2. Investigation in the area concerning the deceased proved negative; however, eleven (11) knowns and thirteen (13) unknown U.S. soldiers had been buried at FRAULAUTERN and fourteen (14) known and eight (8) unknown U.S. soldiers had been buried at RODEN.

3. It is possible that the deceased may be associated with the above unknowns recovered from this area.

An investigation was conducted at Fraulautern and vicinity in an effort to locate the remains of HEIN, HENRY M., Pvt., 38 677 838 .

I first contacted the Burgermeister of Fraulautern. This town is a suburb of Saarlautern. I obtained an Extract from the Death Register there. Eleven (11) known and thirteen (13) unknown American soldiers had been buried in Fraulautern. They have previously been evacuated to St. Avold by an American command. No soldier by the name of HEIN, HENRY M. is listed among the Knowns. ( See Exhibit "A" ).

I then proceeded to Roden , which is also a suburb of Saarlautern. I obtained a statement from the Burgermeister there. Fourteen (14) known and eight (8) unknown American soldiers were found and evacuated from the Roden district. HEIN, HENRY M. is not listed among the Knowns. No more American graves are located in the Roden district at present. (See Exhibits " B ", "C" and "D" ).

I then went to Saarlautern and obtained a statement from the Town Architect. He stated that no American soldier by the name of HEIN, HENRY M. is listed in the Records there. At present no more American graves are located in the town district of Saarlautern. (See Exhibit "E" ).

CONCLUSION:

According to the foregoing investigation I believe, that the possibility exists that HEIN, HENRY M. was among the Unknowns disinterred and evacuated from Fraulautern or Roden.
