

At 0930 hours, 18 November 1944, Hr. Francois Maymond found a body buried at the place named "Les Longues Piecca" on the territory of Valmy (Marne) at 150 meters south of the railroad station of Valmy, and at 40 meters of the foot path from Valmy, to the Hamsau of Orbeval, in a piece of land belonging to Mr. Bureau, Charles. Mr. Francois, called Dr. Henri of St. Manehould who verified that the name had been shot behind the ear had brown hair and was about one meter seventy centimeters tall. The doctor notified the French Gendamerie of Auve, (Marne) who notified the the M Ps in Chalons, who went out and removed the body. Two on the fenders, one dipving end three on the rear seat Tho men in the middle of the rear seat was not dressed like a German coldier



Mr. Hennisart, Marcel of St Menehould heard two shot coming from the spot were the body was found. This action took place at about 2000 hours, 28 August 1955.

Co. B 726 MP Bn of Chalons S/ Marne could not be interrogated as they have moved on.

CONCLUSION: It is the opinnion of the various persons interviewed that the man was a flier parachuted who was killed after interrogation at the Germans Headquarters.

Nobody could ascertain if he was an American or Allied soldier.
