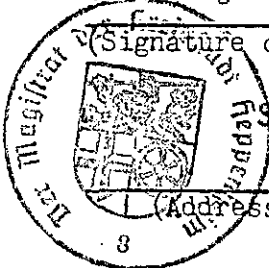

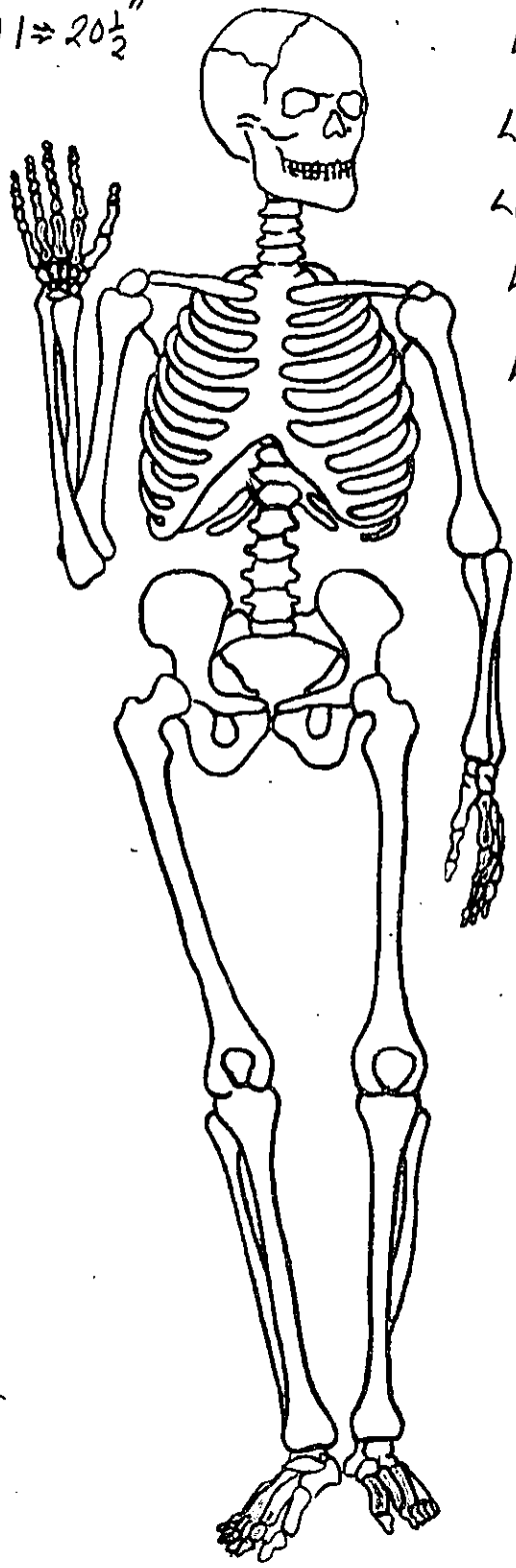

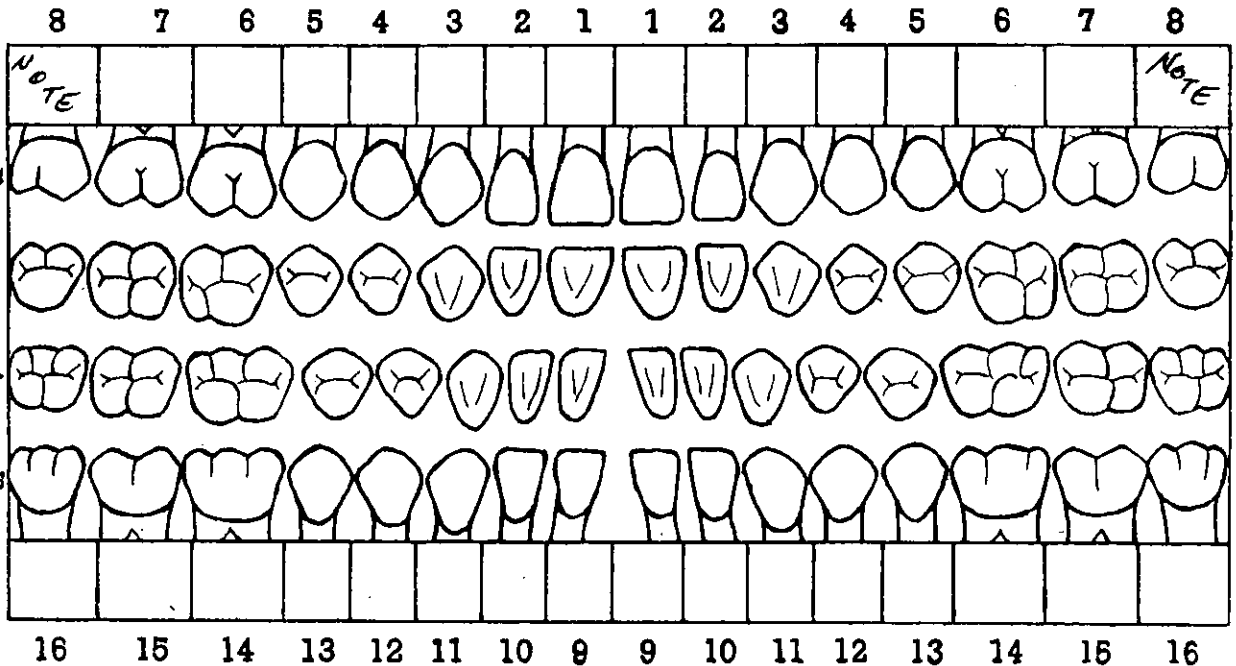

This dental chart is very important and should be filled in with great care. There are 32 teeth to be accounted for, as shown by the numbers on the chart. Beginning at the middle line in both upper and lower jaws, the teeth are arranged symmetrically on either side and classed as incisors (cutting teeth), cuspids or canines (tearing teeth), bicuspids (chewing teeth), and molars (principal chewing teeth). An examination should be made and findings charted to cover the following basic conditions: Lost teeth, crowned teeth, bridge work, fillings, caries (cavities of decay), dentures (plates), and any deformity of jaws found. The remains now designated Unknown X-1096 (USMG Saint Avold) were recovered from the vicinity of Heppenheim, Germany. These remains were originally thought to be those of Pvt Paul E. ESTILL, Jr., 13148251 but the fingerprints on Report of Burial do not correspond with those of Pvt Estill. Fingerprints were also compared against casualties known to have been interred in cemetery from which these remains were recovered also without results. Several attempts have been made to identify this Unknown through the use of fingerprints without results. Tooth chart and physical characteristics of X-1096 have been compared against unresolved casualties in the area from which these remains were recovered also without results. In view of this these remains are being declared UNIDENTIFIABLE.
