2. All available dental information for the subject ten (10) deceased have been compared with tooth charts obtained for the six (6) remains recovered from Gertrauden Cemetery, Halle, Germany as yet unidentified, and no definite association could be established.

3. Check List for the reprocessing of the Unknown remains referred to in paragraph 3, basic communication have been forwarded your office under transmittal letter #4217 dated 12 August 1949.

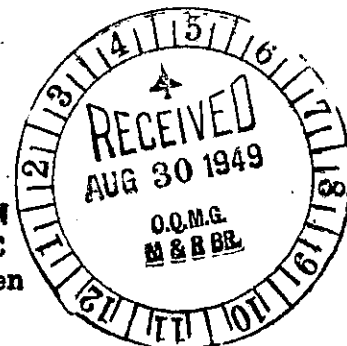
4. Attention is further invited to the fact that Unknown X-190 (St. Avold) is believed to be a member of the British Armed Forces as British Army type clothing were found with subject remains during reprocessing (see attached letter to Air Ministry signed by F/Lt. H.J. Prior).

5. In view of the unsuccessful efforts to conclusively associate any of the subject ten (10) deceased with the remains of Unknowns X-175, X-7384, X-7391, X-7428, USMC St. Avold, France, and Unknown X-5913, USMC Neuville-en-Condroz, Belgium, the subject Unknowns are being classified as Unidentifiable at the present time by this Headquarters.

1. Reference is made to Burial Reports for Unknowns X-175, 190, X-7384, X-7391 and X-7428 USMC St. Avoild, France and X-5913 USMC Neuville-en-Condroz, Belgium. These are the only remains recovered from Gertrauden Cemetery, Halle, Germany as yet unidentified, or for whom a tentative association does not exist.

2. Previous investigation has resulted in the tentative association of all known dead resulting from the Halle bombing, with the exception of the following seven (7) men:

CASE      HISTORY

Remains of X-190 were disinterred from Halle, Germany and buried in USMC St. Avold, Plot M, Row 7, Grave 1812, on 8 July 1945. A Stalag tag, IV B 221822, was found on the body of X-190.

Remarks on the reprocessed check list dated 29 October 1946 reads in part, "Clothing does not indicate American - We believe him to be of British nationality".

RAF Liaison Officer, Hdqs, AGRC, ETA, communicated with the Air Ministry and War Office. ~~and~~ a search of their records failed to reveal any information pertaining to an R. A. F. or British Army casualty with POW # Stalag IV B 221822.

The tooth chart of X-190 has been compared with available dental information for the ten (10) remaining unaccounted for American deceased reported buried in Halle, Germany, with negative results.

In view of the fact that the remains of X-190 cannot be definitely linked with an "Unknown English" by the British authorities and as no American casualty can be associated with the subject remains, this case is being classified as UNIDENTIFIABLE at the present time.

