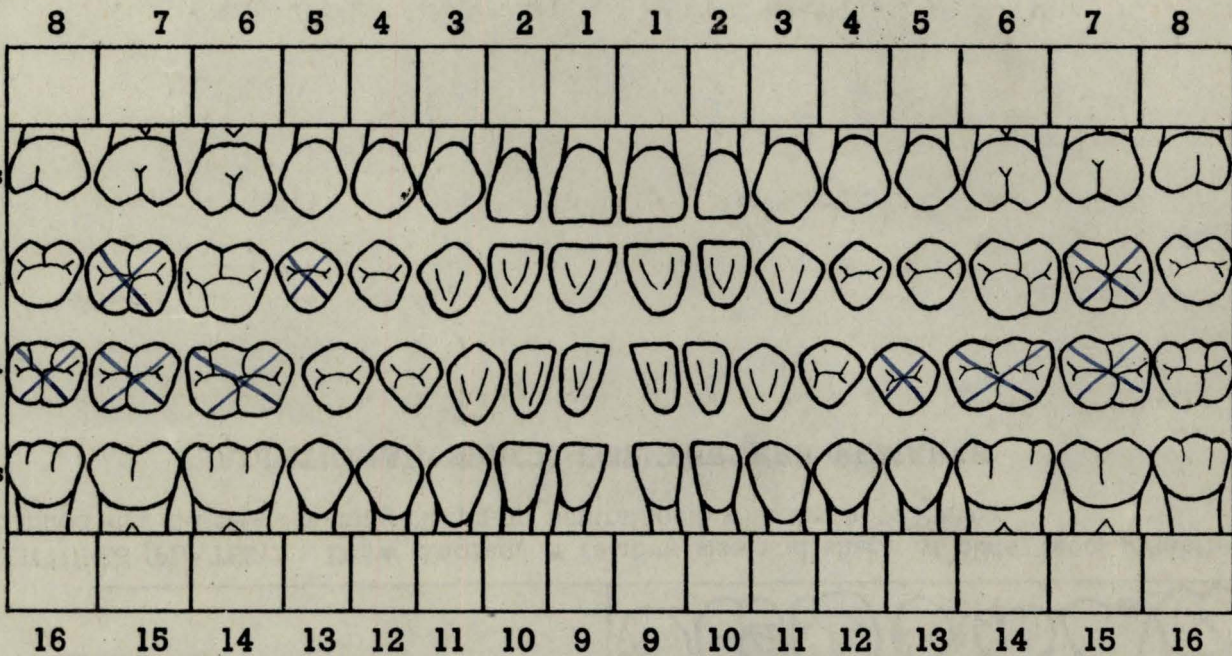

This dental chart is very important and should be filled in with great care. There are 32 teeth to be accounted for, as shown by the numbers on the chart. Beginning at the middle line in both upper and lower jaws, the teeth are arranged symmetrically on either side and classed as incisors (cutting teeth), cuspids or canines (tearing teeth), bicuspids (chewing teeth), and molars (principal chewing teeth). An examination should be made and findings charted to cover the following basic conditions: Lost teeth, crowned teeth, bridge work, fillings, caries (cavities of decay), dentures (plates), and any deformity of jaws found. It is impossible to determine accurately which two are missing because there is only one bi-cuspid on each side, on the left side the teeth seem to have shifted, on the right side the mesial side of the bi cuspid touches R-3 and the distal side touches R-6.  
L-16 is only partially erupted and probably did not show in life.  
L-12 is rotated distally about  $\frac{1}{2}$  a turn.

Spaces: 1mm between R-1 and R-2, and L-1 and L-2  
1mm between R-3 and R-4  
6mm between R-4 and R-7  
1mm between L-11 and L-12.

TO : GRS, Headquarters, Seine Section, Com Z, APO 887, US ARMY, AI  
(Attention: Capt. Bradley)

Upon arrival in Orleans on 20 March 1945, spoke with the Paul Briere, Chef de Division a la Mairie d'Orleans, H 1 Rue de Vancouleurs, Orleans. He said that he had no records or information other than the data compiled by the superintendent of the cemetery on the one hundred and sixteen American and British buried in the Grand Cemetery. At the time of the burials he requested the information from the German authorities, but was refused. The only additional information he could supply was that the men buried there had not died in Orleans, but had been brought from villages in the vicinity.

