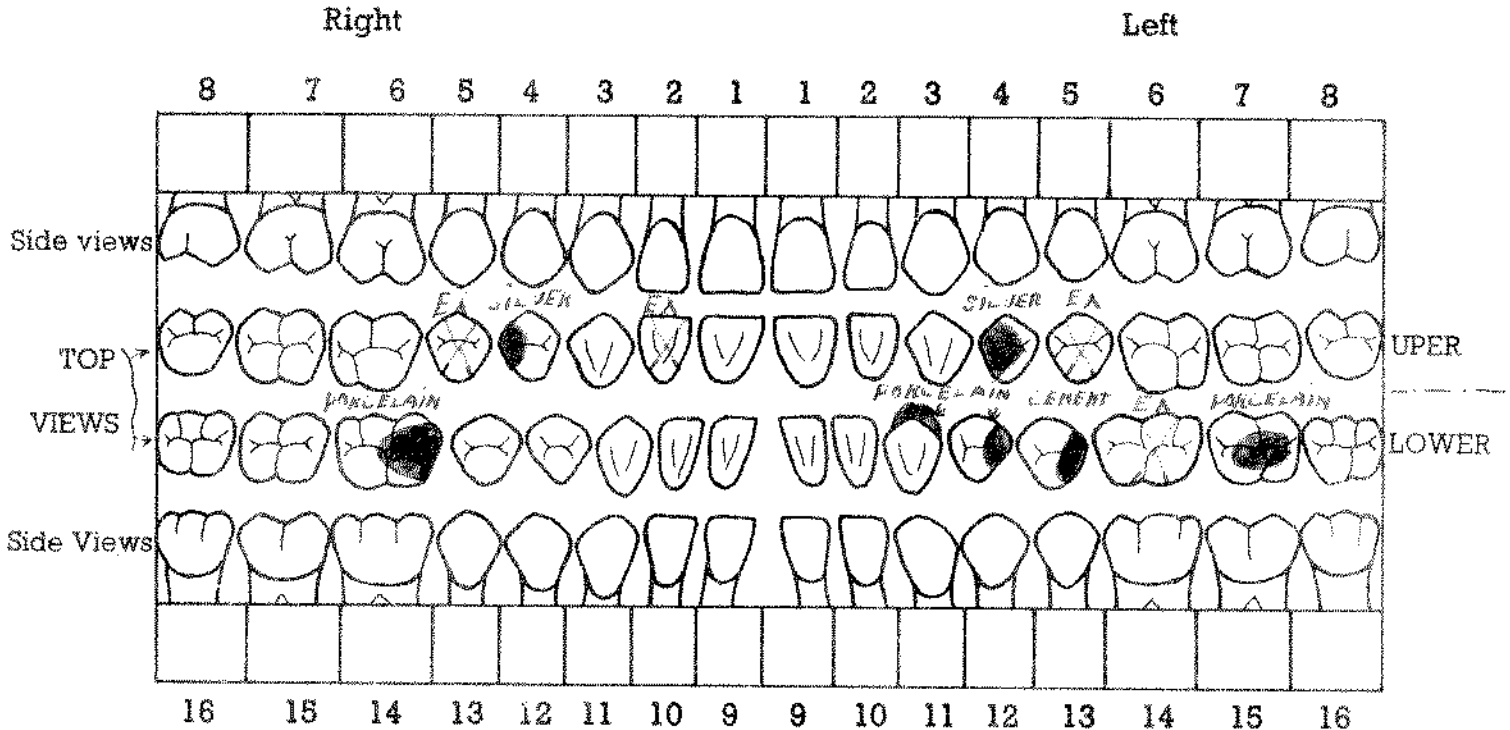

This dental chart is very important and should be filled in with great care. There are 32 teeth to be accounted for, as shown by the numbers on the chart. Beginning at the middle line in both upper and lower jaws, the teeth are arranged symmetrically on either side and classed as incisors (cutting teeth), cuspids or canines (tearing teeth), bicuspid (chewing teeth), and molars (principal chewing teeth). An examination should be made and findings charted to cover the following basic conditions: Lost teeth, crowned teeth, bridge work, fillings, caries (cavities of decay), dentures (plates), and any deformity of jaws found. See reverse side for illustrations.

