I undersigned Charles Lang born on the 10 -10 - 1901 at Meyersviller and residing in the same locality certify to have found three American soldiers killed during the Battle of Lemberg (About January 1945.)

(1) On the spot named Hopfkohl commune of Lemberg, the identification papers have been sent to the Ministry of Prisoners, Deportees and Refugees at Metz. The named has been killed by shell splitters.

(2) On the spot named Spitzenberg soldiers Blomberg Marvin 37578186 - T 44 -44 AP killed by shells splitters.

(3) Reuel B Stubrich 36971637 T 44 AP killed by shell splitters.

Besides I certify to have buried those three soldiers on the 21st of May 1945, in the afternoon at 1500 hours after having taken away all the papers and the dog tags, which I have given to day to the American commission.

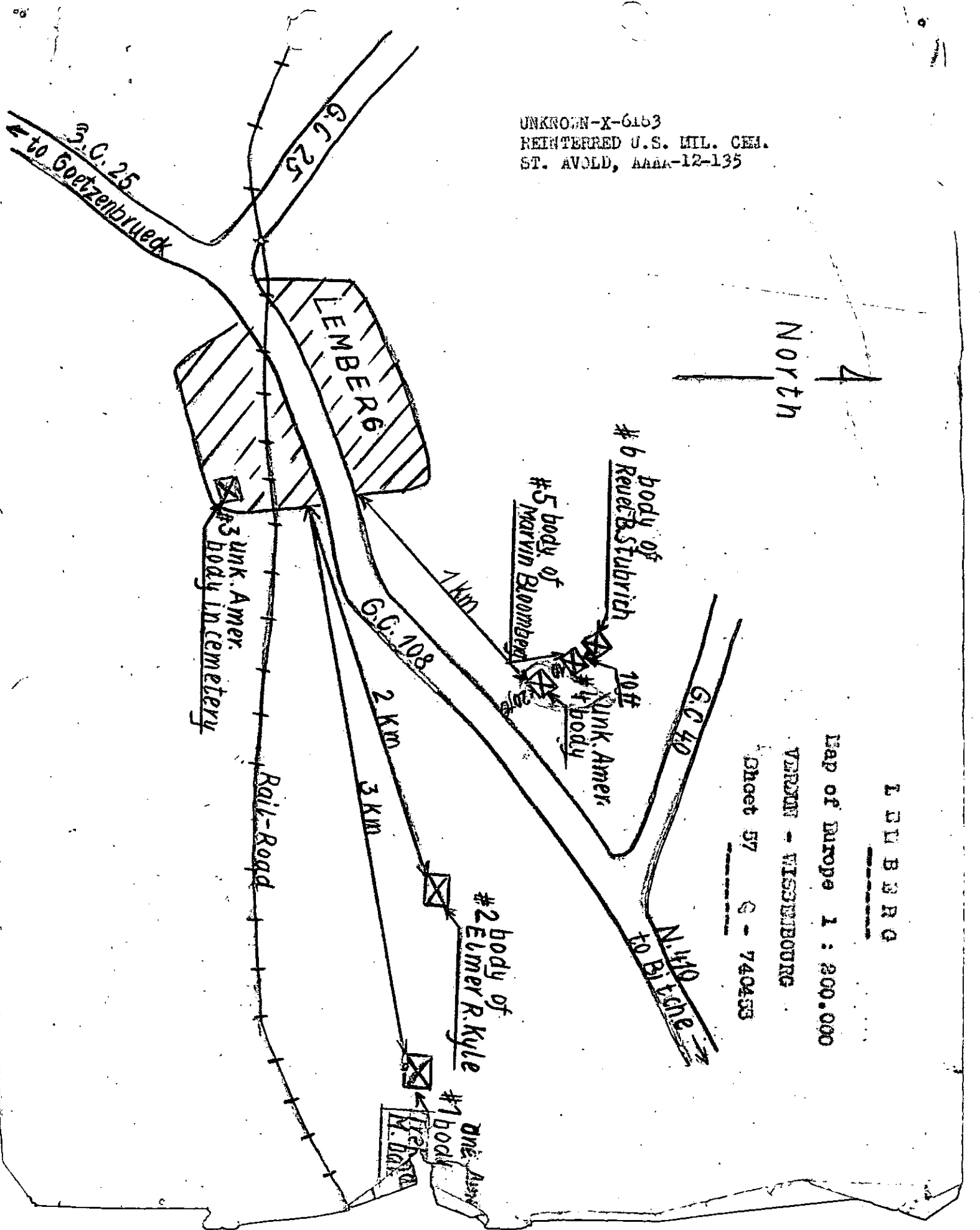
