MEMORANDUM

Mr. Hlary, the funeral director and embalmer at La Seyne, La Seyne (Var), France was contacted 14 February 1945.

He related a story of three (3) soldiers believed to be American buried in the cemetery of La Seyne. Two (2) of which had been disinterred and taken to Jaynes Military Cemetery in July 1945, while the third body was still in the cemetery buried as an unknown. He gave a statement about the third body which contained the following information:

"In February 1945 a body was washed ashore at La Seyne (Var), France. The date of death was estimated as August 1944. The body was buried in February 1945. There was no way in which to identify the body because of the advanced stage of decomposition, and lack of clothing.

As shown by the cemetery's records the deceased was buried in Plot 16, Row 1, Grave 15 at the La Seyne Cemetery, 3 February 1945. The funeral director's records show date of burial as 22 February 1945 for the same body.

After the investigation conducted by Pfc. Goldenberg, and Pvt. Rosenthal, the body was disinterred from La Seyne and reburied in Jaynes Military Cemetery, France, 22 February 1945.

(BLACK OUT PARTS OF BODY NOT RECEIVED AT CEMETERY)


