and gave no information to any one about it.

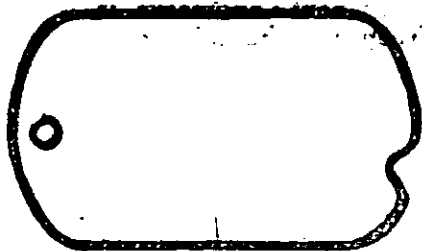