CROWNED TEETH... Block in solid the crown of tooth (label gold, porcelain, Silver or gold and porcelain), thus :



BRIDGE WORK... Block in solid the crown of tooth (label gold bridge, gold and porcelain bridge), thus :



FILLINGS... Draw filling on tooth as accurately as possible (block in and label gold, silver, cement), thus :



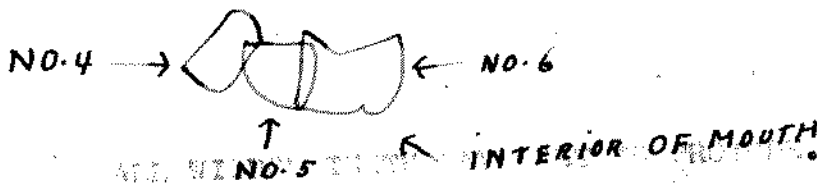
CARIES (CAVITIES). Outline location and size of cavity, shade in thus :



DENTURES (PLATES)... Draw diagram of relative size and shape of plate, block in teeth attached and indicate retaining clasps on natural teeth with the word "clasp."

THE TEETH OF THE LOWER JAW ARE LARGER THAN THOSE OF THE UPPER. NUMBER FIVE RIGHT, AND FIVE LEFT HAVE BEEN EXTRACTED BUT THE OTHERS ON THE JAW TO THE INTERIOR. FIVE RIGHT HAS BEEN EXTRACTED AND FIVE LEFT IS STILL IN PLACE TWO, IT HAS A FILLING ("G") THE FOLLOWING IS A SKETCH OF THESE DENTURES.

1. This headquarters has never received a Burial Report indicating that the remains of subject individual have been buried in an isolated grave or an established U. S. Military Cemetery in this theater. He was serving under this command when death occurred.

2. It is requested that action be taken to determine the present location of the remains and the following questions be answered:

a. IF AN ISOLATED BURIAL WAS MADE

b. IF NO ISOLATED BURIAL WAS MADE



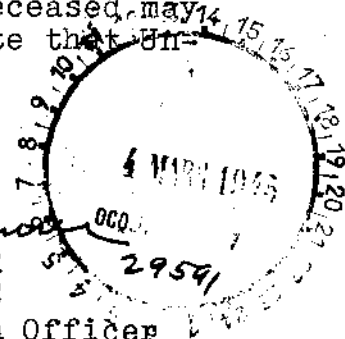

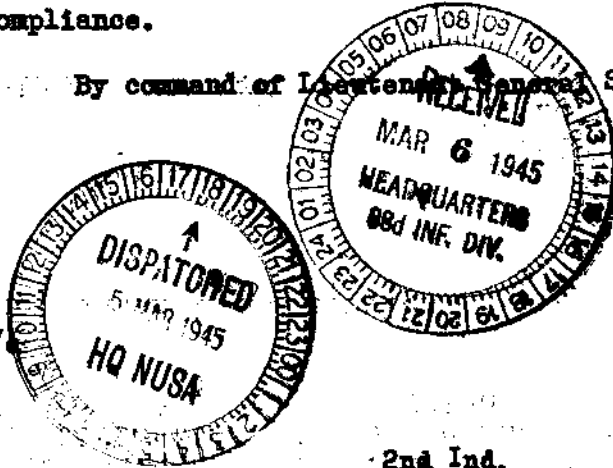

1. Attention is invited to the attached report of burial of Unknown X-38, U. S. Military Cemetery No. 1, St James, France. Fingerprints of the deceased were obtained but the Office of the Quartermaster General has advised that identity could not be established by the fingerprints.

2. A check of burials made in the cemetery on the same day as Unknown X-38 showed that three former members of the 121st Infantry Regiment were buried at exactly the same hour.

3. It is requested that a search be made to discover if the remains buried as Unknown X-38 may be those of a former member of your command who was probably reported on the same Battle Casualty Report as these three men. He may still be carried as Missing in Action, or he may have been reported deceased, but for whom no report of burial has been received. In making comparisons on the basis of the physical characteristics listed on the report of burial it is suggested that allowance be made for plausible errors in estimating height and weight.

4. Any clues, no matter how small, which may indicate the identity of the deceased, are requested.

1. An exhaustive examination of the records on file at this Headquarters revealed a total of 49 persons were Missing in Action during the entire action that the individuals referred to in Par. 2, basic communication were reported as battle casualties. The status of two of these MIA's, Pfc. John W. Kwiecinski, ASN 32508670 and Pvt. Leonard A. Galasso, ASN 31409833, remains unchanged to date. Through a process of elimination it was learned that the status of the remaining 47 MIA's was subsequently changed by proper authority. Of the MIA's whose status was changed to KIA, this Headquarters has on file a Graves Registration Form #1 or a Division Graves Registration Office Report on all except two. These two, Tec 5 Samuel S. French, ASN 32752982, and Pfc. Robert C. Harden, ASN 34762562, were considered possible "Unknown X-38's" although their KIA status was properly established by strong sworn statements. Therefore, the only possible clues to the identity of "Unknown X-38" in so far as this organization was concerned narrowed down to the four Enlisted men named above.

