



This dental chart is very important and should be filled in with great care. There are 32 teeth to be accounted for, as shown by the numbers on the chart. Beginning at the middle line in both upper and lower jaws, the teeth are arranged symmetrically on either side and classed as incisors (cutting teeth), cuspids or canines (tearing teeth), bicuspids (chewing teeth), and molars (principal chewing teeth). An examination should be made and findings charted to cover the following basic conditions: Lost teeth, crowned teeth, bridge work, fillings, caries (cavities of decay), dentures (plates), and any deformity of jaws found. 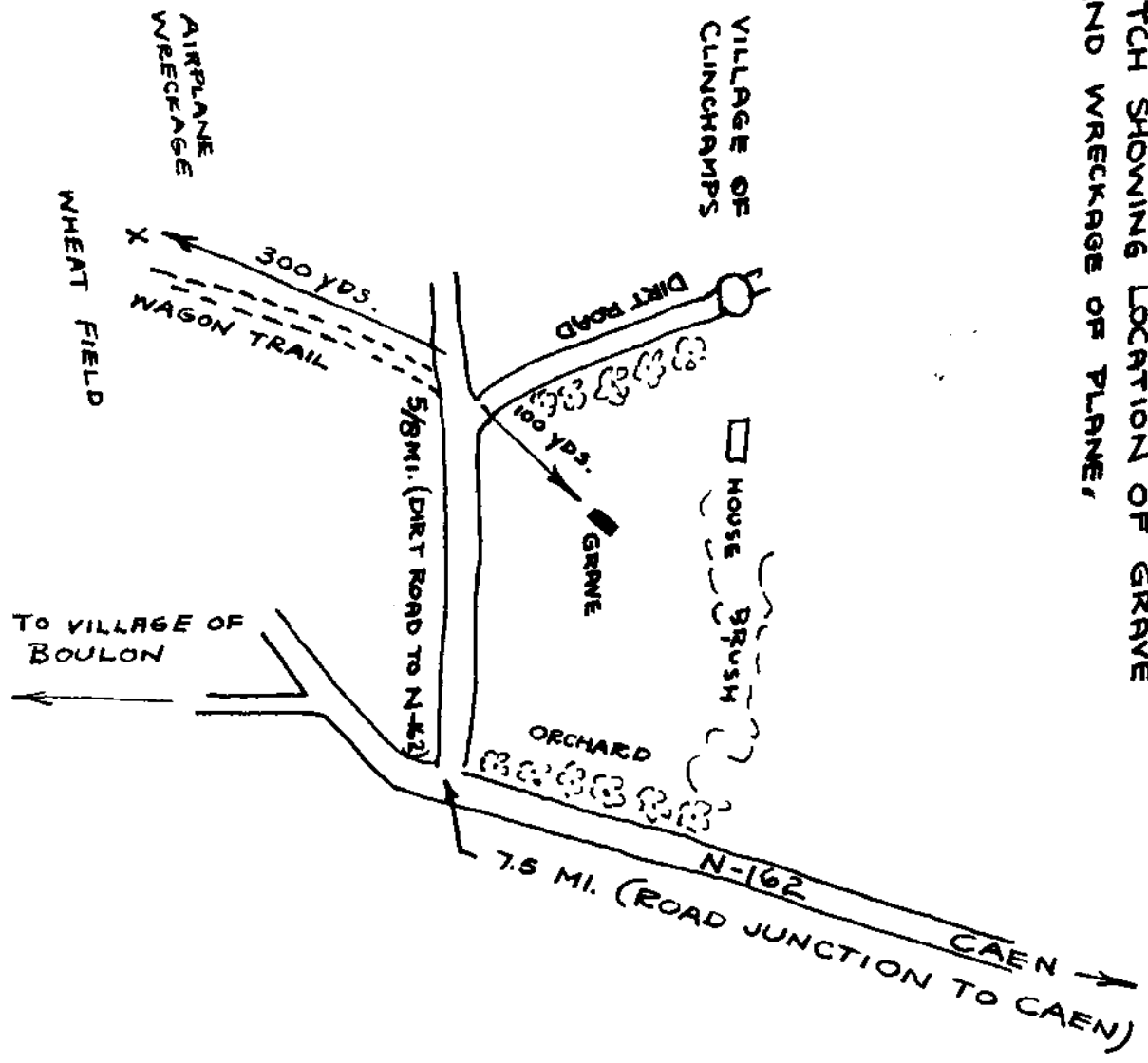

