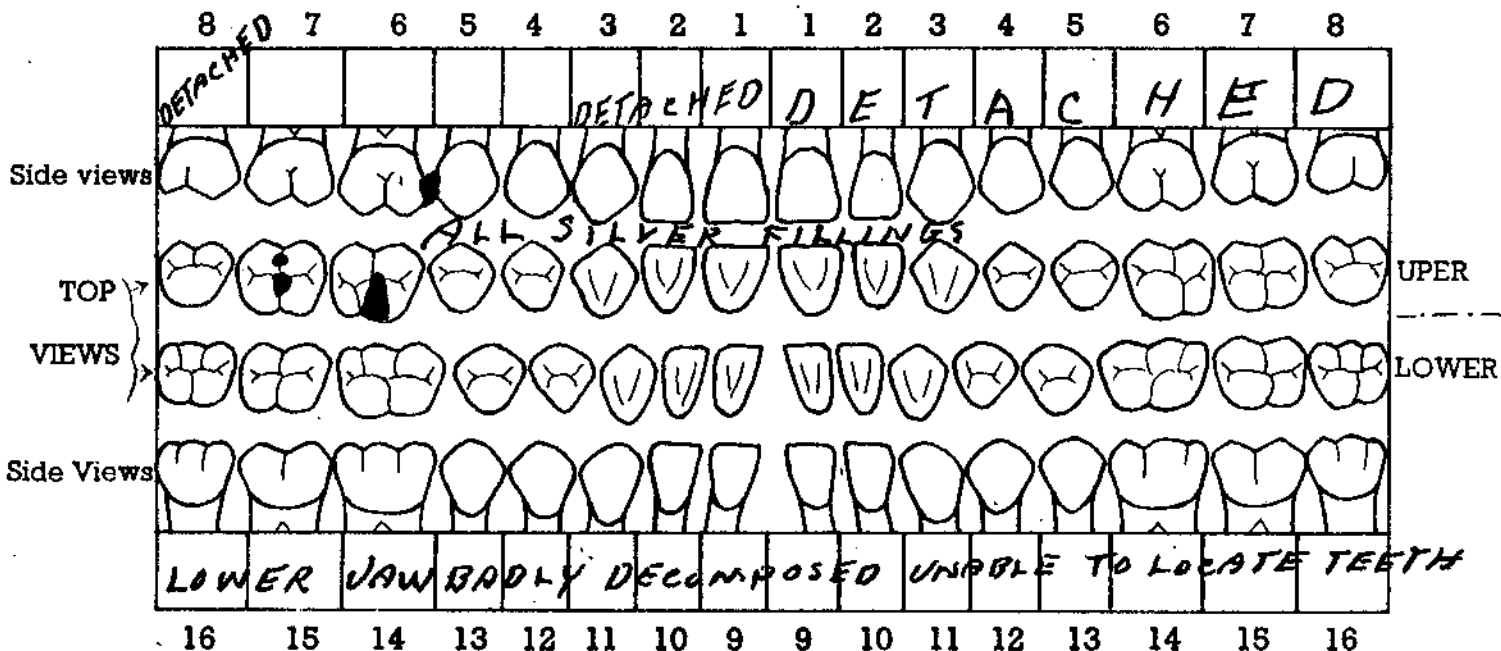

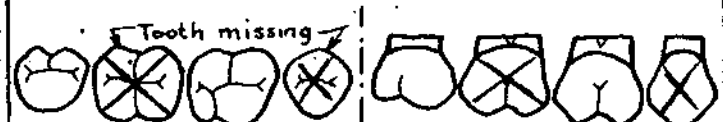


This dental chart is very important and should be filled in with great care. There are 32 teeth to be accounted for, as shown by the numbers on the chart. Beginning at the middle line in both upper and lower jaws, the teeth are arranged symmetrically on either side and classed as incisors (cutting teeth), cuspids or canines (tearing teeth), bicuspids (chewing teeth), and molars (principal chewing teeth). An examination should be made and findings charted to cover the following basic conditions: Lost teeth, crowned teeth, bridge work; fillings, caries (cavities of decay), dentures (plates), and any deformity of jaws found. See reverse side for illustrations.

