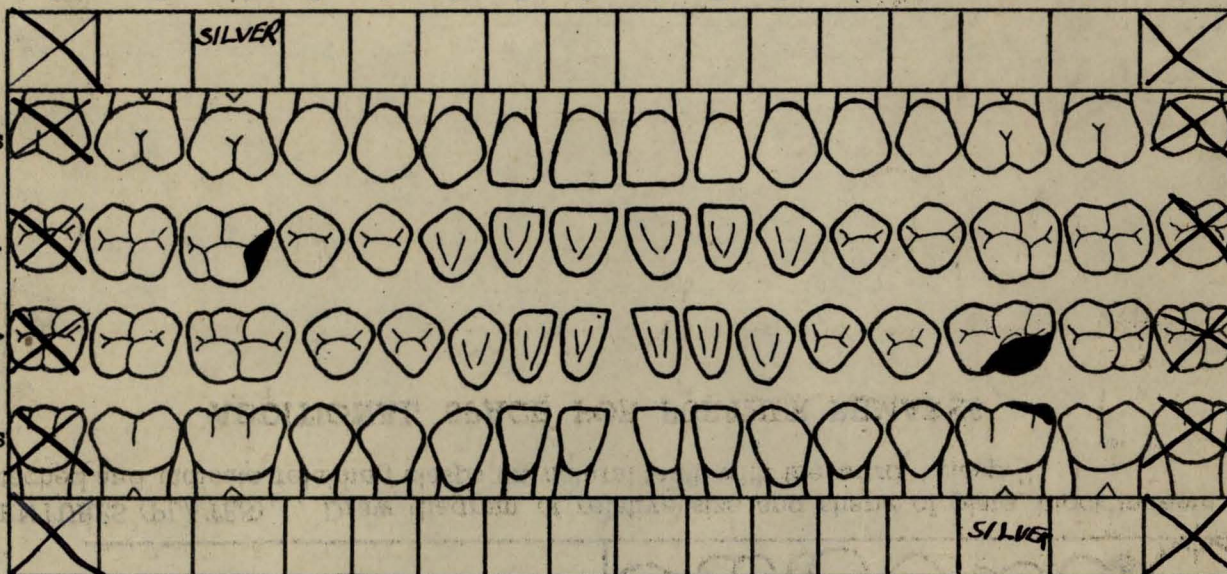

This dental chart is very important and should be filled in with great care. There are 32 teeth to be accounted for, as shown by the numbers on the chart. Beginning at the middle line in both upper and lower jaws, the teeth are arranged symmetrically on either side and classed as incisors (cutting teeth), cuspids or canines (tearing teeth), bicuspid (chewing teeth), and molars (principal chewing teeth). An examination should be made and findings charted to cover the following basic conditions: Lost teeth, crowned teeth, bridge work, fillings, caries (cavities of decay), dentures (plates), and any deformity of jaws found. See reverse side for illustrations.

2. We took fingerprints and gave a physical description of the body on the back of the GRS Form No. 1. The other bodies in the trailer came from Bayon, France. This is the only information we have.



1. The remains of an unidentified soldier were buried in Plot G, Row 10, Grave 250, U. S. Military Cemetery No. 1, Andilly, France on 25 September 1944 as Unknown X-23. According to the attached report of burial, death occurred at Bayon, France on approximately 22 September 1944. Tec 5 Elwood D. Hartwick, 39415470, 314th Infantry, who is buried on the right of Unknown X-23, was killed in the same place at approximately the same time. Unknown X-23 may have been assigned to the 313th Infantry or the 314th Infantry.

2. A check of the Battle Casualty Reports of these two organizations showed that Pfc. James A. McCormick, 34124630, 313th Infantry, was reported MIA on 21 September 1944 on the report dated 26 September 1944. It is requested that an investigation be made to discover if Unknown X-23 may be identified as Pfc. McCormick. A physical description of the remains is on the reverse side of the report of burial. A similar description of Pfc. McCormick may be obtained from the Service Record, company records, or persons who were well-acquainted with the missing man. Can a statement be obtained to show the name of the area where Pfc. McCormick was last seen, and if he was on duty with any of the men who were reported casualties on 23 September 1944?

