No date or place of death is recorded on Report of Burial for X-82.

One other body was interred in USMC Neuville on 3 May 1945. These

remains were identified as Pvt. Nathaniel Ruse 33811186 - Die 2 May

1945 (reburied Neuville E-9-218 POC). Report of Burial for Pvt. Ruse

indicates place of death as 15th General Hosp. (Liege, Belgium). There-

fore, it is believed that the place of death for X-82 is in the vicinity

of Liege.

Tooth chart of X-82 was compared with available dental records for

the remaining unresolved casualties in Belgium with negative results.

Laundry Mark "S-9865" found on OD shirt was checked in casualty

listings and proved to be negative.

Efforts to associate the subject remains with an unresolved casualty

by all means have proven negative and case is being classified as

UNIDENTIFIABLE at the present time.

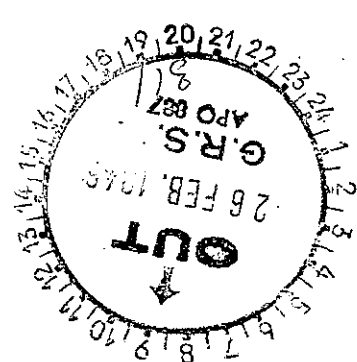

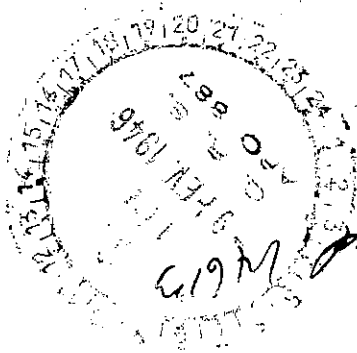

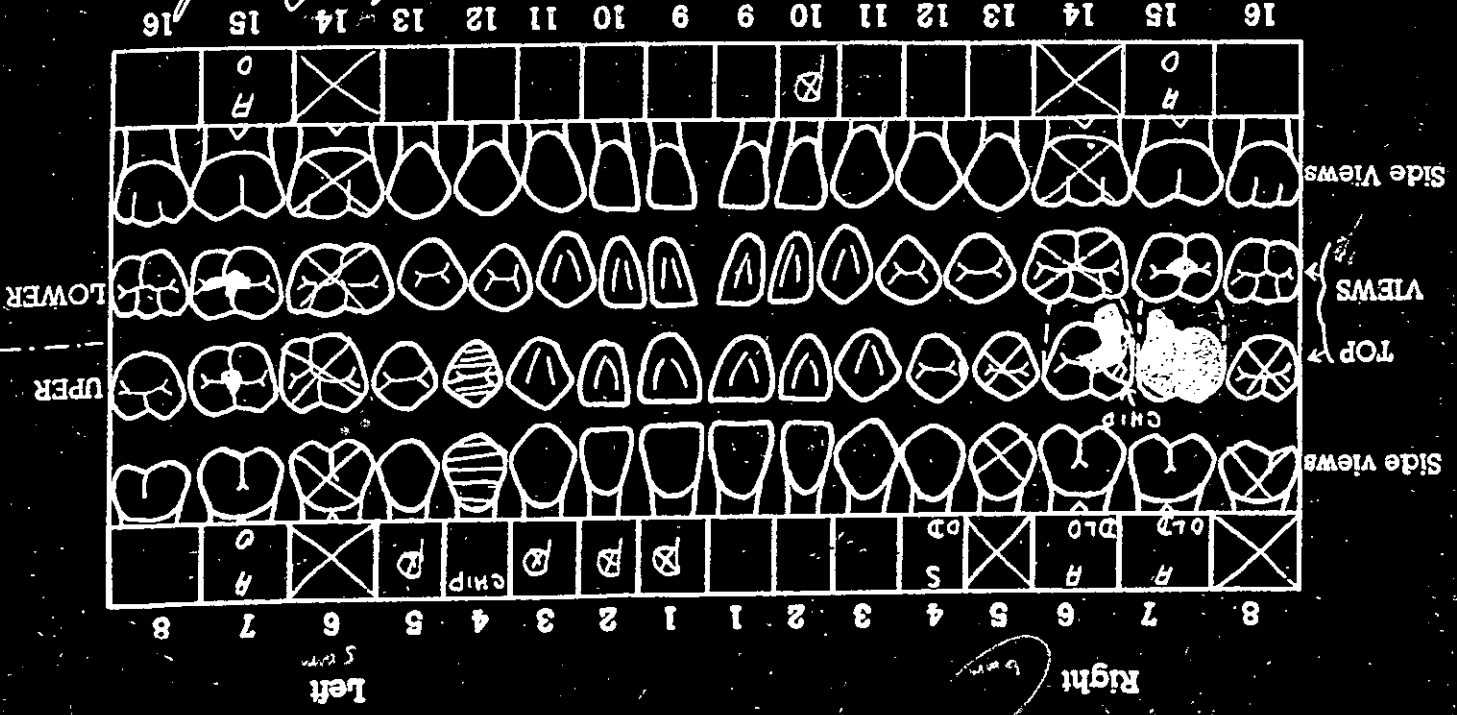

This dental chart is very important and should be filled in with great care. There are 32 teeth to be accounted for, as shown by the numbers on the chart. Beginning at the middle line in both upper and lower jaws, the teeth are arranged symmetrically on either side and classed as incisors (cutting teeth), cuspids or canines (tearing teeth), bicuspids (chewing teeth), and molars (principal chewing teeth). An examination should be made and findings charted to cover the following basic conditions: Lost teeth, crowned teeth, bridge work, fillings, caries (cavities of decay), dentures (plates), and any deformity of jaws found. See reverse side for illustrations.
