This dental chart is very important and should be filled in with great care. There are 32 teeth to be accounted for, as shown by the numbers on the chart. Beginning at the middle line in both upper and lower jaws, the teeth are arranged symmetrically on each side and classed as incisors (cutting teeth), cuspids or canines (tearing teeth), premolars (chewing teeth), and molars (principal chewing teeth). An examination should be made and findings charted to cover the following basic conditions: loose teeth, loose bridge work, fillings, caries (cavities of decay), dentures (plates), and any dentistry of any kind.