3. If Unknown X-23 cannot be identified as Pfc. McCormick, it is requested that a check be made to determine if the deceased may be identified as any other man in the 313th or the 314th Infantry who was reported KIA or MIA in the vicinity of Bayon just prior to 25 September 1944.

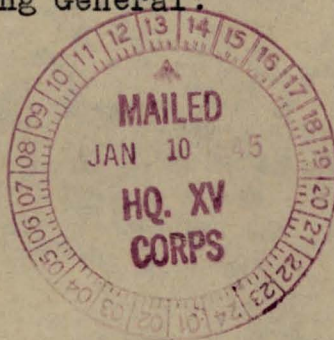

1. Attention is directed to the attached inclosures.

2. The remains buried as Unknown X-23 (Andilly) cannot be identified by fingerprints; consequently more data must be obtained.

3. It is desired that all personnel of your organization who were operating the collecting point at Charmes be interrogated to obtain, if possible, the name of the organizations which could have brought the body to the collecting point at Charmes. The inquiry should be made to include medical installations which may have been operating in that area. Any information which may give a clue as to the organization from which this Unknown was evacuated or whether he might have come from a hospital, or the names of other deceased who were evacuated from Bayon with Unknown X-23, should be forwarded.

1. In compliance with basic communication, all individuals of this organization, who were operating XV Corps Collecting Point at Charmes, France on or about 25 Sept 1944, were questioned concerning Unknown X23, (Andilly) and the following information is submitted:

a. 1st Lt. Ira Garnets, who was in charge of collecting point at that time, stated that the only unit who evacuated bodies to his collecting point was the 79th Inf. Division.

b. Lt. Garnets knows positively that the only unit, who exchanged loaded trailers for empty ones, was the 79th Inf. Division.

c. There was one Evacuation Hospital known to have been operating on Highway D-55, about one (1) mile southwest of Charmes, France. Unit designation of hospital not known.

d. Lt. Garnets does not believe that Unknown X-23 was delivered to his collecting point by a Medical installation but does not know positively.

e. The only other Unit with XV Corps at that time was the 2nd French Armored Division. This unit did not evacuate bodies to collecting Point at Charmes.

f. Names of other deceased who were evacuated from Bayon with Unknown X-23 are not known.

g. Driver, Organization and circumstances surrounding exchange of trailers at Collecting Point at Charmes is not known.

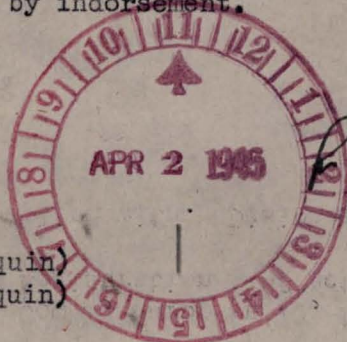

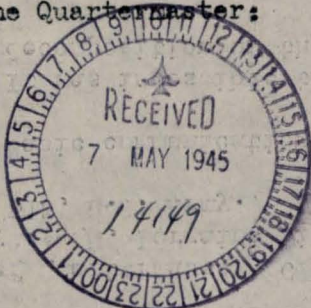



1. An unidentified soldier was buried 25 September 1944 in U.S. Military Cemetery #1, Andilly, France as Unknown X-23. Death was estimated to have occurred approximately 22 September 1944. A recent disinterment and examination of the remains disclosed that an abdominal autopsy had been performed.

2. Fingerprints of the deceased soldier were submitted to the War Department, but identity could not be established. The War Department has directed this headquarters to obtain additional information which may aid in indicating the deceased soldier's identity.

3. It is requested that this headquarters be furnished a list in duplicate of the names of all American and Allied personnel who died in the hospital or were evacuated between 18 and 25 September 1944 for burial. If names are not known, all available information should be furnished. The names of all personnel on whom autopsies were performed during the same period are also requested.

X-23 was supposedly recovered from the vicinity of Bayon or Charmes in the Vosges and Meurthe & Moselle departments of France. However case papers do not give any definite place of recovery.

Fingerprints were submitted to Washington for a check of casualties but was returned negative.

An attempt to associate this unknown with casualties in the area have also proven negative. Latest report of reprocessing failed to reveal any further identifying data.
