1. Reference is made to report of burial for Unknown X-16, LeChene-Guerin Cemetery, France, Plot B, Row 1, Grave 14.
2. The fingerprints submitted have been identified as those of PFC Raymond H. Lamont, 35226957. His religious preference is Catholic.
3. Attention is invited to the report of burial submitted for Pvt Raymond H. Lamont, 35226957, buried in Plot B, Row 1, Grave 18, LeChene-Guerin Cemetery; identification having been made from the identification tags.
4. It is requested that the remains in each grave be exhumed in the presence of a Medical Officer to determine whether there are one or two bodies. 1. The dental chart submitted for the remains interred as Unknown X-16, Plot B, Row 1, Grave 14, has been compared and found identical with that on file for Pfc. Raymond H. LAMONT, ASN 35 226 957.

2. In view of the fact that the fingerprints and tooth chart submitted for Unknown X-16 agree with those of Lamont, identification of the remains interred as Unknown X-16 is established.

3. The height, weight, and shoe size submitted for the remains buried in Plot B, Row 1, Grave 18, as LAMONT compares as follows:

DECEASED

Height - 6' 2"
Weight - 180 lbs
Shoe size - 10E

LAMONT

Height - 5'9"
Weight - 203 lbs
Shoe size - 10 1/20

4. It is, therefore, requested that the remains in both graves be exhumed in the presence of two Medical Officers to determine if they are definitely two distinct separate bodies. If it is found that two separate bodies are interred therein, Grave 18, previously marked as that of LAMONT, will be carried as an Unknown and a corrected report of burial submitted to this office. The identification tags interred therein will be removed and placed with the remains in Grave 14.

5. If it is still held that the remains in both graves constitute but one body, they should be concentrated in the grave previously carried as Lamont, (Grave 18).