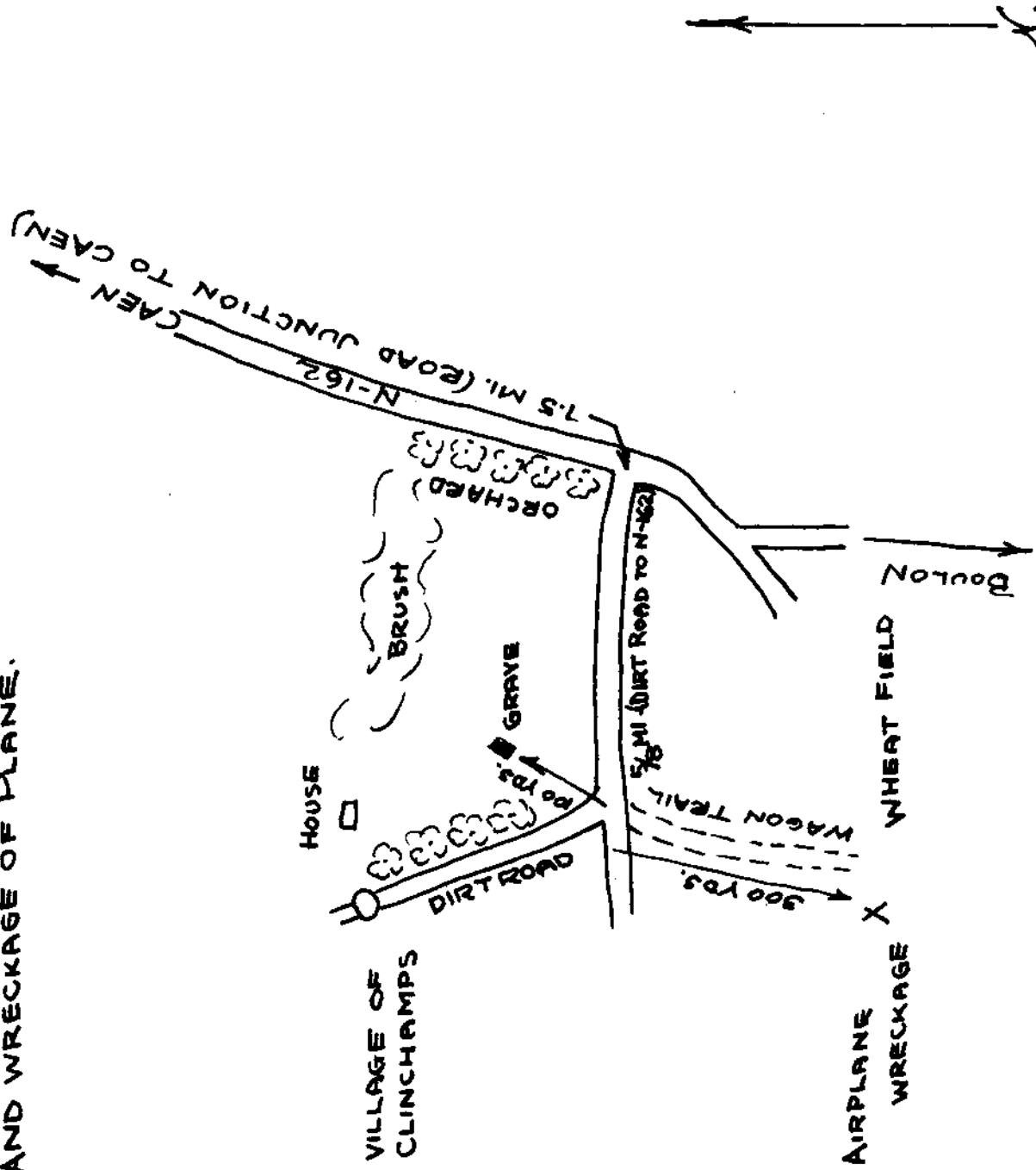

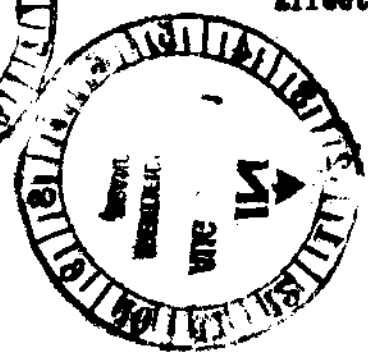
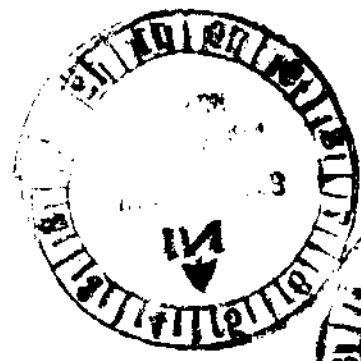
1. Reference is made to Report of Burial dated 10 July 1947 signed by Bernard E. Carroll, WOJG, identifying Unknown X-193, USMC, Bloisville, France, Plot AA, Row 2, Grave 37, previously buried in isolated grave located at Clinchamps-sur-Orne, France, as 1st Lt William E. Ballard Jr, O-748553, 382nd Ptr Sq. The indicated date of death is given as 18 July 1944.

2. The records of this Bureau reveal that 1st Lt William E. Ballard Jr, O-748553, was alive in July of 1945 after return to military control following prisoner of war status. A communication was also received from him in August of 1945 from Camp Patrick Henry, Virginia.

3. The personal effects received at this Bureau bearing designation of X-193, Bloisville, consist of a wedding ring. In this connection, official casualty reports and Bureau file for Lt Ballard do not indicate him to be married.

4. In view of the foregoing, it is requested that field identification as given in above cited Report of Burial be reviewed and this Bureau informed of disposal to be made of the personal effects of X-193, Bloisville, now in custody.