2. The former companies of these four men were thoroughly combed for complete, detailed descriptions by available personnel having knowledge of these men. The data furnished by the companies concerned on these men is inclosed herewith. None of the descriptions seem to agree with that indicated on inclosed Report of Burial of "Unknown X-38".

3. This Headquarters is unable to furnish any additional information relevant to the identity of "Unknown X-38".

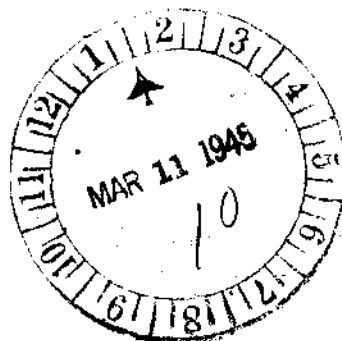

3. Regardless of any information contained on original Reports of Burial for Unknown deceased, this office is of the opinion that much valuable information can be secured by disinterment of the remains which was not recorded when the burial was first made. This assumption has been proven many times by this manner of procedure. By the same means it has been discovered that in many instances the original Report of Burial has been incorrect.
4. It is requested that the remains buried at St James American Military Cemetery as Unknown X-38 in Plot D, Row 1, Grave 2 be disinterred and carefully examined for any information that may lead to identification.

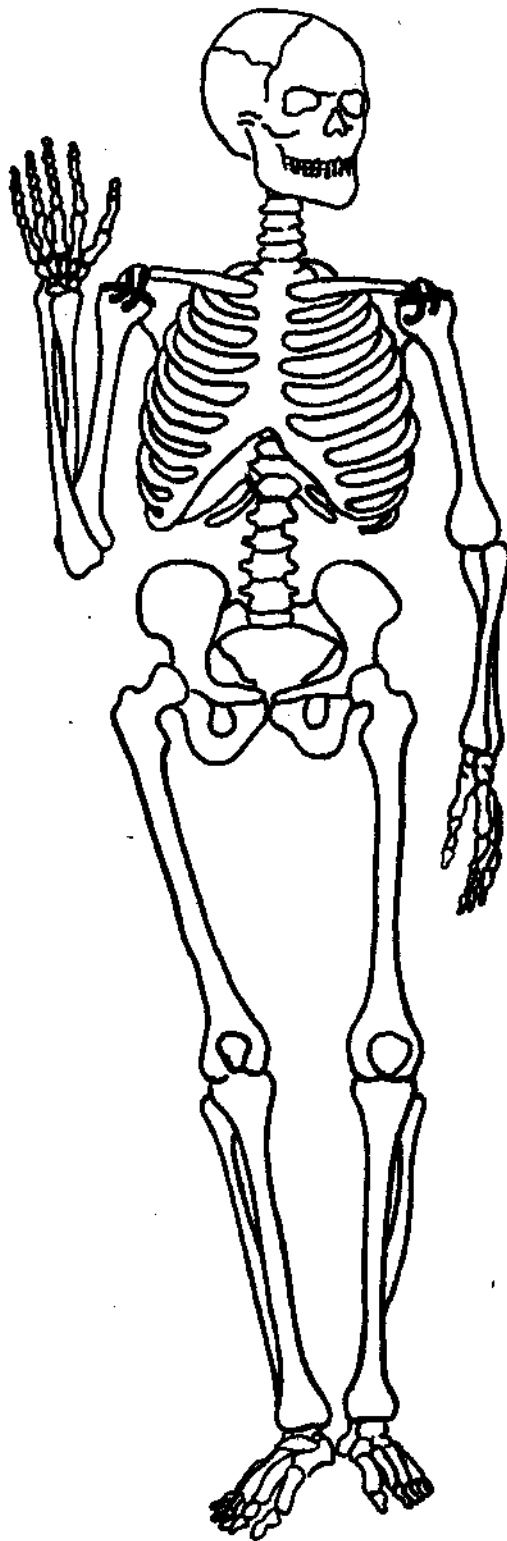

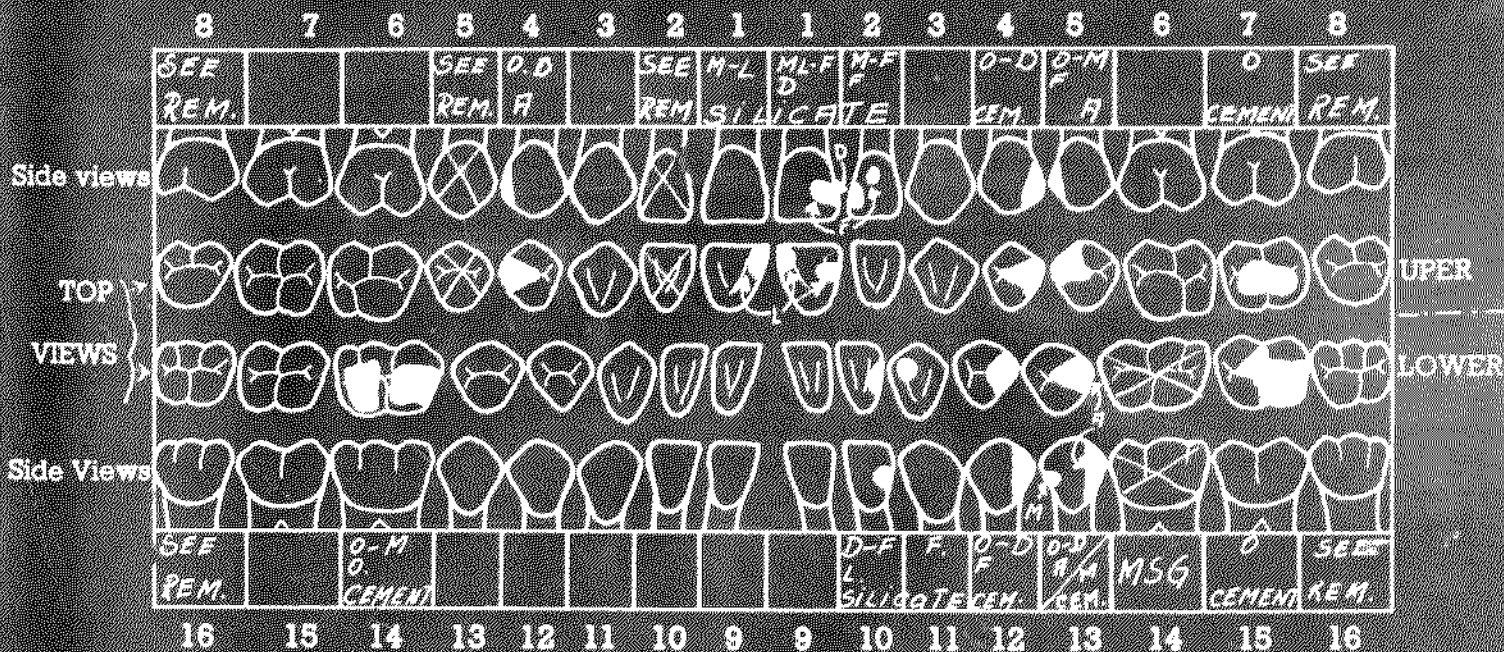

Teeth are average size and a clean white color. They are straight and well aligned. R8, L8, L16, R16 are all just starting to erupt. L14 and R2 both appear to have been extracted. The space where R2 was shows it to be a recent extraction because the bone is not completely healed over but still has a small opening where the tooth used to be. There is only one tooth between R3 and R6. This tooth appears to me to be R4 because it is exactly in line with L4 and L5 is not grown out normally but is set back in a lingual direction and is out of line with L4 and L6 about 1/4 of inch. It appears as though R-5 was probably an out grown tooth like L5, and was extracted.

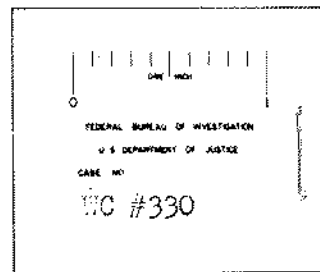

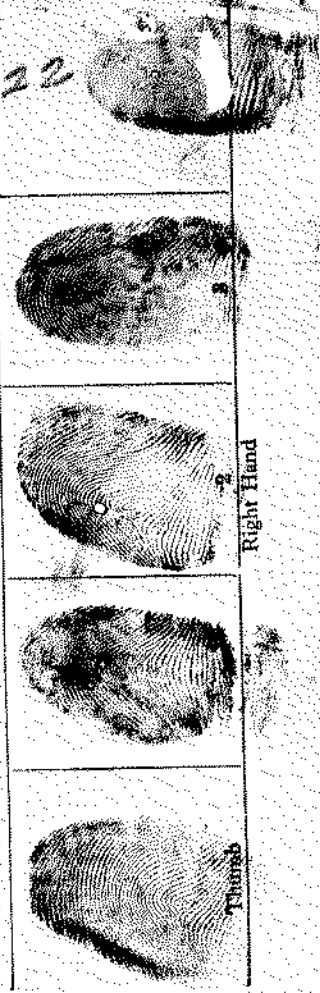
