This unknown was a "D" Day casualty at "OMAHA" beach in Normandy, 6 June 1944.

X-48 was formerly identified as Pvt Rodger D. ANDREWS, 39206290, Co "C", 37th Engineer Combat Bn. This identification was not approved by OCMG and has been re-designated unknown.

Re-investigation by this branch and Isolated Burial Branch has failed to associate an unresolved casualty with this remains.

The numerous "D" Day casualties in Normandy have been checked with negative results.

Insufficient identifying data precludes any further attempt at identification.

For the above stated reasons this unknown is declared, UNIDENTIFIABLE.

- SEE REMARKS -

This dental chart is very important and should be filled in with great care. There are 32 teeth to be accounted for, as shown by the numbers on the chart. Beginning at the middle line in both upper and lower jaws, the teeth are arranged symmetrically on either side and classed as incisors (cutting teeth), cuspids or canines (tearing teeth), bicuspids (chewing teeth), and molars (principal chewing teeth). An examination should be made and findings charted to cover the following basic conditions: Lost teeth, crowned teeth, bridge work, fillings, caries (cavities of decay), dentures (plates), and any deformity of jaws found. See reverse side for illustrations.
