

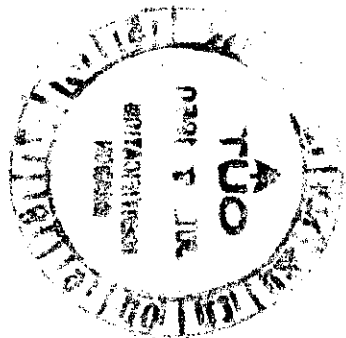

CASE HISTORY

Unknown X-80

United States Military Cemetery Neuville (Belgium)

1. On 30 April 1945, the remains of an unknown American air-man were washed ashore near Audresselles, Pas de Calais, France. These remains were evacuated to USMC Neuville and designated as indicated above.

2. The tooth chart contained in the case on Unknown X-80 was checked against FBIIF's and OQMG Forms 371 on unresolved casualties, reported missing within the English Channel, North Sea and French coastal areas, with negative results. The initials "BAK", inscribed on a mechanical pencil found on the remains, could not be associated with any casualties listed in AG casualty listings. Since the check list on the subject deceased indicates an estimated height of 5' 11½" and that pilot wings, Lieutenant bars and a size 10 A shoe were among the remains, the aforementioned OQMG Forms 371 were thoroughly checked against this identifying data; however, this action failed to reveal a comparison that could possibly lead to the identification of the deceased.

3. In view of the foregoing, it is recommended that this case be declared Unidentifiable.

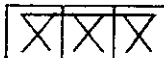

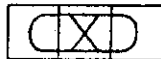