Spoke with C. Lermis, the town interpreter, and resident of Orleans for sixty years. He, too, sought information on the identity of the Americans and British buried in the cemetery, but was likewise denied information. He volunteered to speak to several of the townspeople in hopes of obtaining some information. Upon my return two days later, he informed me that he had spoken to several people in the town, but none were able to supply further information.

Marcel Lacroix, Conservateur des Cimetieres d'Orleans, Boulevard Victor Hugo, Orleans, said all of the one hundred and sixteen British and Americans buried in the cemetery had been brought there and buried by the Germans. No French were permitted to be present at the burials and the only information submitted by the Germans, was compiled and forwarded through the Mairie to your office. The Germans forbid the erection of crosses of grave-markers.

Because ten of the Americans were reputed to have been aviators shot down in the vicinity of Chateaudun, I interviewed M. Fernand Genchou, Secretary Mairie, Chateaudun; M. Adrien Poumarede, Commissioner Police, Chateaudun, and Adjutant Porchev, Gendarmiere, Chateaudun. All three had recalled Americans having been shot down in the vicinity of the town in the early part of 1944, but at no time were they, or any French civilians, permitted near the crashed planes or bodies. No information had ever been furnished their offices by the German authorities.

Upon seeking additional information on the burials at Orleans, in the neighboring towns, the presence of other American and English bodies was discovered. In the village of Boulay, two Americans and three British are buried in the French cemetery. The village has been completely abandoned because of its proximity to an airfield and the Mairie had been moved to Gidy. The mayor of the town had no records and knew nothing of the burials. The only information obtained was furnished by M. Rene Piau, Superintendent of Boulay Cemetery at the time of the interments, (of Les Barres Loiret). The three British graves are marked by German-made crosses which contain the following inscriptions:

1. P.O. Shepherd, 31. VII 43 Mosquito.
2. Unbekant, 31. VII 43 Mosquito
3. F.O.E.E. Pudsey, 15 XI 43 Mosquito.



The American graves contain crosses, but there are no identification tags attached or no inscriptions present. M. Piau supplied the following information: The Germans informed him that one of the graves contained the body of Lt. R. Ryan, an American aviator, who parachuted from his plane and was killed at 0800 on 8 April 1944. He had been buried in a casket on 9 April 1944. The other American, an unknown, was buried without a casket because the Germans believed him to be of Jewish faith. He, too, was an aviator who crashed near Boulay either late in March or early in April. The grave indicated as being Lt. Ryan's is the northernmore of the two. (See attached sketch of location of grave sites.)

In the village of St. Peravy, six Americans are interred. The bodies were brought to the cemetery by the Germans and the following information given to M. Joseph Chou, Superintendent of the cemetery. He retained no records, nor submitted none to the GRS. The information obtained he had placed on the crosses which mark the six graves:

- William M White 0-6931411
- James I Picard 31135117
- Elmer J Neis 37280296
- Lynn T Cameron 17040903
- Howard R Hartley 0-731577
- Charles F Waddell 0-760111

The following is hereby submitted for your consideration and approval:

1. Because of the absence of identification tags, gravemarkers and more substantial and accurate information surrounding the deaths and burials, investigator recommends tooth charts be made on all bodies buried at Orleans as well as on the two Americans and the one British unknown buried at Boulay. Because it appears that a preponderance of these deaths were resultant of air crashes, tooth charts may be impossible in many instances.

2. Civilians disinter the bodies, at a rate commensurate with the medical technicians' ability to process them, i.e. ten or twelve per day.

3. Two medical technicians be dispatched from this organization for processing and supervising the work. Recommend that they be placed on special duty for a three week period and arrangements be made for quarters and rations for these two in addition to a driver, assistant driver and one helper.

4. This organization will erect a pyramidal tent for the processing of the bodies.

5. Suggest, further, that a 2 1/2 ton 6X6 be used for the transportation of the bodies, that the driver leave Orleans for Solers early each morning with the processed bodies, and return the same day, spending the night at Orleans.