1. Reference is made to Unknown X-193, interred in Plot AA, Row 2, Grave 37, U.S. Military Cemetery, Blotville, France. Since subject decedent was recovered from an isolated grave besides the wreckage of A/C 43-6830, of which Lieutenant William E. Bullard, O 748 553, is listed as pilot and sole occupant, it is believed that the missing air crew report may possibly be erroneous and that Lieut. Bullard was actually not the pilot of subject aircraft on 18 July 44, or that an observer was flying with him that day.

2. It is therefore again requested that Lieutenant Bullard be interrogated to determine:

- a) Whether he actually flew A/C 43-6830 on 18 July 44.
- b) Whether there was a passenger flying with him that day.
- c) The circumstances of the crash.

1. The P-51-B-5 referred to in Basic Communication was piloted by myself at the time of the crash. My name was painted in red letters on the left side of the engine, slightly forward of the cockpit. Directly beneath my name were the names of my Crew Chief, T/Sgt. M.E. Easterly and Armorer, CPL. Huffman. The Squadron markings C-3-I were stenciled on both sides of the fuselage and the regular invasion markings were stenciled on the tops of the wings.

2. The crash was caused by engine failure after an engagement with enemy aircraft during which the aircraft referred to received several hits from enemy guns. The correct date of the crash is 18 July, 1944. I crashed the plane into the ground (an oat or barley field) at the place named and was immediately captured by units of the German Army.

