1. In compliance with paragraph 5 and 6 of basic communication, body of LESTER
L. MUSE, S/Sgt, 34814280, buried in Plot N, Row 18, Grave 1934, at EPINAL CEMETERY
was disinterred. Body had both legs attached, and had identification tag on chain
around neck. No laundry marks or other identifying marks could be found.

2. Investigation surrounding the facts of the burial at LIMBY CEMETERY
revealed the following:

a. Mr EMIL MOUJEN of Migneville, France found the one leg, two ident-
ification tags (inclosed) and personal effects belonging to LESTER L. MUSE. Mr.
EMIL MOUJEN buried the remains on 10 March 1945, in the Commune Cemetery of Mig-
neville, France.

b. The personal effects were turned over to Mr. George Zalesky, Sec-
retary to the Mayor of Migneville, who turned them over to GRS personnel at the
time of disinterment from Migneville Cemetery.

c. Effects which were turned over to Personal Effects and Baggage
Depot Q-290 on 1 September 1945, consisted of Enlisted Man's identification card,
2 receipts and 7 American dollars.

3. Since the body interred at Epinal Cemetery as LESTER L. MUSE included
both legs it is not considered that the remains buried in Limey Cemetery, i.e.,
right foot and leg, belonged to the same deceased.

4. Inclosed Report of Burial for Unknown X-83 is in substitution for Form
1 formerly submitted for MUSE, LESTER L., rank unknown, ASN 34814280. This cor-
respondence is assigned Letter of Transmittal # 322.

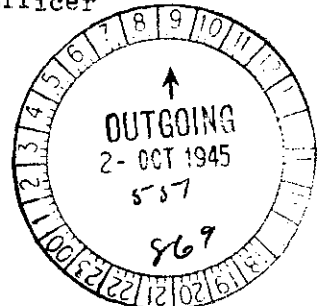
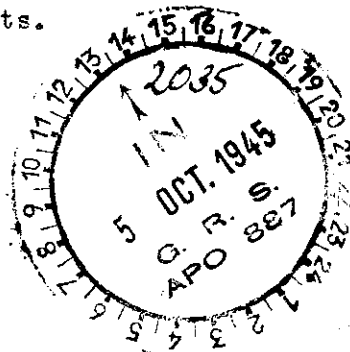

TO : The Graves Registration Officer, Oise Intermediate Section,
APO 513, U.S. Army.

1. Reference is made to Report of Burial received at this Headquarters for LESTER L. MUSE, Rank unknown, 34814280, buried 4 June 1945 at Limey American Military Cemetery in Plot B, Row 3, Grave 59.
2. The remains, consisting of right foot and leg, from the knee down, were disinterred from the commune cemetery of MIGNEVILLE, 25 Kilo East of LUNEVILLE, France. The estimated date of death was November 1944 and identification was established by identification tags.
3. This Headquarters had previously received a report of burial for S/Sgt. LESTER L. MUSE, A.S.N. 34814280, buried at Epinal American Military Cemetery in Plot N, Row 18, Grave 1934. The place of death was in the vicinity of FREMENIL, France (V255965) and the date estimated 13 November 1944. Identification was also established by identification tags.
4. The cause of death of the remains buried at Limey is given as "Result of mine explosion", while that of the deceased buried at Epinal is "S.F.W. Head and abdomen".
5. Request an investigation be conducted, disinterments made and full report of results forwarded to this Headquarters to determine if remains buried at Limey are part of the body buried at Epinal.
6. Should investigation reveal that both interments are one and the same man, request the remains buried at Limey be disinterred and re-buried with the remains at Epinal. All records will be adjusted accordingly and this Headquarters notified of the Action taken.

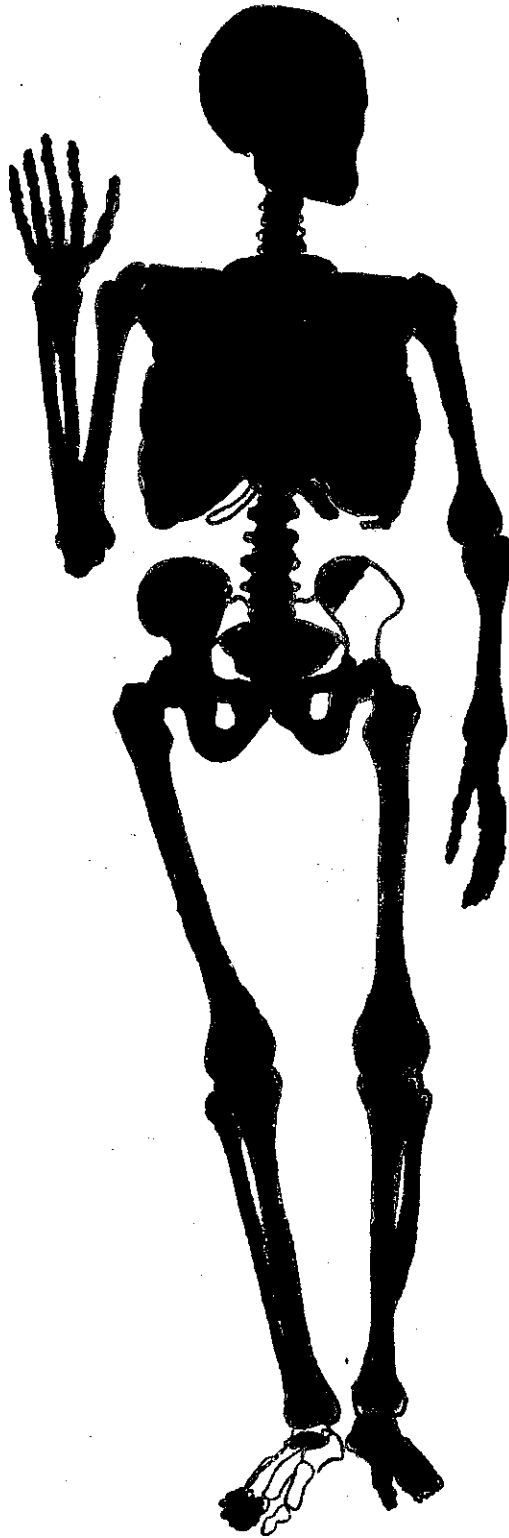
