**REMARKS :** At 0930 hours, 18 November 1944, Mr. Francois Raymond found a body buried at the place named "Les Longues Pieces" on the territory of Valmy (Marne) at 150 meters south of the railroad station of Valmy, and at 40 meters of the foot path from Valmy, to the Hameau of Orbeval, in a piece of land belonging to Mr Bureau, Charles. Mr Francois, called Dr Henri of St Menesould who verified that the man had been shot behind the ear had brown hair and was about one meter seventy centimeters tall. The doctor notified the French Gendarmerie of Aube, (Marne) who notified the M P's in Chalons, who went out and removed the body. The following items were found on the spot by the Gendarmes and turned over to the M P's:

- 1 box of matches "Marland Safety "
- 1 Pk cigarettes "Lucky Strike"
- 1 hair comb "made in U S A "
- 2 Handkerchiefs (without markings)
- 1 ring (white metal)

Nothing was available in the area where the body was found, this fact was verified by the undersigned the land is now ceded

It is the opinion of Mr Procureur, Mayor of Valmy, that this man was a flier POW brought to Valmy to be interrogated, as there was a German Headquarters in the town at the time, and then killed and buried him before the American Armies reached the town

Mr Humbert Leon, reported that on 28 August 1944, about 2130 hours, two days before the American Armies reached the town, a German car passed the crossing with six men on board. Two on the fenders, one driving and three on the rear seat. The man in the middle of the rear seat was not dressed like a German soldier

Mr. Hennsart, Marcel of S<sub>4</sub> Mensould heard two shot coming from the spot where the body was found. This action took place at about 2000 hours, 28 August 1944.

Co. B 726 MP Bn of Chalons S/ Marne could not be interrogated as they have moved on.

**CONCLUSION :** It is the opinion of the various persons interviewed that the man was a flier parachuted who was killed after interrogation at the Germans Headquarters.

Nobody could ascertain if he was an American or Allied soldier.
