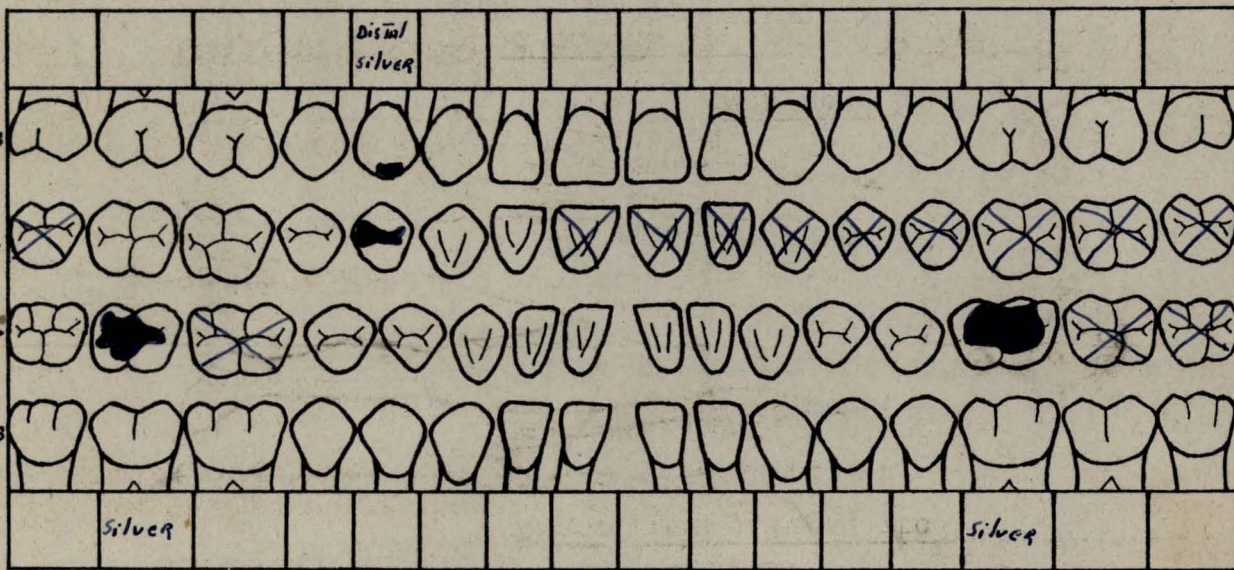

This dental chart is very important and should be filled in with great care. There are 32 teeth to be accounted for, as shown by the numbers on the chart. Beginning at the middle line in both upper and lower jaws, the teeth are arranged symmetrically on either side and classed as incisors (cutting teeth), cuspids or canines (tearing teeth), bicuspid (chewing teeth), and molars (principal chewing teeth). An examination should be made and findings charted to cover the following basic conditions: Lost teeth, crowned teeth, bridge work, fillings, caries (cavities of decay), dentures (plates), and any deformity of jaws found. THRU : Commanding General, Fifteenth U.S. Army.

TO : Commanding General, 35th Infantry Division.

1. The remains of an unidentified soldier were recovered from the Moselle river in the vicinity of Flavigny, France and buried in U.S. Military Cemetery No. 1, Andilly, France, 5 October 1944, as Unknown X-33. Although the estimated time of death indicated on the attached copy of the report of burial is 1 September 1944, this date may contain an error of several days.

2. It is requested that this headquarters be furnished a list in duplicate of the names of all former members of your command who are still carried as MIA in the vicinity of Flavigny, and those who are carried as deceased in that area for whom a report of burial has not been received.

3. When the lists are compiled a check should be made to discover if MIA reports or other data upon which the casualty status was based indicate wounds or injuries to any soldier which would have severed his head and feet. A complete report of all available information which may aid in establishing the identity of Unknown X-33 is requested.

4. What are the names of other units which operated with the 35th Inf. Div. at the river crossing in the vicinity of Flavigny?

## CASE HISTORY

UNKNOWN NO. X-33 U.S. MILITARY CEMETERY Andilly, France  
 (Location)

X-33 was recovered from the banks of the Moselle river at the junction of N-57 and N-413 in the Moselle department of France. The remains is evidently a river case and probably floated quite some distance as indicated by the condition of the remains.

A check of all river casualties for the Moselle river failed to reveal any association. New report of reprocessing dated 26 July 1949 also failed to show any further identifying data.

Actual place and date of death is impossible to establish.
