Unknown X-81 A, B USMC, Lynes, France

NARRATIVE

Disinterment Directive #59 dated 23 Oct, 1946 called for the reprocessing of Unknown X-81, Plot D, Row 13, Grave 435. Processing revealed the presence of two (2) deceased, hereinafter designated X-81 A, and X-81 B.

It was possible to segregate these two remains and reconstruct the original individual skeletons owing to bone size, structure and discoloration.

Unknown #X-81A, is assigned to the remains of the larger deceased, while X-81 B is assigned to the remains of the smaller deceased.

X-81A has been reinterred in the original grave, Plot D, Row 13, grave 435, together with all the clothing found in the debris and listed as common to the two remains.

X-81 B has been reinterred in Plot 1B, Row 21, Grave 1110.

Teeth for two men were found in the debris.

It was possible to assign the teeth to the individual remains because of the great difference in the coloring of the bones of the two remains.

Since tooth separation was accomplished, the individual teeth are being buried with each respective remains.

Accordingly, tooth charts accompany respective papers.

Fluoroscopic Examination of the debris in either case is negative.

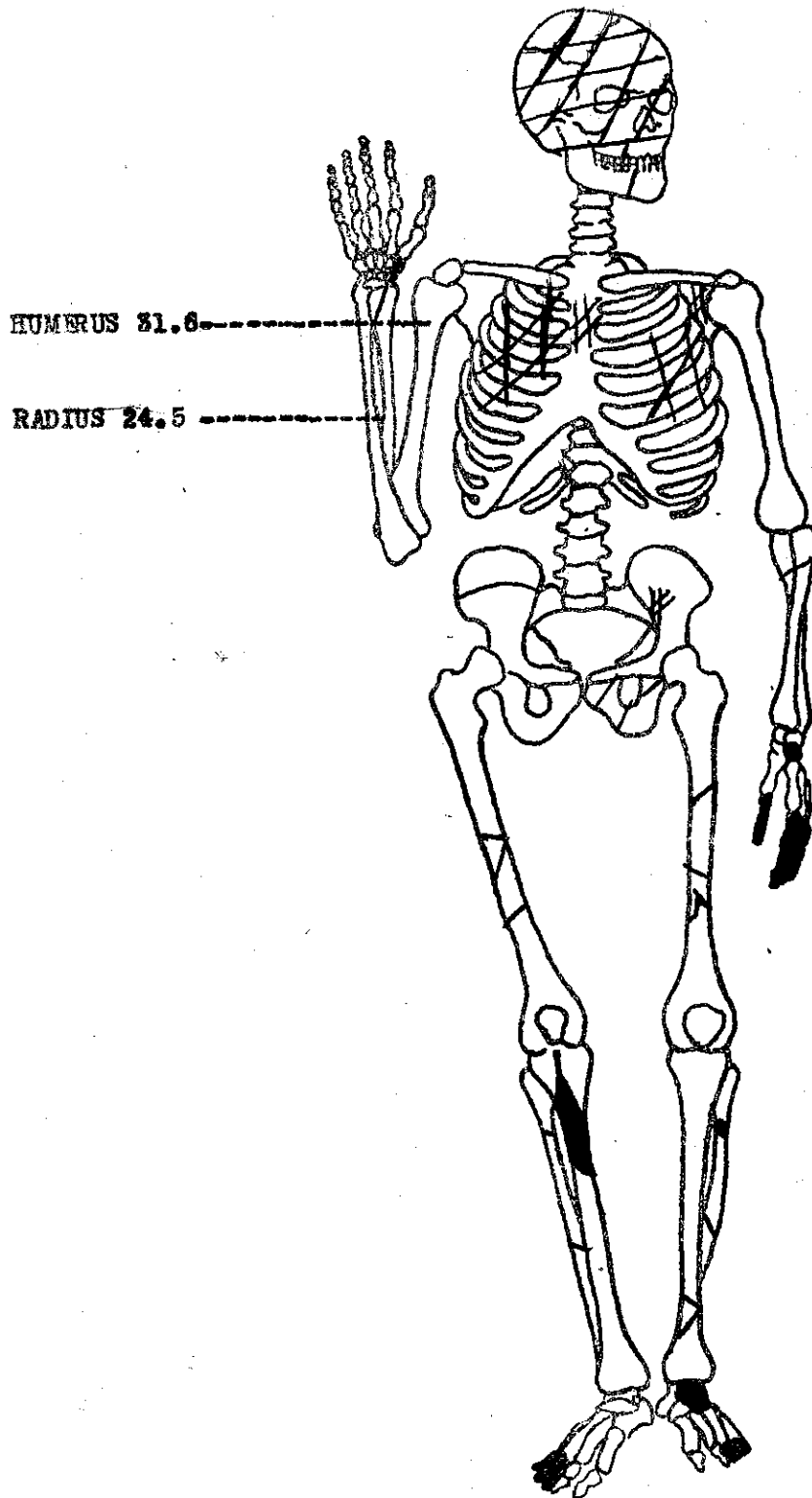

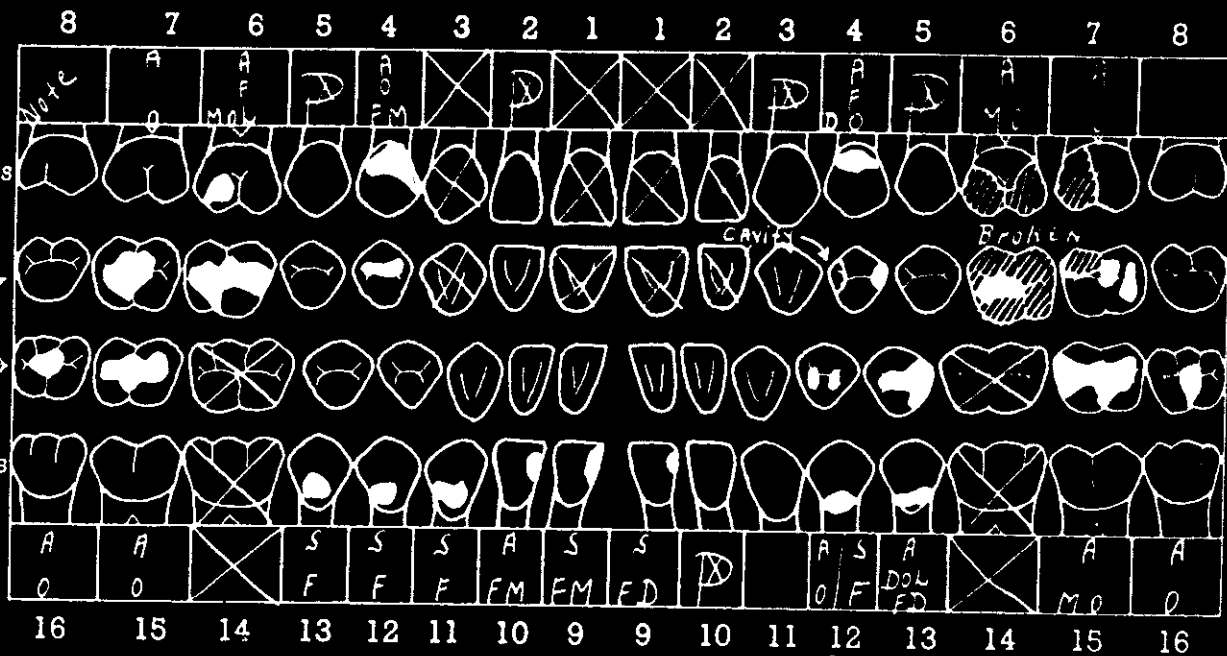

This dental chart is very important and should be filled in with great care. There are 32 teeth to be accounted for, as shown by the numbers on the chart. Beginning at the middle line in both upper and lower jaws, the teeth are arranged symmetrically on either side and classed