NARRATIVE

Processing of remains of Pvt Charles G. Stout, 15114250, Ste Mere Eglise #2, Plot P, Row 2, Grave 163, revealed this to be a mass burial. Blackout charts are inclosed with this report to show the parts of two different bodies found.

Isolated burial files at Second Zone show that Pvt Stout was a paratrooper killed in the crash of a C-47. S/Sgt Orlo A. Montgomery, 17089122, radio operator of the plane was the only other person killed in this crash. According to burial records Stout's remains were removed from the wreckage of this plane and buried as Unknown X-40 at Ste Mere Eglise #2 for lack of positive identification. Laundry mark "S-4251", Staff Sergeant chevrons, and a size 12-D paratrooper boot were found with remains. Laundry mark and boots have been associated with Stout.

Since all correspondence indicates that remains were badly broken up and mangled, it is possible that the remains recovered from the wreckage of the plane were those of both Stout and Montgomery. Presence of S/Sgt Montgomery in this burial is indicated by chevrons found at time of original interment.

It is suggested that an Identification Team, equipped with all available physical description information on Stout and Montgomery, be sent to process these remains in an effort to clear status of Montgomery still carried as an Unresolved Casualty by AGRC.

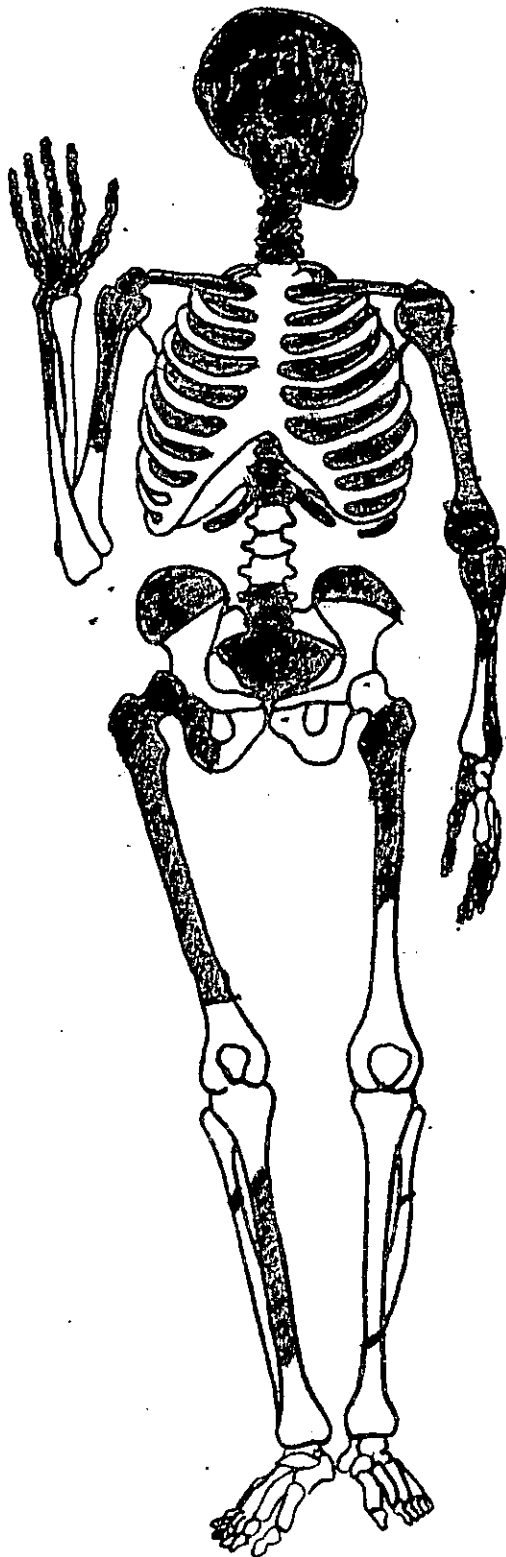

# SKELETAL CHART

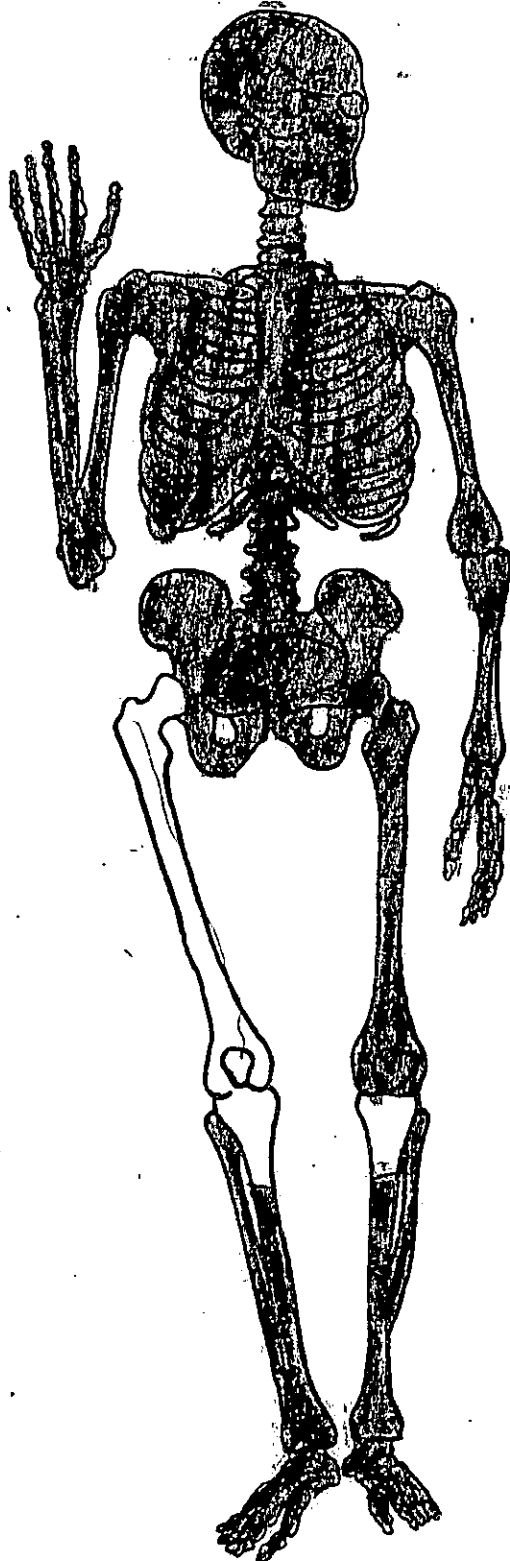


The Board found that processing of remains revealed mass burial  
of two men. Condition of remains made it impossible to  
determine which of the decedents was Pvt Stout, inasmuch as  
there were no teeth for charting and bone measurements were  
not possible. Records indicate possible presence of remains  
of S/Sgt Orlo A. Montgomery, 17089122, in this mass burial.