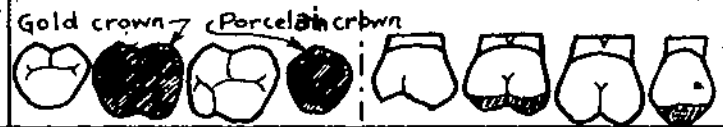

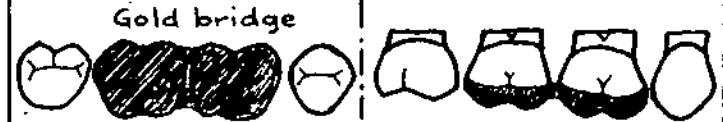
**MISSING TEETH...** All teeth missing through previous extraction (not those fractured or displaced by recent wounds) should be "X" 'd out and labeled, thus :



**CROWNED TEETH...** Block in solid the crown of tooth (label gold, porcelain, Silver or gold and porcelain), thus :



**BRIDGE WORK...** Block in solid the crown of tooth (label gold bridge, gold and porcelain bridge), thus :



**FILLINGS...** Draw filling on tooth as accurately as possible (block in and label gold, silver, cement), thus :



**CARIES (CAVITIES)...** Outline location and size of cavity, shade in thus :



**DENTURES (PLATES)...** Draw diagram of relative size and shape of plate, block in teeth attached and indicate retaining clasps on natural teeth with the word "clasp."

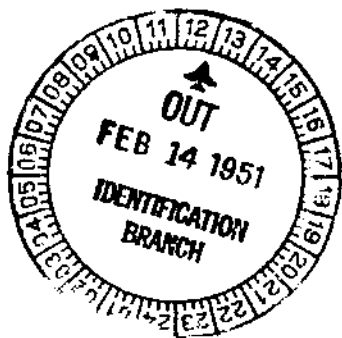

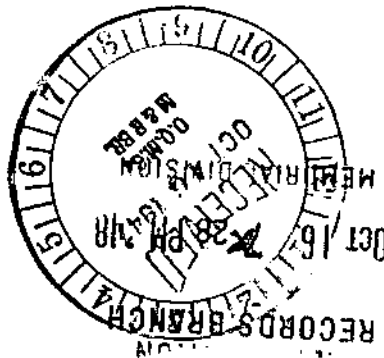
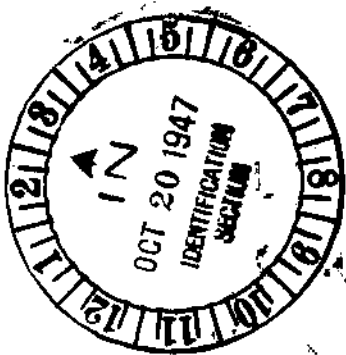

1. In compliance with ComNavEu ltr., file P6 serial  
3576, dtd 23 March 1945, investigation made as to circum-  
stances under which the bodies of Mazzanti and Yates were  
found are as follows:

(a) Interrogation of villagers of Mathieu, Clavados,  
France revealed none who had witnessed the burial of subject  
deceased. At the time of the burials, the village was  
under artillery fire. M. Desmilles, Mayor of Mathieu,  
Calvados states that the bodies of three (3) American  
deceased were presumed buried in the village church yard by  
British soldiers as no American soldiers were seen in this  
area.

(b) Records in the Mayor's office reveal three (3)  
American U. S. Navy bodies buried in town cemetery on 2 July  
1944. Description on grave markers is only clue as to  
identity, as follows:

2. UNKNOWN X-506, Plot BD, Row 7, Grave 130, La  
Cambe American Military Cemetery which is the Unknown burial  
mentioned above, has been disinterred. A careful investiga-  
tion was made and it can be definitely stated that said  
remains are not those of RIGALI, Henry Paul, MM2c, USNR.  
The body is not that of Navy Personnel but of the Army, and  
is substantiated by the following facts:

- (a) Paybook found of US Army enlisted man bearing  
name HARPER, Feliz M. 13016604, grade T/5.
- (b) U.S. Army driver's license bearing same name.
- (c) Army Garrison shoes size 8EE.



- (d) HBT coveralls (size unknown).
- (e) OD shirt and trousers (size unknown).
- (f) Remains estimated to be 5'6" height, 160 lbs. weight.

1. According to information received by the Navy Department it is believed that the remains now buried as Unknown X-506, Plot 8D, Row 7, Grave 130, U. S. Military Cemetery, La Cambe, France, are those of Henry Paul Rigali, 666 54 66, BM2c, USNR.

