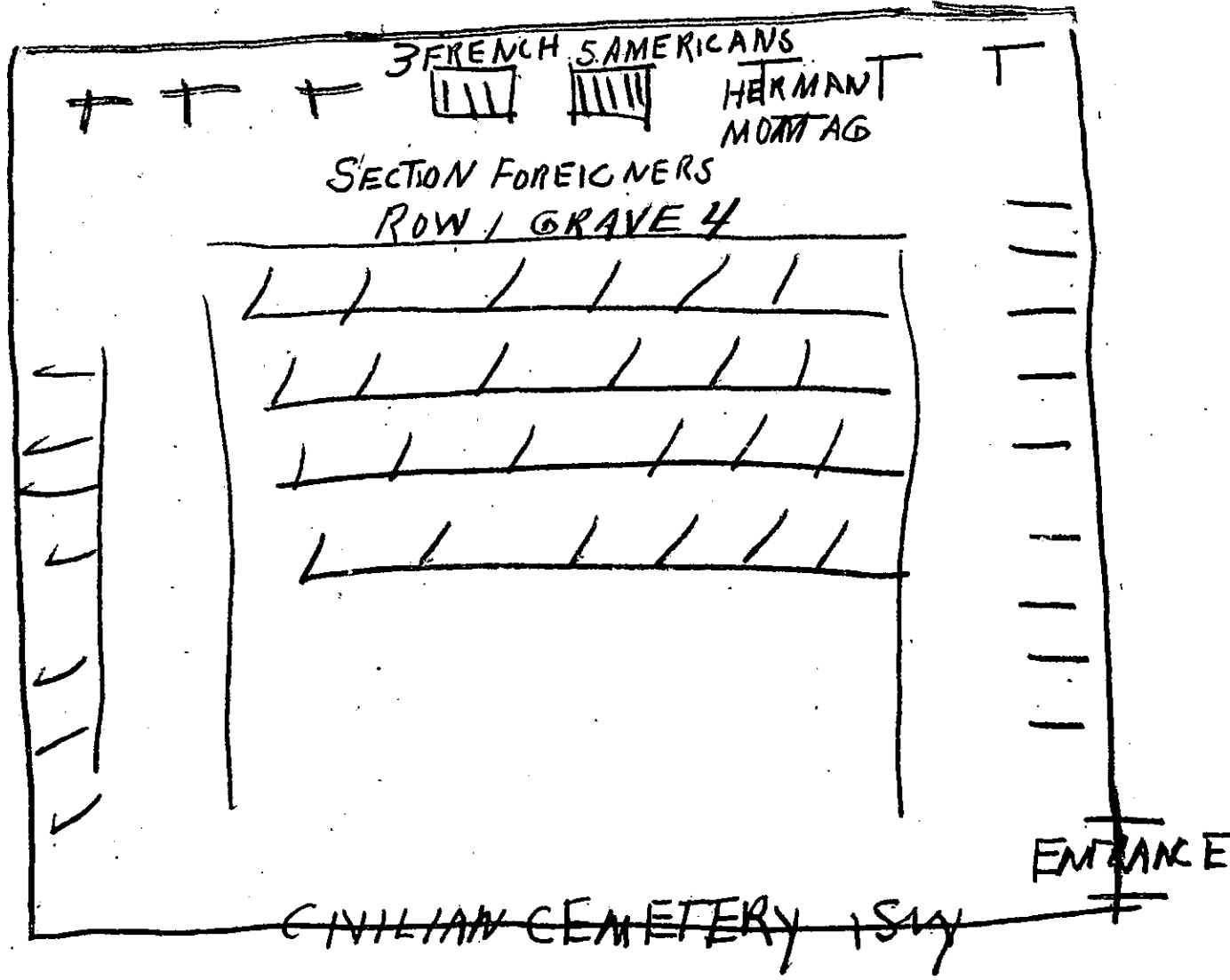

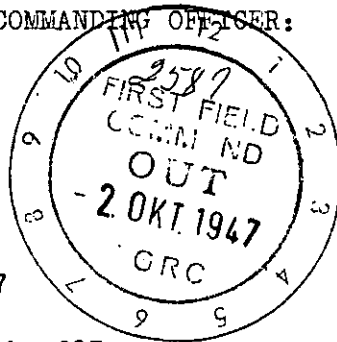

SUBJECT: Crash of an American Plane.

In the evening of 26 April 1945 the town of Sonthheim was occupied by American troops.

On Friday, 27 April 1945, at about 0600 hours an American reconnaissance plane passed over our town and was suddenly attacked by German fighter planes (4 or 8 Me-109), and then crashed about 250 meters outside of the village near the saw-mill of Martin Haugg. According to the inhabitants, one of the two pilots was believed to have been killed and the other wounded. Both were taken away by their comrades (Place unknown).