as incisors (cutting teeth), cuspids or canines (tearing teeth), bicuspids (chewing teeth), and molars (principal chewing teeth). An examination should be made and findings charted to cover the following basic conditions: Lost teeth, crowned teeth, bridge work, fillings, caries (cavities of decay), dentures (plates), and any deformity of jaws found. See reverse side for illustrations.






<p>MISSING TEETH . . . All teeth missing through previous extraction (not those fractured or displaced by recent wounds) should be "X" 'd out and labeled, thus :</p>	
<p>CROWNED TEETH . . . Block in solid the crown of tooth (label gold, porcelain, Silver or gold and porcelain), thus :</p>	
<p>BRIDGE WORK . . . Block in solid the crown of tooth (label gold bridge, gold and porcelain bridge), thus :</p>	
<p>FILLINGS . . . Draw filling on tooth as accurately as possible (block in and label gold, silver, cement), thus :</p>	
<p>CARIES (CAVITIES) . . . Outline location and size of cavity, shade in thus :</p>	

DENTURES (PLATES) . . . Draw diagram of relative size and shape of plate, block in teeth attached and indicate retaining clasps on natural teeth with the word "clasp."

ADDITIONAL SPACE FOR FURTHER REMARKS

The teeth here charted were found in a mass burial which has been segregated. Assignment of teeth to individual bodies was possible due to the difference in the color of the bones of the two skeletons. This maxilla and mandible has been charted together on the basis of similarity in size, color, and shape of teeth and correct occlusion.