2. Machinist's Mate Second Class Rigali has been carried in a deserter status since 1 July 1944. Two other Navy enlisted men, Walter Joseph Mazzanti, 809 45 56, SF2c, USNR and Theodore Frank Yates, 202 41 87, BM2c, USN, were also declared deserters at the same time. The remains of these two men were recovered from the British Military Cemetery, Mathieu, Calvados, France and reinterred on 26 January 1945 in Graves 132 and 133, Row 7, Plot 8D, La Cambe Cemetery. The remains of Unknown X-506 were reported located at the same place.

3. The Report of Burial for Unknown X-506 states that a tooth chart was not obtainable. It is requested that the remains now buried as Unknown X-506 be disinterred, when practicable, to determine if any teeth can be located that may be checked with the inclosed Navy Dental Record of Henry Paul Rigali.

BASIS FOR IDENTIFICATION

1. Unknown X-506 was originally believed to be a member of the U. S. Navy, but upon disinterment remains were determined to be those of Army Personnel. (Exhibit 1) (Tab P)
2. Found on the unknown was a pay book of U. S. Army enlisted man bearing the name, Harper, Felix M. 13016604, grade T/5, together with U. S. Army driver's license bearing the same name. (Exhibit #1, Tab P)
3. AGO Report of Death on file for above deceased, KIA 6 June 1944.
4. WD records indicate Harper was a member of Battery B, 29th Field Artillery Battalion.
5. From Historical Section AGO it was learned that Battery B, 29 F A Btn, in support of the 8th Inf. regiment, participated in the assault on the French coast at Utah Beach in the vicinity of Ste Marie-du Mont, on 6 June 1944. WD records indicate place of death for Harper as Ste Marie du Mont.
6. The check list made at the time of reprocessing the remains of Unknown X-506, estimated height as 5' 7-5/8" which compares very favorably with WD records for Harper which give his height at induction as 5' 8".
7. The clothing found on reprocessing, indicated the deceased to be a member of the ground forces.
8. The results of investigation on disinterment (Exhibit 1) (Tab P) state the deceased was wearing U.S.A. garrison shoes size 8EE, WD records for Harper give his shoe size at time of induction as 8EE. The shoe size shown as 8AA on the check list is believed to be a typographical error.
9. The partial tooth chart submitted on reprocessing the remains of Unk. X-506, showing small fillings in R-7 and R-6, has been checked against WD Dental records at

1. In compliance with ComNavBu ltr., file P6 serial 3576, dtd 23 March 1945, investigation made as to circumstances under which the bodies of Mazzanti and Yates were found are as follows:

(a) Interrogation of villagers of Mathieu, Calvados, France revealed none who had witnessed the burial of subject deceased. At the time of the burials, the village was under artillery fire. M. Desmullies, Mayor of Mathieu, Calvados states that the bodies of three (3) American deceased were presumed buried in the village churchyard by British soldiers as no American soldiers were seen in this area.

(b) Records in the Mayor's office reveal three (3) American U. S. Navy bodies buried in town cemetery on 2 July 1944. Description on grave markers is only clue as to identity, as follows:

2. UNKNOWN X-506, Plot BD, Row 7, Grave 130, La Cambre American Military Cemetery which is the Unknown burial mentioned above, has been disinterred. A careful investigation was made and it can be definitely stated that said remains are not those of RIGALI, Henry Paul, SP2c, USNR. The body is not that of Navy Personnel but of the Army, and is substantiated by the following facts:

- (a) Paybook found of US Army enlisted man bearing name HARPER, Willie M. 13016604, grade P/5.
- (b) U.S. Army driver's license bearing same name.
- (c) Army Garrison shoes size 8 1/2.

2. Reference (b) reported to the Secretary of the Navy the re-interment of the bodies of MAZZANTI and YATES. No previous notification of the death of these men had been received at this command.

3. The Commander, U.S. Naval Forces in Europe, requested additional information from the Commander, U. S. Ports and Bases, France in reference (c). Reference (d), in reply, gave no additional information in the case of MAZZANTI AND YATES, except that they had died on 2 July 1944.

4. Reference (d) further states that an unidentified body of an American sailor had been buried in the British Military Cemetery, Mathieu, Calcaos, France, as X-506, and interred at the same time as the bodies of MAZZANTI and YATES at the American Military Cemetery, La Cambe, France. My dear Mr. Glason:

Reference is made to a letter addressed to your office stating that Mrs. Clara Rigali, 10 Chestnut Street, Springfield, Massachusetts, has received a report to the effect that her son, Henry Paul Rigali, Machinist's Mate second class, United States Naval Reserve, lost his life on 2 July 1944.

