I, the undersigned, MASSON Elisabeth, living 14 Route de Metz, in Talange, declare the following :

On the 7th of September 1944, I was hidden in the cellar of my house, it was about 6 O'clock p.m. when I saw an American tank on fire, hit by a german shell. This tank was approximately 500 meters from my house.

American soldiers belonging to the same military unit as the tank unit, told me that 3 occupants of the tank escaped but believed that the 4th was killed.

Those 3 tankers having been removed by a rescue squad.

As far as I know, nobody took anything from the tank since the accident.

No casualties could be found from this company, although there are still casualties from Companies "A" and "D".

Association of X-6010 with T/5 Randall KLINGER, 33162614 has been checked with negative results. According to eye-witness statements the tank that T/5 KLINGER was driving was knocked out and did not burn. The condition of the remains of X-6010 are definitely charred and burned.

In view of the above, X-6010 is declared UNIDENTIFIABLE.

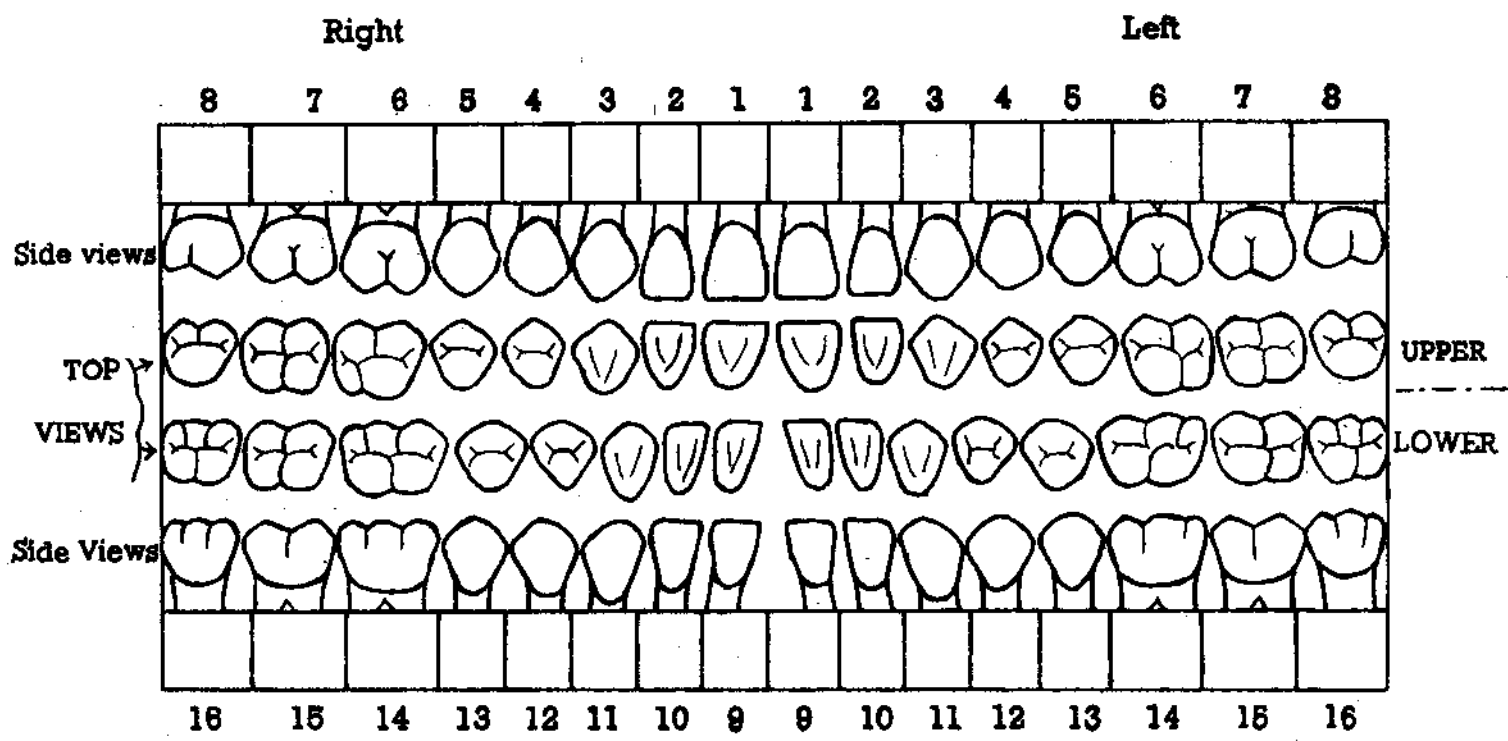

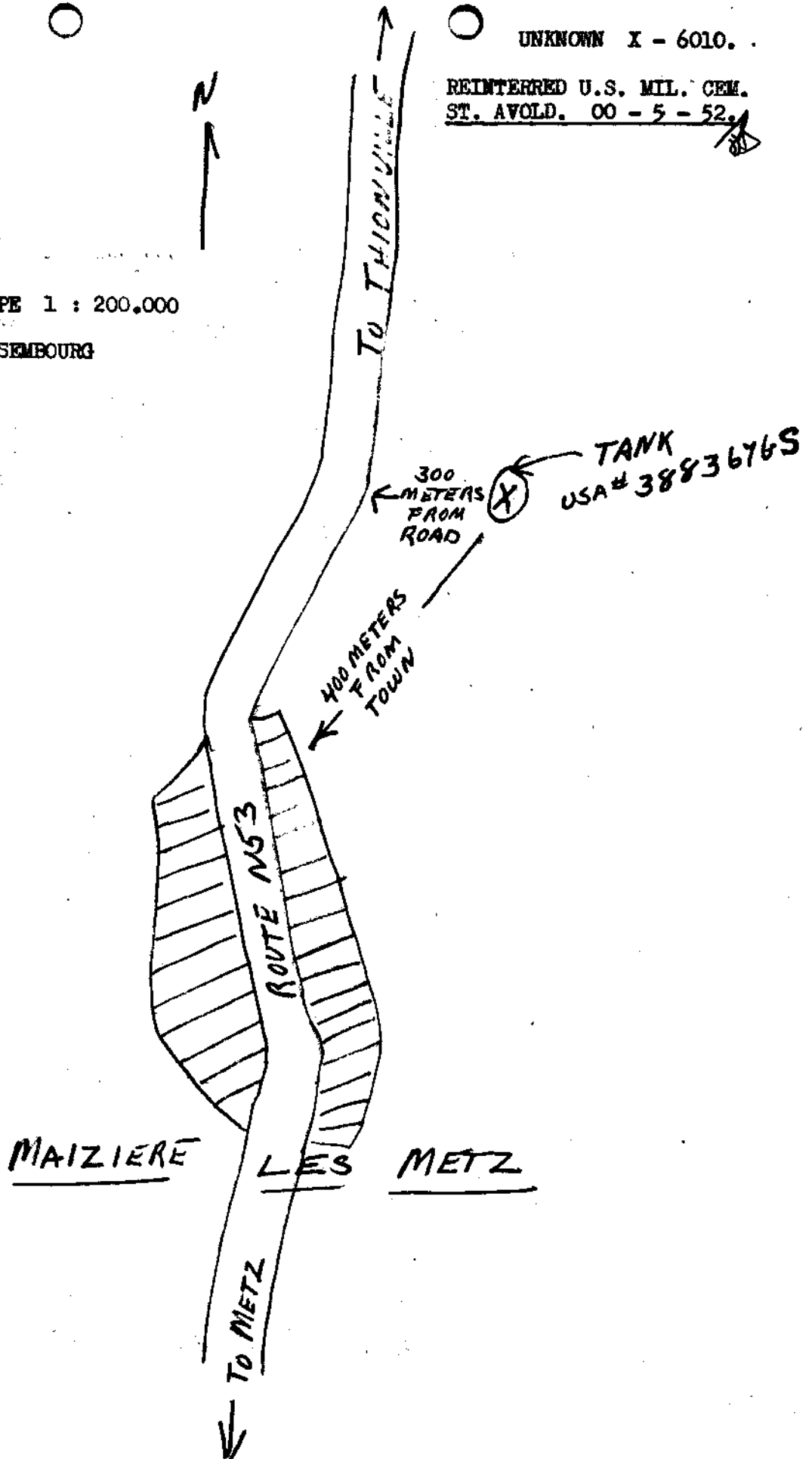

We found that there was a tank knocked out just outside of town USA #3883676-s which believe is the tank in which T/5 Klinger was killed. We examined the tank and found the charred remains of a body, which we believe to be that of the missing soldier. Statements were taken from the civilians who knew anything about the action (see attached). Everything agrees with the information contained in the CGP.
