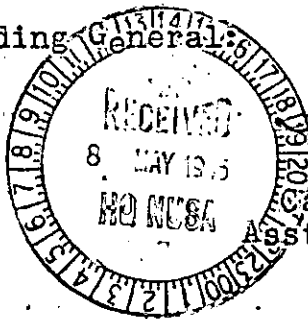
1. It is requested that a list of names, serial number and organization of all deceased patients, who were evacuated from your installation to the U. S. Military Cemetery No. 1, St James, France, between 10 and 13 August 1944, be furnished this headquarters as quickly as possible.

2. This information is required in an investigation now being conducted to identify the remains of an unidentified soldier who was buried 13 August 1944 in U. S. Military Cemetery No. 1, St. James, France, as Unknown X-44.

3. A recent examination of the remains of Unknown X-44 disclosed that the body was buried without clothing. The remains were wrapped in a bed sheet. A flesh wound was found in the left pectoral region. It was about three inches long and one-quarter inch deep and did not appear to penetrate the thoracic wall. It was covered by a dressing held in place with adhesive plaster. The cause of death could not be determined.

4. If any of the deceased personnel whose bodies were evacuated to the cemetery at St. James between 10 and 13 August 1944 were injured in the manner described above, it is requested that a diagnosis and any other information which will describe the deceased soldier be forwarded to this headquarters.

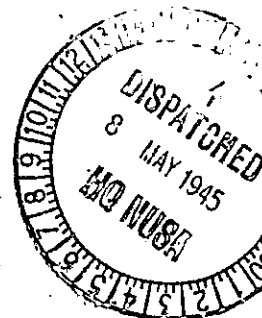

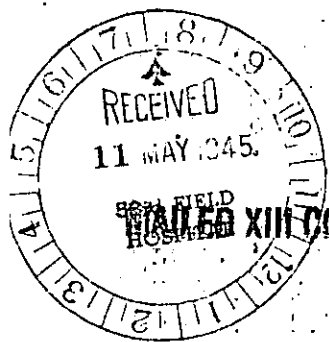

3. A recent examination of the remains of Unknown X-44 disclosed that the body was buried without clothing. The remains were wrapped in a bed sheet. SUBJECT: Request for Identification of Deceased Personnel. (Unknown X-44 St. James)

TO : Commanding General, 6th Armored Division, APO 256, US Army.

1. A letter has been received from the office of the Quartermaster General stating that it has been impossible to identify the remains buried as Unknown X-44 in U. S. Military Cemetery No. 1, St. James, France by the fingerprints.

2. Attention is directed to Inclosure No. 2 which shows the names and assignment of the men who were buried in the same row and at approximately the same hour as Unknown X-44. Twelve of the twenty-four identified deceased were assigned to the 44th Armored Infantry Battalion. Five more men assigned to other units of the 6th Armored Division are also buried in the same row. Consequently, it is believed quite possible that Unknown X-44 was a former member of your command.

3. It is desired that the following information be furnished:

a. Names of the closest towns or coordinates indicating the place where the men under your command listed on Inclosure No. 2 were killed or reported MIA.


b. Are any men who were assigned to the units under your command which are listed in Inclosure No. 2 now carried as MIA casualties from approximately the same time and place as the men listed in Inclosure No. 2?

c. Were any members of your command reported deceased at approximately the same time and in the same area as the men listed in Inclosure No. 2 for whom no report of burial has been received?

d. What is the name of the medical installation which reported the members of your command whose names are shown on Inclosure No. 2 as DOW?

If the names of any former members of your command who are now being carried in a casualty status which might link them with Unknown X-44 (St. James) can be discovered by any means other than those listed above, it is desired that they be forwarded to this headquarters.



1. Attention is invited to the preceding indorsements.

2. The attached statements of 1st Sgt Tropea and Tec 5 Woolard give no conclusive evidence and no further report can be submitted on the information.

3. There have been several persons reported as killed in around the same area as the group listed on inclosure 2, for which no report of burial has been received. This can be explained however, as at that time GRS forms were not readily furnished to the Division and our information was obtained by direct contact with the cemetery Graves Registration personnel.

4. At the time that personnel listed on inclosure 2 were killed or wounded, the 53d Field Hospital and the 32nd Evacuation Hospital were in support of the Division. Extract of A & D Reports from these hospitals were not received, therefore, information concerning the death of personnel who died of wounds at these hospitals was received only from lists obtained at the cemetery. GRS Forms for three of the six men who died of wounds were later received.

5. The men listed in inclosure 2 - of this command - were killed or wounded (and later died) in the locations listed below:

On 8 August 1944, Tec 5 Willie S. Woolard came to me and reported that Pfc Frank D. Kukuc was missing. He gave me the location where he had last seen Pfc Kukuc. I went to the field, which was the bivouac area of Company A of this Bn, located at 2½ miles Northeast of Plabennac, Brittany R1010, and discovered that the half-track near which Pfc Kukuc had last been seen had received a direct hit. There were bits of human flesh in the immediate vicinity. No one could be found who had seen Kukuc.

On 8 August 1944 Pfc Frank D. Kukuc and I were in the Battalion bivouac area located $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles northeast of Plabennac, France, Brittany R1010. We were about to gas the vehicles in the Bn area at about 1000 hours that morning. Enemy artillery started to shell the area we were in. I took cover behind a half-track, but Pfc Kukuc kept walking down the field. After the barrage lifted I tried to locate Kukuc but no one had seen him. I reported what had happened to my 1st Sergeant, Donald D. Tropea.

Private Lowell Goebel, 35301028, was a member of Company B, 44th Armored Infantry Battalion and was with the Company when we arrived in a bivouac area 2½ miles northeast of Plabennac, France Brittany R1010, on the 7th of August 1944.

On the 8th of August 1944 we were in the same bivouac area and we were getting a terrific shelling from direct fire from enemy anti-tank guns. I last saw Pvt Goebel when I checked positions of the 4th platoon. He was in his foxhole and appeared to be uninjured. I have not seen him since.

1. A letter has been received from the Office of the Quartermaster General stating that it has been impossible to identify the remains buried as Unknown X-44 in U. S. Military Cemetery No. 1, St. James, France by the fingerprints.

2. A check of the organizational assignments of the deceased who are buried in the same row shows that four former members of the 28th Infantry Regiment were buried at approximately the same time as Unknown X-44. Their names are:



3. It is requested that this headquarters be furnished a copy of the MIA report which was prepared for these men, or other information which will show where they were killed..

4. It is also requested that an inquiry be made to discover if another man from the organization to which they were assigned has been carried as a casualty since the time that they were originally reported MIA or KIA. It is possible that Unknown X-44 may be a former member of your command who was reported KIA or DOW. This has happened when members of a unit have seen and identified a deceased soldier. Appropriate Battle Casualty Reports were submitted on the basis of such information, but before the body was evacuated to the cemetery, identification was removed, and the remains had to be buried as "Unknown". For this reason it is requested that a check be made to ascertain that reports of burial are on file for all personnel reported deceased during the week prior to 13 August 1944, who were killed in approximately the same area as the four men mentioned in paragraph 2 of this indorsement.

5. Any clues which can be discovered are requested for transmittal to the Office of the Quartermaster General.
