CASE HISTORY

Unknown X-6068

USMC St Avold, France

The remains of Unknown X-6068, were recovered from the forest of Reipertsweiler, France.

A check of all unresolved casualties reported missing in this area revealed a similarity of tooth chart obtained for X-6068, with dental data for Pfc John W. GORDON, 36 626 898. Dental data for all other unresolved casualties in this area check negatively with tooth chart for X-6068.

Estimated height and age, and color of hair for X-6068, compare favorably with recorded data for Pfc Gordon.

Pfc Gordon was a member of the 157th Inf Regt which was in action in Reipertsweiler forest in January 1945. Numerous identified members of this organization have been recovered from the same area as X-6068.

It is the belief of this investigator, that the remains of X-6068 represents the remains of Pfc Gordon, however, recommendation of Un-identifiability is submitted because of the circumstances set forth in the following paragraphs.

Tooth chart dated 17 April 1946 (copy attached) has points of similarity with data for Pfc Gordon, however, there is a minor discrepancy (R-3) which may be the result of an oversight, and the dental data is insufficient for a complete comparison with the numerous points shown on the tooth chart. Examination of Xrays of L-5, L-7, and R-14, recorded on MD Form 79, might reveal additional points for comparison with tooth chart of X-6068.

Tooth chart dated 25 August 1950 (copy attached with complete processing report of same date), has points of similarity with data for Pfc Gordon, and is definitely not contradictory. However, since many of the teeth are no longer present, this tooth chart can hardly be used as a positive point of identification, particularly in view of the attitude of the next of kin.

Letter from OCMG dated 19 April 1950, contained the following: "No civilian dental information is available" - - "Mother of Pfc Gordon further indicated that the family did not wish to be disturbed again until positive proof of recovery of the remains had been established".

As a point of information the case of Pfc Gordon was submitted as non-recoverable under Transmittal Letter # 6048, dated 30 November 1950.

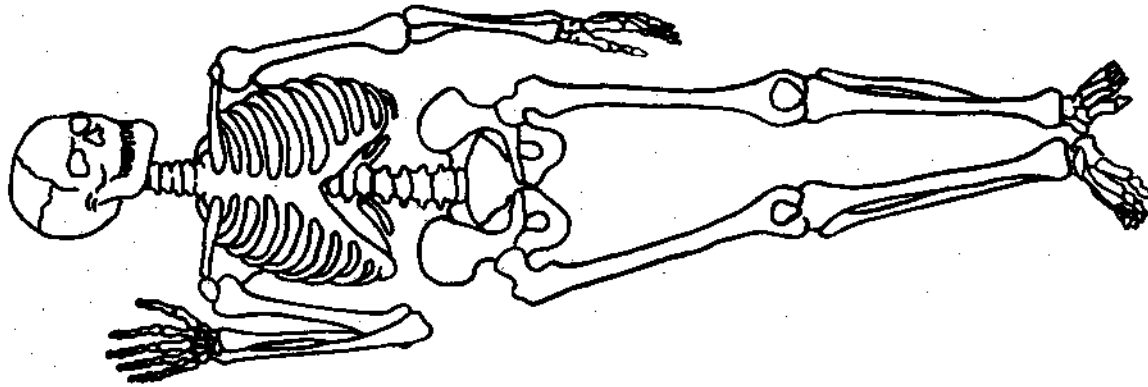
In view of the circumstances related above, this investigator recommends that Unknown X-6068 be declared Unidentifiable.

