CASE HISTORY

UNKNOWN NO. X-6373

US MILITARY CEMETERY Neuville en Condroz

The remains of X-6373 Neuville were previously identified by this headquarters as Pfc. Clinton E. SMITH Jr., 18232956. This identification was based on Check List for X-6373 dated 11 September 1947. At this processing laundry marking "2956" was found on first aid pouch with remains which is in agreement with last four digits of ASN of Pfc. Smith. Estimated height and color of hair of X-6373 was in agreement with height and color of hair of Pfc. Smith. No teeth were found at this processing. The remains of X-6373 Neuville were submitted to Field Board of Review as the remains of Pfc. Clinton E. Smith Jr., 18232956 and findings were forwarded to O.M.G.

Radio WCL 29466 was received from O.M.G. requesting skull of X-6373 be re-examined for evidence of shrapnel wound. Exhumation Order was requested and reprocessing of 3 January 1950 revealed portion of maxilla intact in skull. All teeth from this portion have been extracted. Army dental records for Pfc. Smith dated 17 March 1943 indicate R-8, L-8, R-16 and L-16 as extracted. O.M.G. forwarded a photostatic copy of letter from Next of Kin which indicates that there is no dental chart or work of identification to assist in identifying these remains as Pfc. Smith.

The following is extracted from O.M.G. letter dated 10 March 1950:

"The identification which is apparently based on laundry marking "2956" found on first aid pouch, and estimated height and color of hair cannot be accepted by this Office for the following reasons:

a. Processing report dated 11 September 1947 indicates no teeth recovered. Reprocessing report of 3 January 1950 reveals portion of maxilla intact in skull. All teeth from this portion have been extracted. Army dental records for Pfc. Smith indicate R-8, L-8, R-16 and L-16 as extracted.

b. Unresolved Casualties - To date the number of unresolved casualties for the 157th, 179th, 180th and 276th Infantry Regiment in this area is unknown."
