Während des Kampfes und der Übergabe der Stadt Munderkingen an die Alliierten Truppen war ich in Stellvertretung als Bürgermeister tätig. Über den Soldatentod der beiden amerik. Soldaten kann ich nur Folgendes berichten:

Die alliierten Truppen kamen am Nachmittag des 22.4.45 vom Norden her an unsere Stadt heran, dabei kam es zum Kampfe zwischen amerik. Panzertruppen und den hier stationiert gewesenen deutschen Pionieren. Der Kampf dauerte etwa von 17,30 Uhr bis 20 Uhr. Gegen 23 Uhr dieses Tages wurden von uns die ersten 5 Toten (1 Amerikaner, 4 Deutsche) auf das rechte Donau-Ufer geborgen. Da die Brücke gesprengt war, wurden sie mit einem Boot über die Donau gebracht und zunächst in der Feuerwehrrhalle im Erdgeschoss des Rathauses niedergelegt. Am Abend des Montag 23.4.45 kamen die ersten beiden amerik. Soldaten in die Stadt. Diesen habe ich die Leiche des amerik. Soldaten gezeigt. Sie haben daraufhin den Nachlass desselben gegen meinen Einspruch mitgenommen (einschließlich Erkennungsmarke) und erklärt, dass der Tote von ihnen abgeholt wird. So kam es, dass dieser Tote als unbekannt sodann hier beerdigt wurde.

Am Dienstag 24.4.45 wurde wiederum im Kampfgebiet nördlich der Stadt die Leiche eines amerik. Soldaten gefunden. Auch dieser Tote wurde sofort geborgen und wieder in die Feuerwehrrhalle zu den anderen Toten gelegt. Es wurden schnellstens Säрге angefertigt. Der zweite Tote hatte den Namen Charles Andrew, wie aus seinem Nachlass festzustellen war. Am Mittwoch 25.4.45 nachmittags war ein amerik. Offizier bei mir auf dem Bürgermeisteramt, dem ich die beiden Leichen zeigte und ihm sagte, dass es höchste Zeit sei, sie zu beerdigen. Statement

About the 2 American soldiers killed during the battle near Munderkingen.

I was acting Burgermeister of Munderkingen when there were combats around the town and when finally the town capitulated before the allied forces. Regarding the death of the 2 US Soldiers I can state only the following:

The allied forces reached the town-limit of Munderkingen in the afternoon of the 22 April 1945, coming from north. The American armored forces were engaged into combats by German engineer outfits, billeting here. The combats lasted from 1730 hours to 2000 hours. At about 2300 hours on the same day 5 dead were found and brought to the right side of the Danube. There were 4 German and 1 American bodies. As the bridge across the Danube had been blown up, they were brought across the river in a boat and for the time being laid down in the hall of the town-hall. In the evening of 23 Apr 1945 the first two American soldiers entered the town. I have showed them the body of the American. Thereupon they have taken with them his personal effects in spite of my objecting to it; the identification tag was taken by them as well and they told me that they would come back to get the body. That is the reason why the body was buried here as unknown.

On Tuesday, 24 April 1945, in the fighting area northwards from the town, another dead American soldier was found. This body too was put down in the town-hall beside the other one. As soon as possible I had caskets made. According to his personal effects the name of the second American was Charles Andrew.

On Wednesday, 25 Apr 1945 in the afternoon, an American officer entered my office whom I showed the two bodies and I said that it was high time to bury the dead. Thereupon he countered me that the 2 bodies will not be taken by Americans but it will be up to us to take care for their interment. Immediately I gave orders concerning the burial and both Americans were buried on Friday, 27 April 1945 by the priest Haibt together with the Germans killed in action. They were all buried in the field of honor of this cemetery. The bodies of the American soldiers lie in wooden caskets, which are colored brown. There is a wooden cross on their grave-hill.

X-6612 was recovered from Munderkingen, Germany, map sheet L-49.

AG casualty listings indicate that only one man was killed at Munderkingen; S/Sgt Benjamin J. PARENTE, 31251860 of the 20th Armored Infantry Battalion, Co "A".