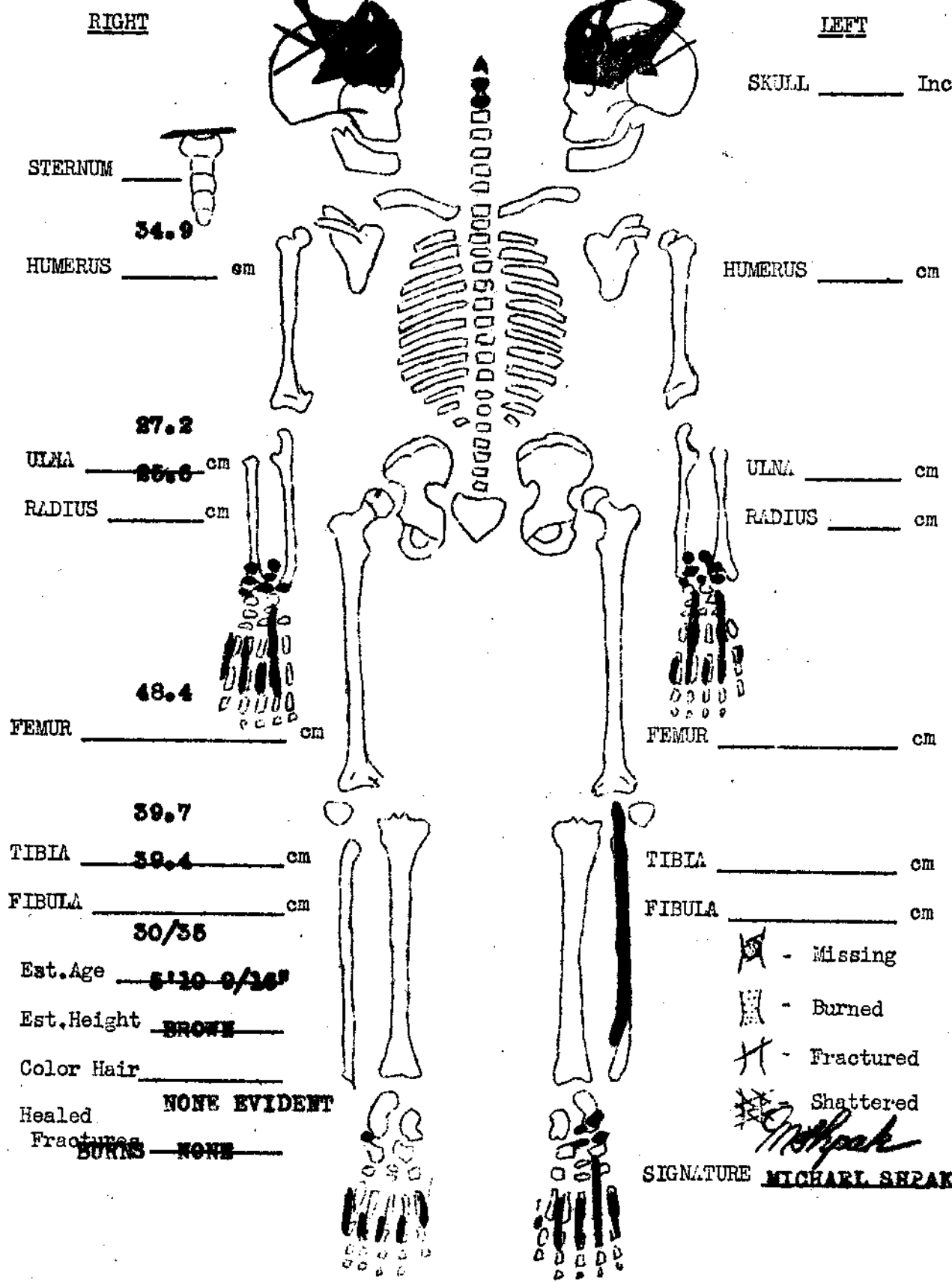

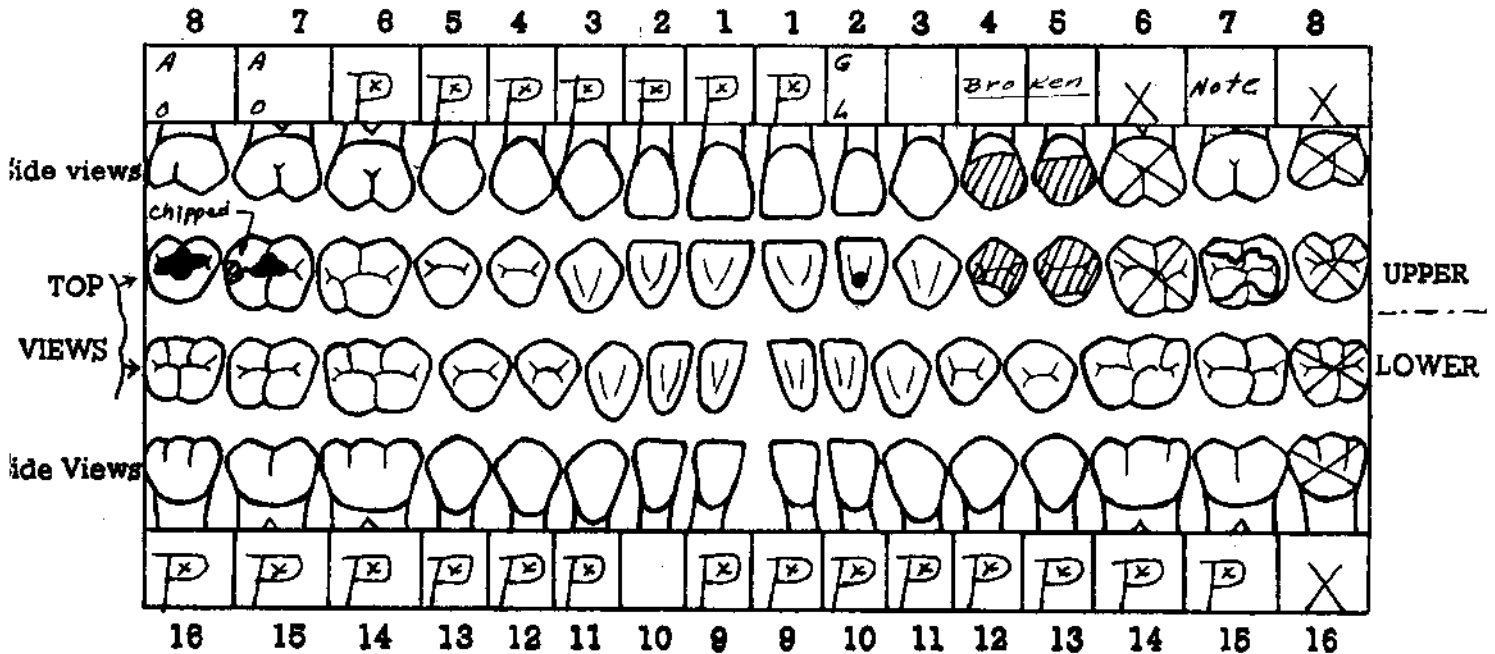



The remains Unknown X-6068 was reprocessed with an effort to establish association with GORDON.

The reprocessing reveals that articulation is not possible between the mandible and the skull and between the skull and the vertebral column due to missing skeletal parts. However, the remains are homogeneous. The teeth are not contradictory for GORDON and the occlusion of teeth of both jaws is good. The estimated age, height and color of hair of the remains compare favorably with GORDON as the above table will indicate. X-6068 should, therefore, be identified as those of GORDON.