3. I have no knowledge of any crash occurring near me and can not give any information that would identify the Unknown Deceased.

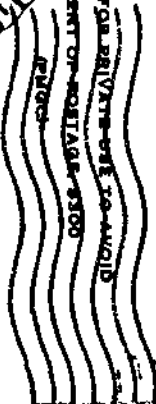
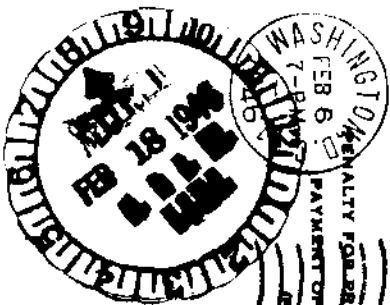

The Squadron markings C-3-X were stenciled on both sides of the fusilage and the regular invasion markings were stenciled on the tops of the wings.

2. The crash was caused by engine failure after an engagement with enemy aircraft during which the aircraft referred to received several hits from enemy guns. The correct date of the crash is 18 July, 1944. I crashed the plane into the ground (an oat or barley field) at the place named and was immediately captured by units of the German Army.

3. I have no knowledge of any crash occurring near me and can not give any information that would identify the Unknown Deceased.

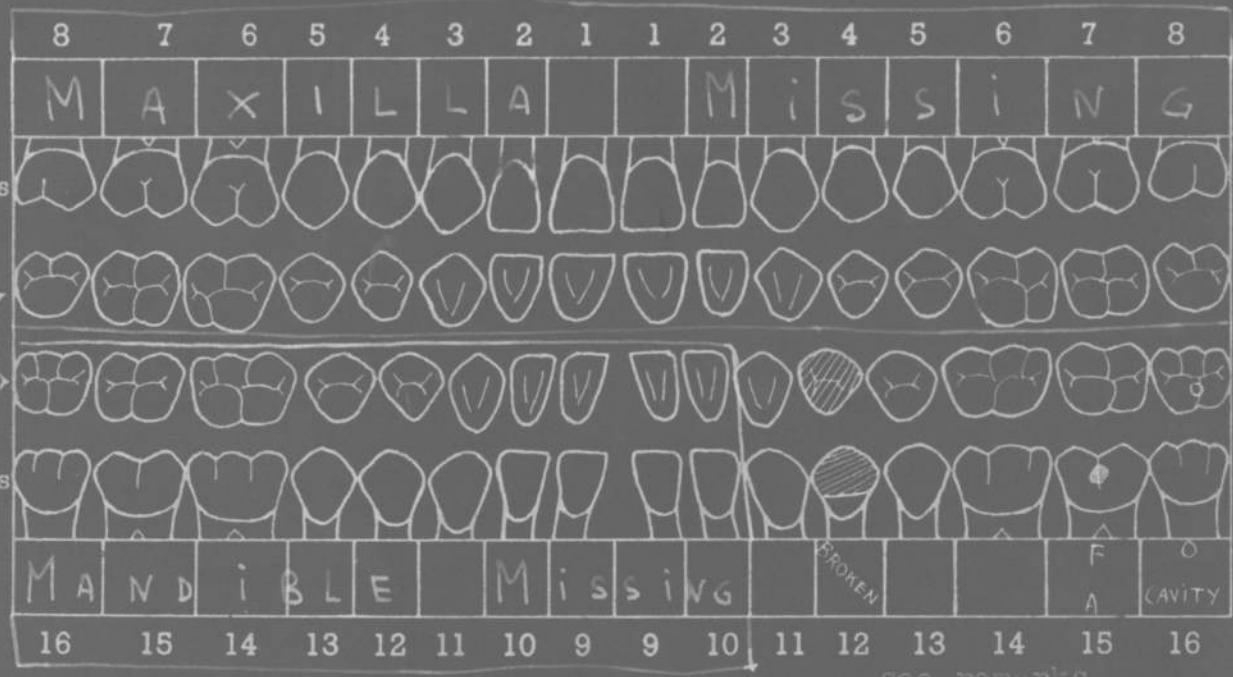

AND WRECKAGE OF PLANE

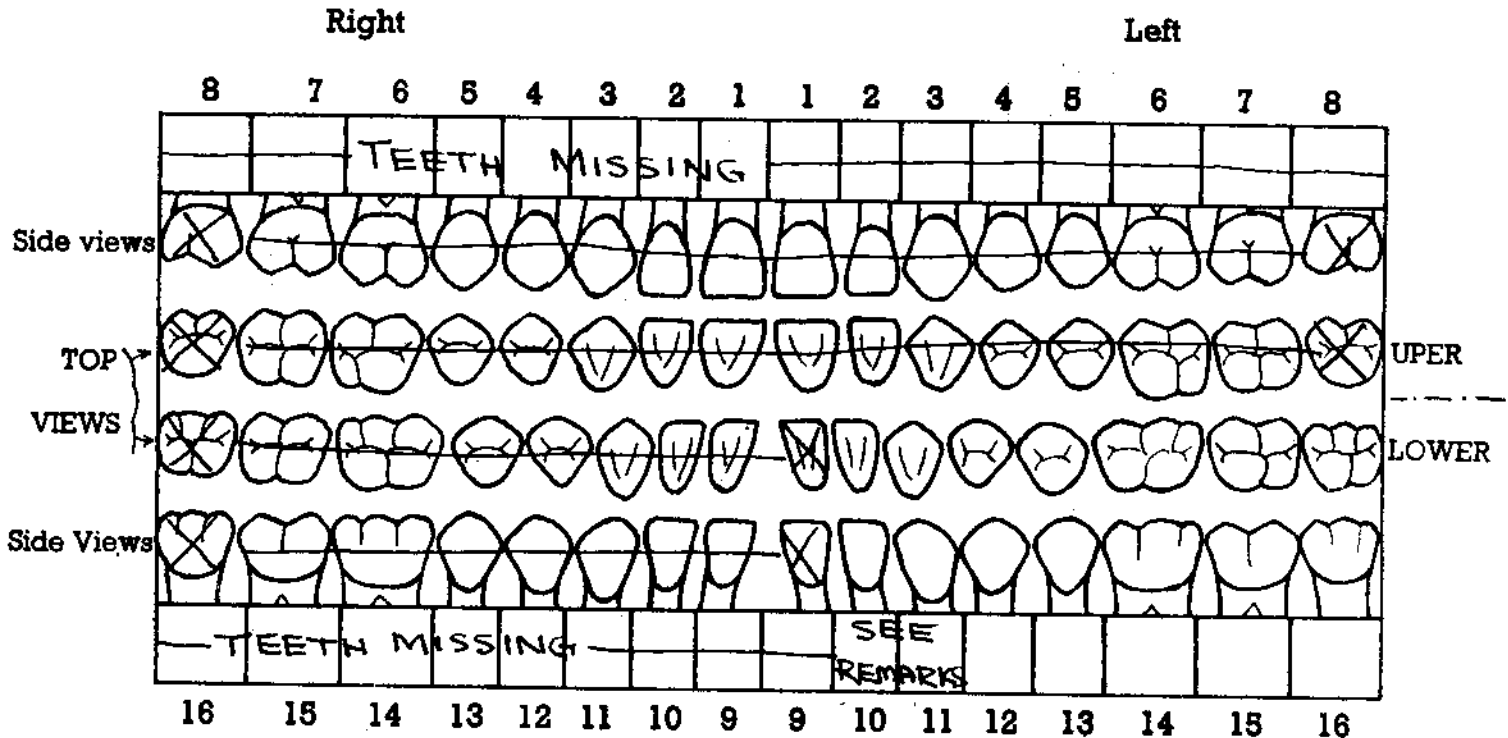