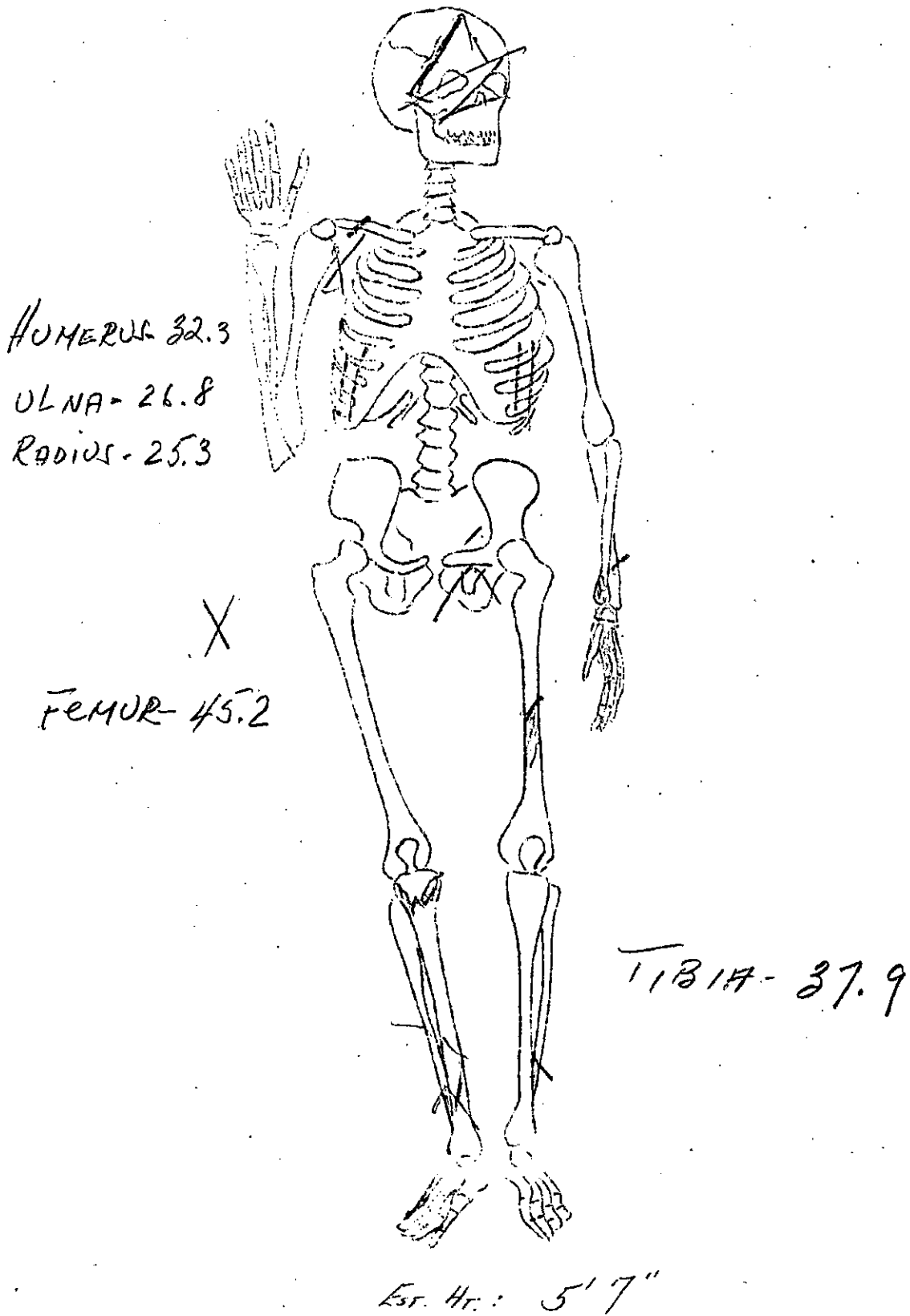

UNKNOWN NO? X-629I U.S. MILITARY CEMETERY St, Avold, France
(Location)

1. The remains of X-629I were recovered from a civilian cemetery in Isny-Wangen, Germany, with four other remains. Three of these remains were identified as crew members of A/C 42-102927 at the time of disinterment; the fifth remains are assigned X-6434. One crew member of A/C 42-102927 is yet to be accounted for, S/Sgt. William H. Barlow Jr. I5340780. The tooth chart for the remains of X-629I is negative to the tooth chart for S/Sgt. Barlow. There are no identifying clues with the remains of X6434.

2. The remains of X-629I were associated with S/Sgt. Robert D. Jamieson, 35552178 by a comparison of tooth charts obtained for all casualties in the Memmingen area. The tooth chart for the remains of X-629I is in agreement with the tooth chart as obtained for S/Sgt. Jamieson. The estimated height and color of hair for the remains of X-629I are in agreement with the height and color of hair for S/Sgt. Jamieson.

3. The dental information available at this headquarters is not sufficient to establish identity of the remains of X-629I as S/Sgt. Jamieson. Dental information was requested from OQMG the 22 June 1949 and a photostat copy of the top side of a form 79 was forwarded along with a letter stating that a dental chart (date unknown) showed teeth missing R-I6. A second request to OQMG for further dental information from next of kin was negative as the next of kin stated that no civilian dental information was available.

4. S/Sgt. Jamieson is the only casualty from A/C 44-6177. Survivors statements give no clue as to S/Sgt. Jamieson's whereabouts except that the line of flight of A/C 42-102927 would have been over or nearly over the burial site of the remains of X-629I. German Dulag reports list the members of S/Sgt. Jamieson's crew as captured but list S/Sgt. Jamieson as missing. (ME*1618) Also there is notable discrepancies in this Dulag report as the date is listed as the 17 July 1944 instead of the 18 July 1944 and the time reported shot down is 15:00 hrs. instead of the MACR time as last being sighted of 10:45 to 11:00 hrs. and the portion of serial number reported on the A/C is 862 which is not in agreement with the digits of the serial number for A/C 44-6177.

5. The remains of X-629I can not be associated with any other casualties in this theater.

6. Therefore due to the lack of conclusive dental information and other identifying clues the remains of X-629I are declared "Unidentifiable".
