NARRATIVE

In compliance with Operational Instructions No. 79, a check was made of the records of Pitie Hospital and Pantin Cemetery in an attempt to locate an unknown American who was brought dead to Pitie Military Hospital on 10 August 1944 and later buried in Pantin Cemetery, Section 47, Row 7, Grave 5.

Statements from the Pantin Cemetery caretaker and a certified copy of cemetery record are attached. Pantin cemetery caretaker states that an unknown American was brought to the Pantin Cemetery on 14 August 1944 and interred in Section 47, Row 7, Grave 4 (not in Grave 5). Grave 5 is occupied by a French civilian. This unknown American was taken to Solers US Military Cemetery on 28 August 1945.

Records of the Pitie Hospital could not give any definite information as to who this man might be. Their records only showed that an American unknown was brought there on 10 August 1944.

It is this investigator's belief that this unknown who was removed from Grave 4, Row 7, Section 47, on 28 August 1945 is the unknown referred to in the Operational Instructions No. 79.



1. Investigation at Pantin Cemetery revealed that four American deceased buried there had been disinterred and transferred to Solers on 28 August 1945. Only three of these are buried as unknowns, X-164, X-165, and X-166, and as X-164 was killed in a plane crash, it is believed this possibility can be eliminated as Pvt Trask was an infantryman.

2. As investigation at Pantin disclosed no American graves and in view of information obtained from Major Morrow, Registration Division, AGRC, that Pvt Trask had been identified by that headquarters, case will be closed without further investigation.

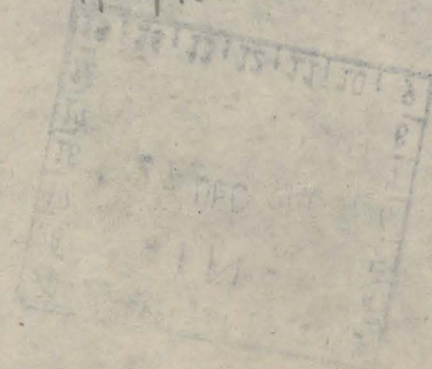

N A R R A T I V E

On 15 November 1946 I investigated the case of Pfc Anton S. Trask, buried in Pantin cemetery in Paris. The grave, row and division number given on the report did not check with any of the graves of allied dead buried in that particular cemetery. The only American deads inhumed in Pantin had been disinterred and transferred to Solers on 28 August 1945. They were the following:

Of these Americans two only: Trail and Frum, were positively identified. Trask might be identified as one of the 2 X numbers. This information was transmitted to the Registration Division, AGRC Hq, Versailles. Major Morrow has informed this office by phone that the case was closed for the operations section and that he would send a letter covering the closing of the case and informing us of the X number identified as Trask.

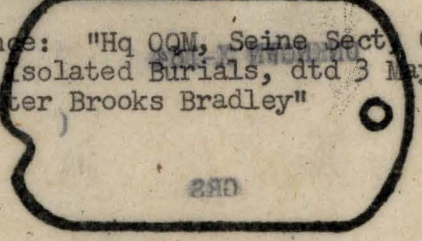
