1. This office is conducting an investigation to determine the identity of an Unknown deceased member of our Armed Forces.

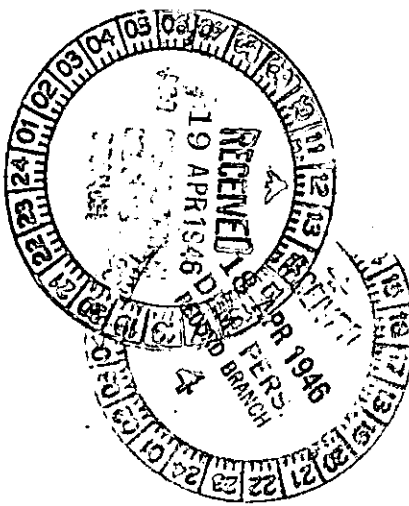

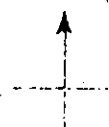

REMARKS

Case Unknown X-163 was a mass burial of two (2) men. Upon reprocessing at Subordinate Identification Point at Carentan, segregation could be made into Unknown X-163-A and Unknown X-163-B, due to size and structure in the bones.

All the clothing found, was buried with remains of Unknown X-163-A. Toothchart could not be made as no teeth were found.
