This dental chart is very important and should be filled in with great care. There are 32 teeth to be accounted for, as shown by the numbers on the chart. Beginning at the middle line in both upper and lower jaws, the teeth are arranged symmetrically on either side and classed as incisors (cutting teeth), cuspids or canines (tearing teeth), bacuspids (chewing teeth), and molars (principal chewing teeth). An examination should be made and findings charted to cover the following basic conditions: Lost teeth, crowned teeth, bridge work, fillings, caries (cavities of decay), dentures (plates), and any deformity of jaws found. See reverse side for illustrations.

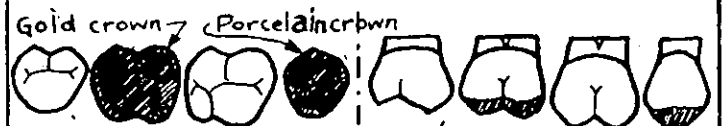

TO Commanding General, 90th Inf Div, APO 90, U. S. Army.

1. This headquarters has never received a Burial Report indicating that the remains of subject individual have been buried in an isolated grave or an established U. S. Military Cemetery in this theater.

b. IF NO ISOLATED BURIAL WAS MADE

1. Where did death occur? Give the exact location on an overlay or sketch, coordinates, map series used and permanent landmarks.
2. Furnish the names of any other men killed in that vicinity.
3. What exterior wounds were noticeable? If the remains were not intact, list the missing members of the body. Were the remains burned? If they were completely consumed by fire, witnesses should furnish certificates describing the circumstances.
4. Furnish all available information concerning the evacuation of the remains, including disposition and the names of other deceased evacuated at the same time.
5. If killed in a vehicle furnish the WD Serial No., type of vehicle and a list of the occupants and their present status.
6. If the deceased's remains were not completely consumed by fire, his friends and the Supply Sgt of his organization should furnish from records, or from memory, his approximate height, weight, color of eyes and hair, his shirt, pants, undershirt, shorts and shoe sizes, religion, and unusual items such as jewelry worn, tattoos and dentures, which might help to establish his remains as one of the unknowns buried in U. S. Cemeteries.

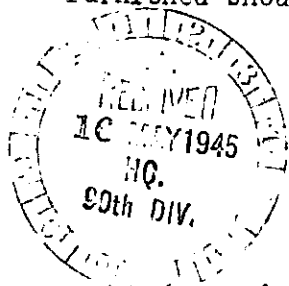