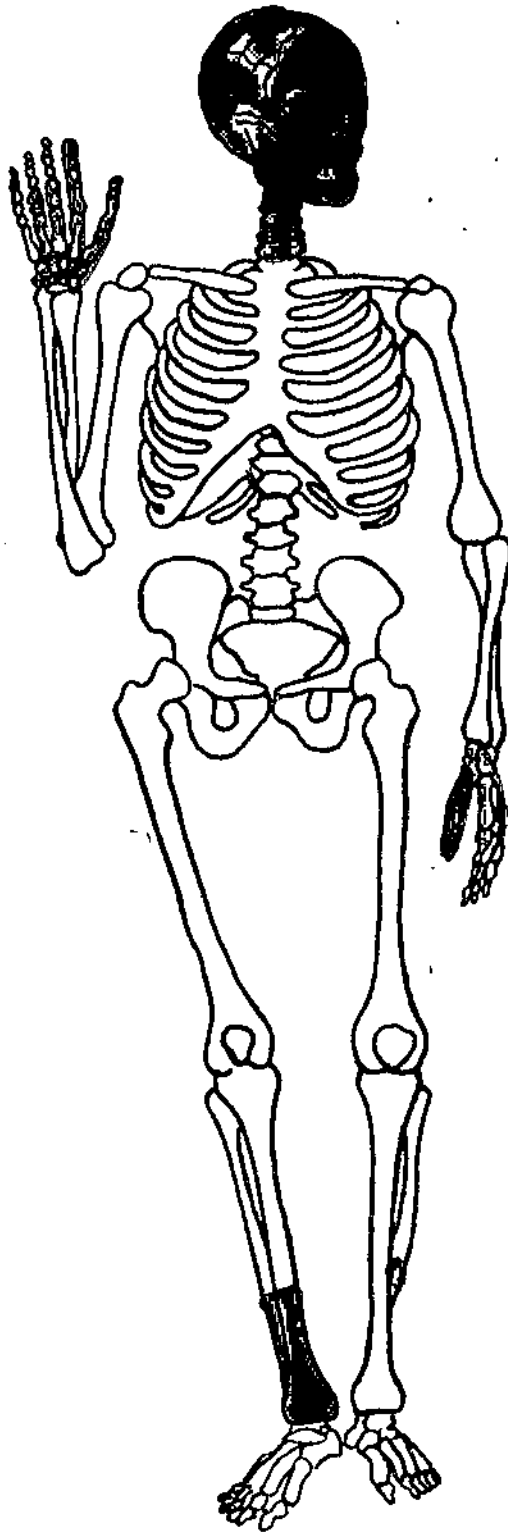

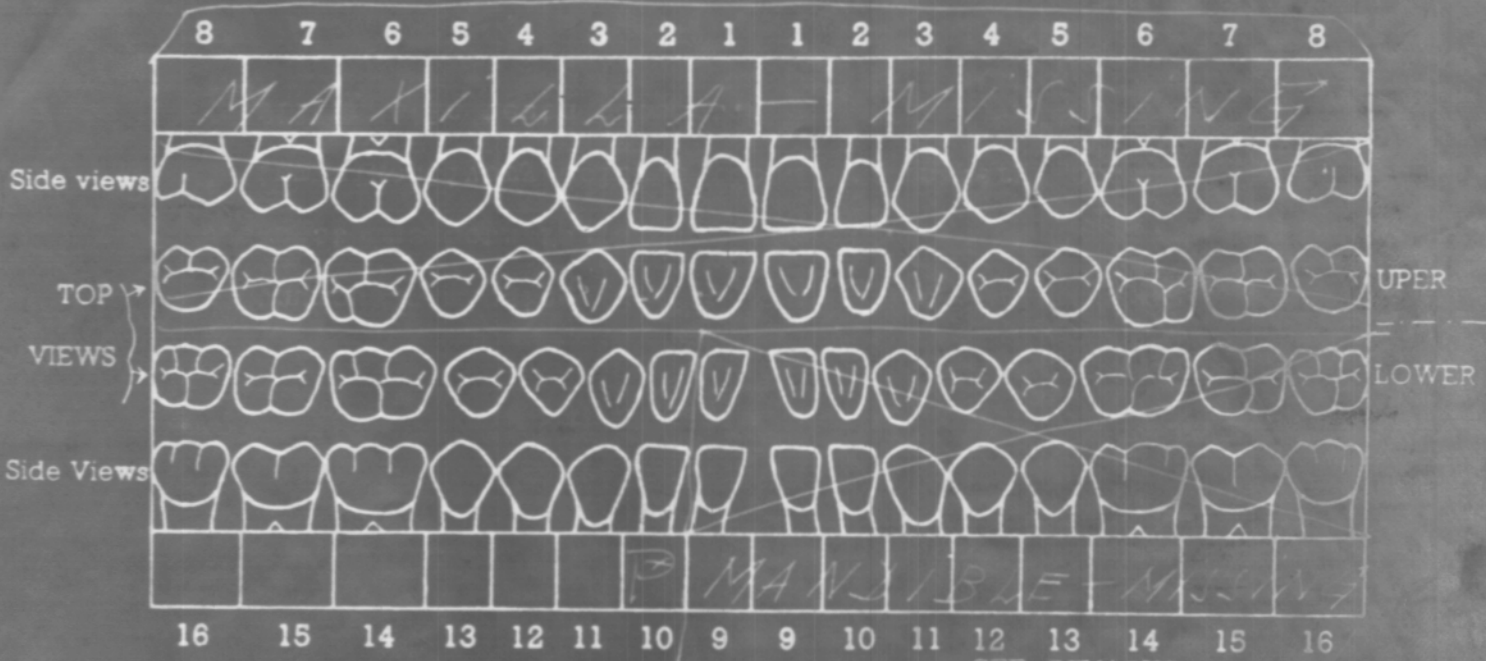

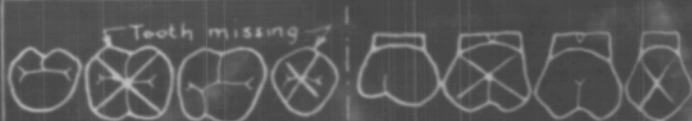
SEE REMARKS

Beginning at the middle line in both upper and lower jaws, the teeth are arranged symmetrically on either side and classed as incisors (cutting teeth), cuspids or canines (tearing teeth), bicuspids (chewing teeth), and molars (principal chewing teeth). An examination should be made and findings charted to cover the following basic conditions : Lost teeth, crowned teeth, bridge work, fillings, caries (cavities of decay), dentures (plates), and any deformity of jaws found. See reverse side for illustrations.

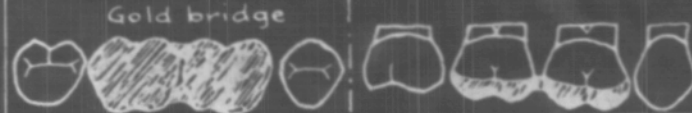