RECOMMENDATIONS: That case be referred to Hq. AGRC Board of Review  
for decision as to the identification of the two remains.

IDENTIFICATION OF THE REMAINS OF CHARLES G. STOUT

This identification was made at St. Laurent Cemetery on the 28 October 1948.

There were remains of two (2) bodies present. Each bone was examined and measured, which permitted the separation of the bones in two (2) groups.

The head was missing and the tooth chart comparison was impossible.

The height of the two bodies could not be determined because there were no complete long bones.

DISCUSSION

The 371 form gave the following information:

Charles G. Stout, ASN: 15114250  
Height: 8'  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " equals 2.50 m  
Shoe size: 12 $\frac{1}{2}$  D

There is probably an error in the height determination, but still in all, Charles G. Stout was a man of very large stature, as indicated by the shoe size.

The inventory of bones shows that the bones which were present belonged to two (2) individuals, one of which was very tall, the other smaller.

It is therefore right to come to the conclusion that the larger skeleton belongs to Charles G. Stout. These bones were given the denomination of Stout #1. The bones of the second individual were grouped under the denomination of Stout #2.

#### CONCLUSIONS

The remains of Charles G. Stout, Pvt, ASN: 15114250, were identified and grouped as "STOUT #1".

The remains which consist of the smaller bones and which did not belong to the above skeleton were grouped under the denomination of "STOUT #2" of unknown origin.

Beginning at the middle line in both upper and lower jaws, the teeth are arranged symmetrically on either side and classed as incisors (cutting teeth), cuspids or canines (tearing teeth), bicuspids (chewing teeth), and molars (principal chewing teeth). 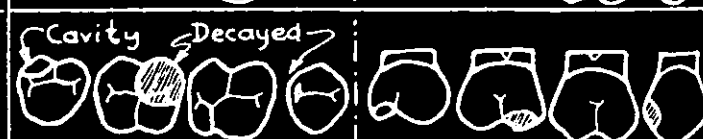
