1. There is returned herewith a carbon copy of your list of 8 November 1950 requesting the current status of disposition of seven cases. Following is a listing status of the cases:

RANGEL, Fernando B., 38457458. - Tentative identification has been made and will be presented to the board for approval. We will advise you of the outcome at a later date.

SIMPSON, Jack A., 13189669. - Case is still being flagged as an identification discrepancy. As you were advised in our memorandum of 10 August 1950, if identification is confirmed, remains will be returned to the United States in accordance with instructions which this Office has received from the next of kin.

X-1047 A (Temp 3574 M - 2 - 1743). On 30 March 1949 these remains were interred permanently in Plot F, Row 9, Grave 23, St. Avoird Cemetery. Duplicate copy of DD attached.

X-6414 (Temp 3574 4B - 7 - 84). Remains have been associated with a group burial, which includes the remains of Second Lieutenants Kenneth D. Petty, Richard J. Higgins, Staff Sergeants Thomas C. Elder, Robert H. Davis and Sergeant Myrel R. Shenk. This group of remains has been returned to the United States for burial in the Zachary Taylor National Cemetery. It is to be noted that X-6414 was disinterred on 10 March 1950 from Plot F, Row 9, Grave 23, St. Avoird.

1. Reference is made to Burial Reports for Unknowns X-183, X-1047 A & B, St. Avold, France.

2. These Unknowns may be associated with Willard R. Best, 36478227; Steve Nagy, O-815531; John F. McTigue, O-817058 and Wilbur A. Wulfeck, 35872306, the four (4) unresolved casualties of A/C 42-3177, for the following reasons:

a. The remains were recovered from Lindenthal Cemetery, close to the crash site of A/C 42-3177.

b. One (1) identified crew member, Daniel P. Giove, O-765649, was disinterred from Lindenthal Cemetery by S/Sgt. Bradford, who also recovered X-183 and X-1047 A & B.

c. X-1047 was originally identified as Willard R. Best by S/Sgt. Bradford.

d. Enemy records disclose the interment of casualties of A/C 42-3177 in Lindenthal-Leipzig Cemetery.

3. In view of the associations suggested above and the fact that the four (4) casualties in question are listed on the deferred search roster, all action on Non Recoverable Findings for these deceased is suspended pending further investigation of X-183, X-1047 A & B and possible additional recoveries from the Soviet-occupied area of Leipzig-Lindenthal.

U.S. MILITARY CEMETERY

(Location)

A thorough investigation has been conducted in an effort to associate the remains of Unknowns X-1047 A & B, recovered from Lindenthal, Germany (N-52/E-22) with an unresolved casualty or casualties however, the condition of the remains prevented an association by physical or dental records comparison.

The estimated height of X-1047 A, obtained solely by the measurement of the left femur (fractured) and the two teeth present, common to both remains, cannot be considered as conclusive to aid in the establishment of an identification.

Unknowns X-1047 A & B, could possibly be associated with casualty crew members of A/C 42-31771 as the subject unknowns were originally disinterred as BEST, Willard P., an unresolved casualty crew member of subject aircraft, however, there is insufficient data with the remains and case papers for a positive identification.

In view of the negative results of the investigation mentioned above, it is recommended that X-1047 A & B be declared Unidentifiable.