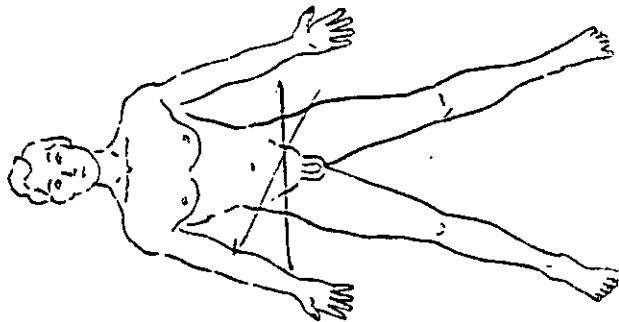

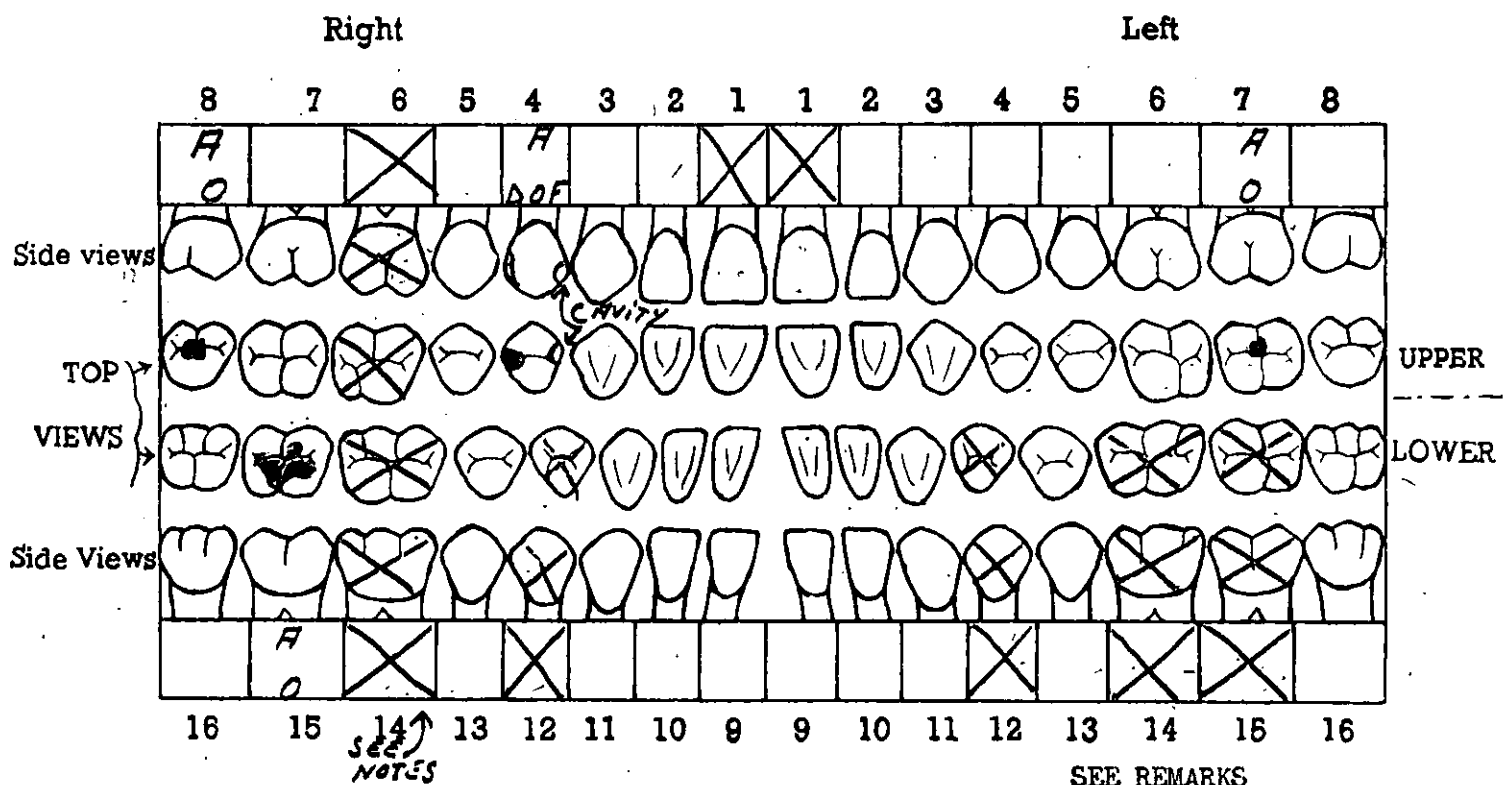

This dental chart is very important and should be filled in with great care. There are 32 teeth to be accounted for, as shown by the numbers on the chart. Beginning at the middle line in both upper and lower jaws, the teeth are arranged symmetrically on either side and classed as incisors (cutting teeth), cuspids or canines (tearing teeth), bicuspid (chewing teeth), and molars (principal chewing teeth).