According to the records of this Bureau, Mr. Rigali was attached to the Commander, Task Group 127.2, and was serving as a member of Mobile Repair Unit (#9A), in Juno Beach, Orselles, France, at the time of his disappearance. He failed to return from Liberty on 3 July 1944, and after thirty days had elapsed was declared to be a deserter from his command and the U. S. Naval Service as of 8:00 a.m., on that date, in conformance with Navy Regulations.

It is noted that the Commander, U. S. Naval Forces in Europe reported by a dispatch dated 23 March 1945 that the two men Mrs. Rigali states were with her son, Walter Mazzanti, Shipfitter second class, and Theodore F. Yates, Machinist's Mate second class, had died on 2 July 1944. Shortly after the receipt of the report of Mr. Rigali's desertion, an investigation was instigated to determine his correct status and to obtain all available information regarding the circumstances surrounding his disappearance. To date this investigation has not revealed any information regarding Mr. Rigali, but it is being continued and when completed the results will be promptly forwarded to Mrs. Rigali. In this connection, it would be appreciated if Mrs. Rigali will forward to this Bureau the name and address of the person who informed her that her son lost his life on 2 July 1944, in order that he may be contacted and his statement verified.

Deepest sympathy is extended, through you, to Mrs. Rigali in her anxiety.

