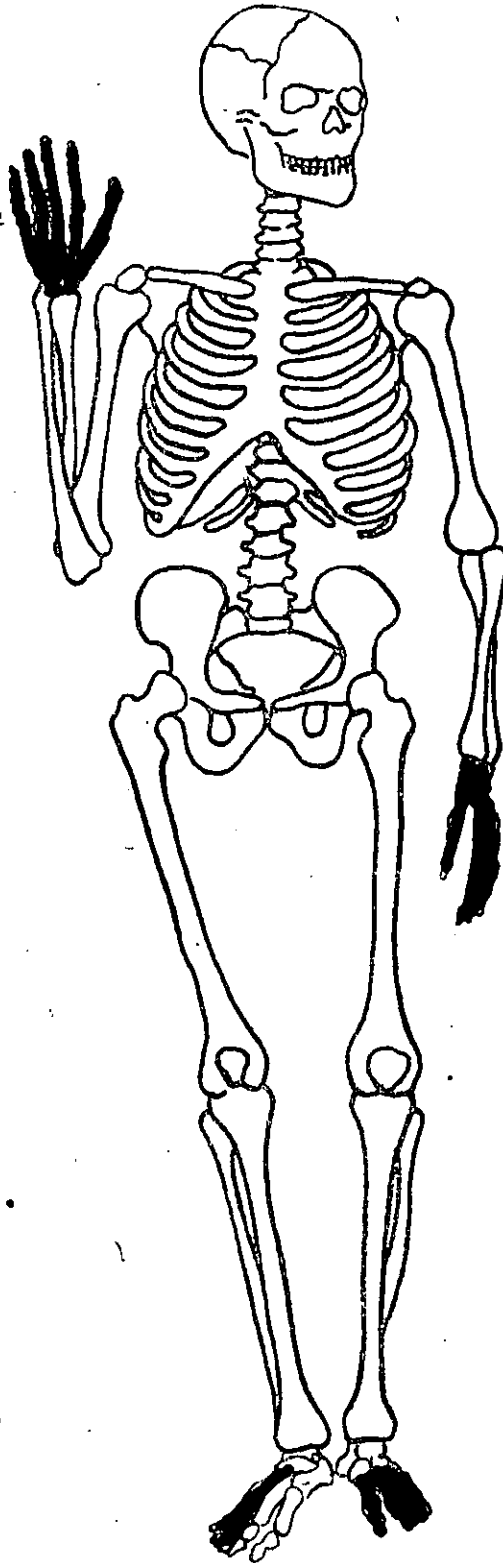

The dead body wore, besides the trousers the boots and the black stockings a German belt, with a brown Belgium pistol holster, without a pistol. At his right arm the man had a wrist watch, round his neck a silver chain with the locket of Sant Mary, in the right pocket of the trousers German coins, in the left pocket of his trousers a pruning shears, a knife, a bronze and a silver chain for woman,

The Commander and Dr. Schneider of Engelhartzell looked at the man, who had wounds at his nose, his eyelids, at the frontside of his neck and at the left collarbone. The corpse was a man of the white race.

The Commander ordered the corpse to be brought into the corpses-room of the churchyard in Engelhartzell.

The corpse is already very decayed.
