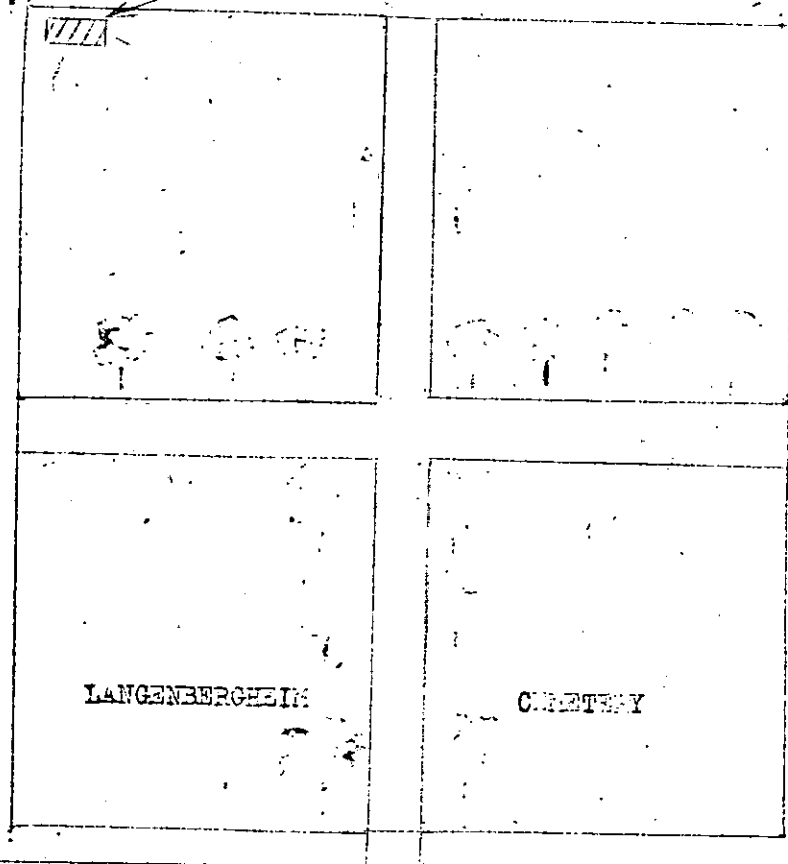
STATEMENT TRANSLATION

On October 14th 1943 an American plane was shot down by a German fighter during a battle in the air. The plane exploded in the air and burned falling down. The crash happened about at 15 o'clock hours. I suppose it was one of the planes directed to Schweinfurth. It was a four-motored bomber. The formation in which the plane was shot consisted in about 20 planes. The caretaker buried the body. Four or five men of the crew parachuted before the plane crashed. The body was found with a wound in its chest probably caused by the impact on a tree. One arm and one leg was badly mangled. The place, where the body was found, is in the wood, 2 km western of Langenbergheim.








This dental chart is very important and should be filled in with great care. There are 32 teeth to be accounted for, as shown by the numbers on the chart. Beginning at the middle line in both upper and lower jaws, the teeth are arranged symmetrically on either side and classed as incisors (cutting teeth), cuspids or canines (tearing teeth), bicuspids (chewing teeth), and molars (principal chewing teeth). An examination should be made and findings charted to cover the following basic conditions: Lost teeth, crowned teeth, bridge work, fillings, caries (cavities of decay), dentures (plates), and any deformity of jaws found. However reprocessing of X-1660 revealed that no association could be made because the tooth chart for X-1660 compared negatively with the unresolved casualty crew members of A/C 42-37720.

Tooth chart for X-1660 was also compared with dental records for all unresolved casualties in Map Sheet L-51 with negative results.

Efforts to associate subject unknown with an unresolved casualty or casualties by all other means have proven negative.

In view of the negative results of the investigation mentioned above, it is recommended that this case be declared UNIDENTIFIABLE.

The crash of the Bomber happened on October 14th 43 in the afternoon and the burial took place on October 18th 1943. I buried the body by order of the Bürgermeister's office. The body was strong and tall with dark hair. One arm and one leg was badly injured and I got the impression, that all bones were broken because of the form of the body.