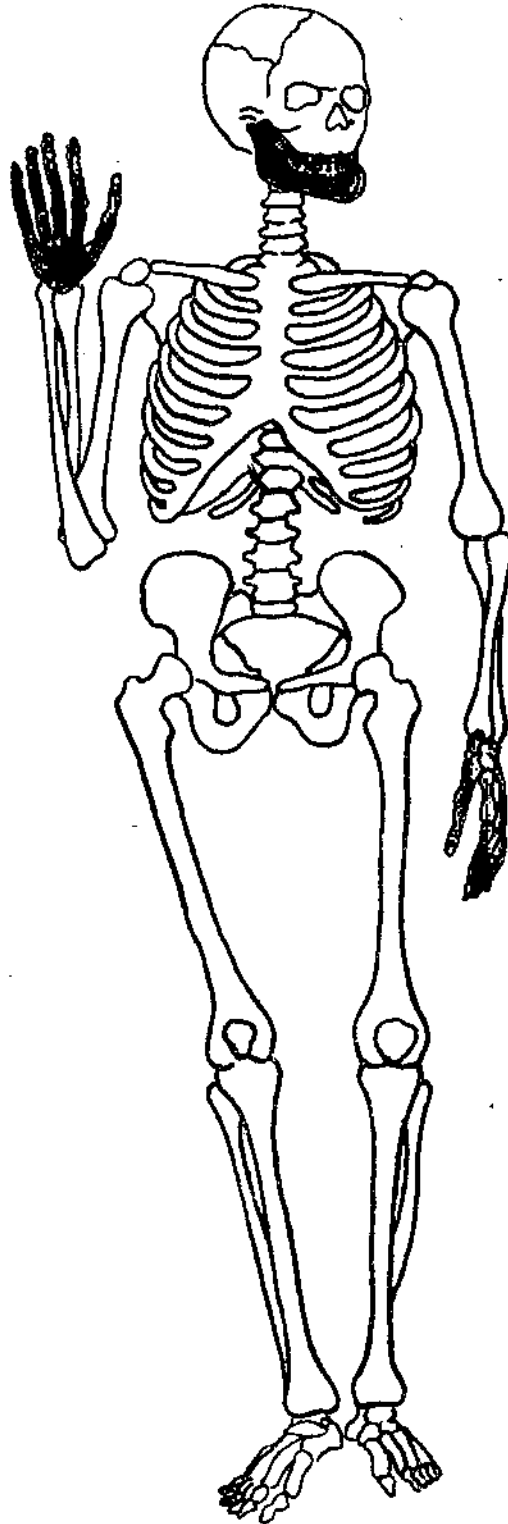

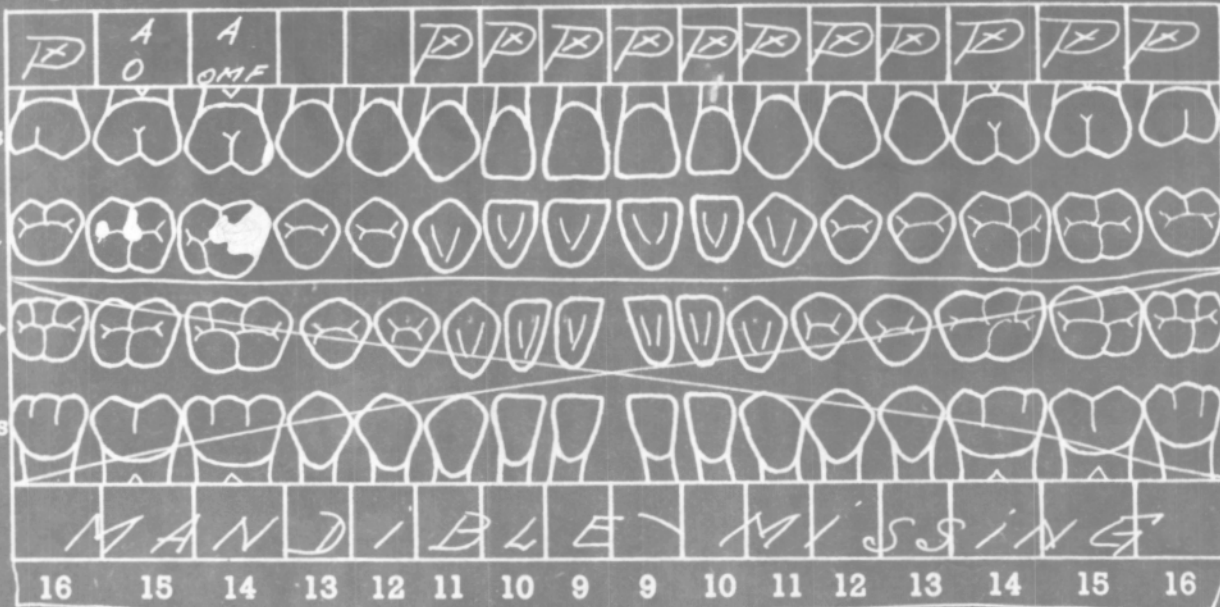

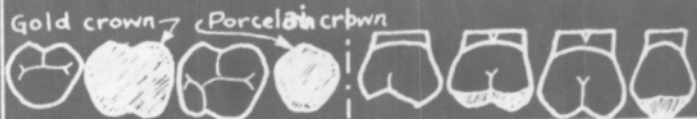
This dental chart is very important and should be filled in with great care. There are 32 teeth to be accounted for, as shown by the numbers on the chart. Beginning at the middle line in both upper and lower jaws, the teeth are arranged symmetrically on either side and classed as incisors (cutting teeth), cuspids or canines (tearing teeth), bicuspids (chewing teeth), and molars (principal chewing teeth). An examination should be made and findings charted to cover the following basic conditions: Lost teeth, crowned teeth, bridge work, fillings, caries (cavities of decay), dentures (plates), and any deformity of jaws found. 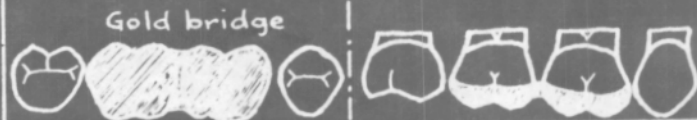

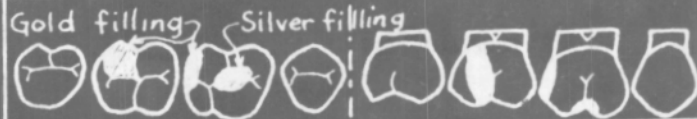
**CROWNED TEETH** . . Block in solid the crown of tooth (label gold, porcelain, Silver or gold and porcelain), thus :



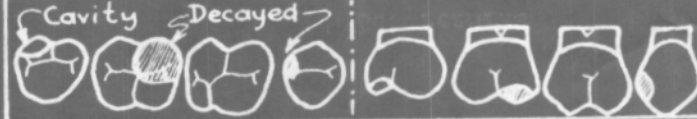
**BRIDGE WORK** . . Block in solid the crown of tooth (label gold bridge, gold and porcelain bridge), thus :



**FILLINGS** . . Draw filling on tooth as accurately as possible (block in and label gold, silver, cement), thus :

**DENTURES (PLATES)** . . Draw diagram of relative size and shape of plate, block in teeth attached and indicate retaining clasps on natural teeth with the word "clasp."

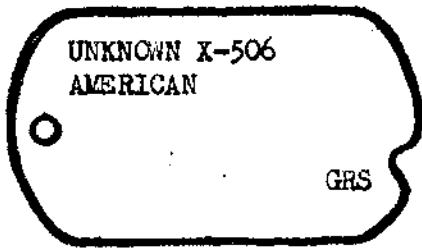
