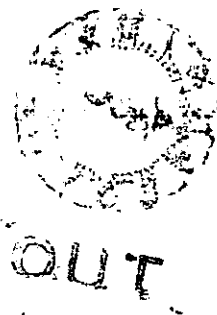

Upon processing by Subordinate Identification Point Carentan, case X-102 was found to be a mass burial of two men. Segregation was possible because the remains of the second body were found wrapped in a poncho. The two cases were designated Unknown X-102 A and X-102 B. Remnants of clothing were found on remains of case A.

The remains of case B were found wrapped in a poncho, it was the only clothing found on the remains. Teeth were found with remains of case A and apparently belong to case A.

No GRS tag or Report of Burial found.

Fluoroscopic examination negative.

As no positive identifying clues were found case remains "UNKNOWN".

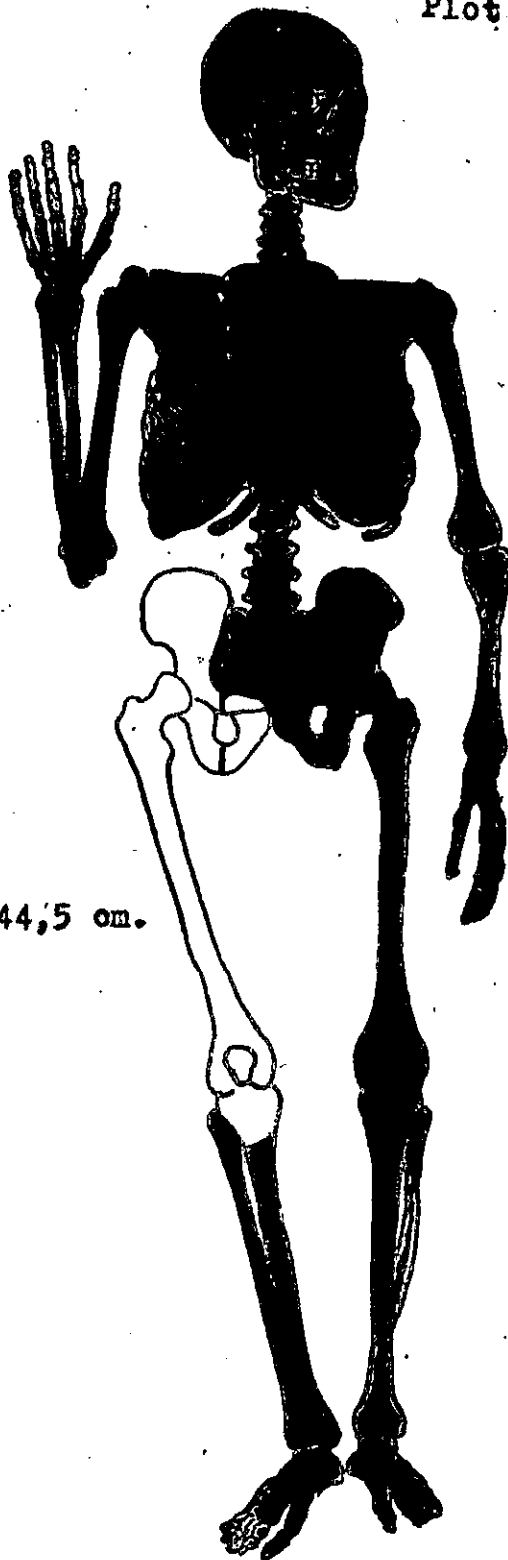

Upon processing by Subordinate Identification Point No 1 Carentan, case Unknown X-102 was found to be a mass burial of two men.

Segregation was possible because the remains of the second man were found wrapped separately in a poncho.

The two cases were designated Unknown X-102 A and Unknown X-102 B.

Remnants of clothing were found on remains of A.

The remains of case B were found wrapped in a poncho. Teeth were found with remains of case A and apparently belong to this case.


The clothing marking "B-2220" which was found on clothing at time of burial, corresponds with name and ASN of "BELLAMY, Roy E. O-702220, 2nd Lt. 492 Bomb. Gp. (H)" listed as PDD on AGRC Casualties Book.

This clothing marking was not found at time of reprocessing. However it is possible that one of the two cases (A or B) is the remains of the above mentioned deceased!



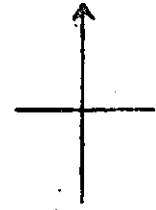
