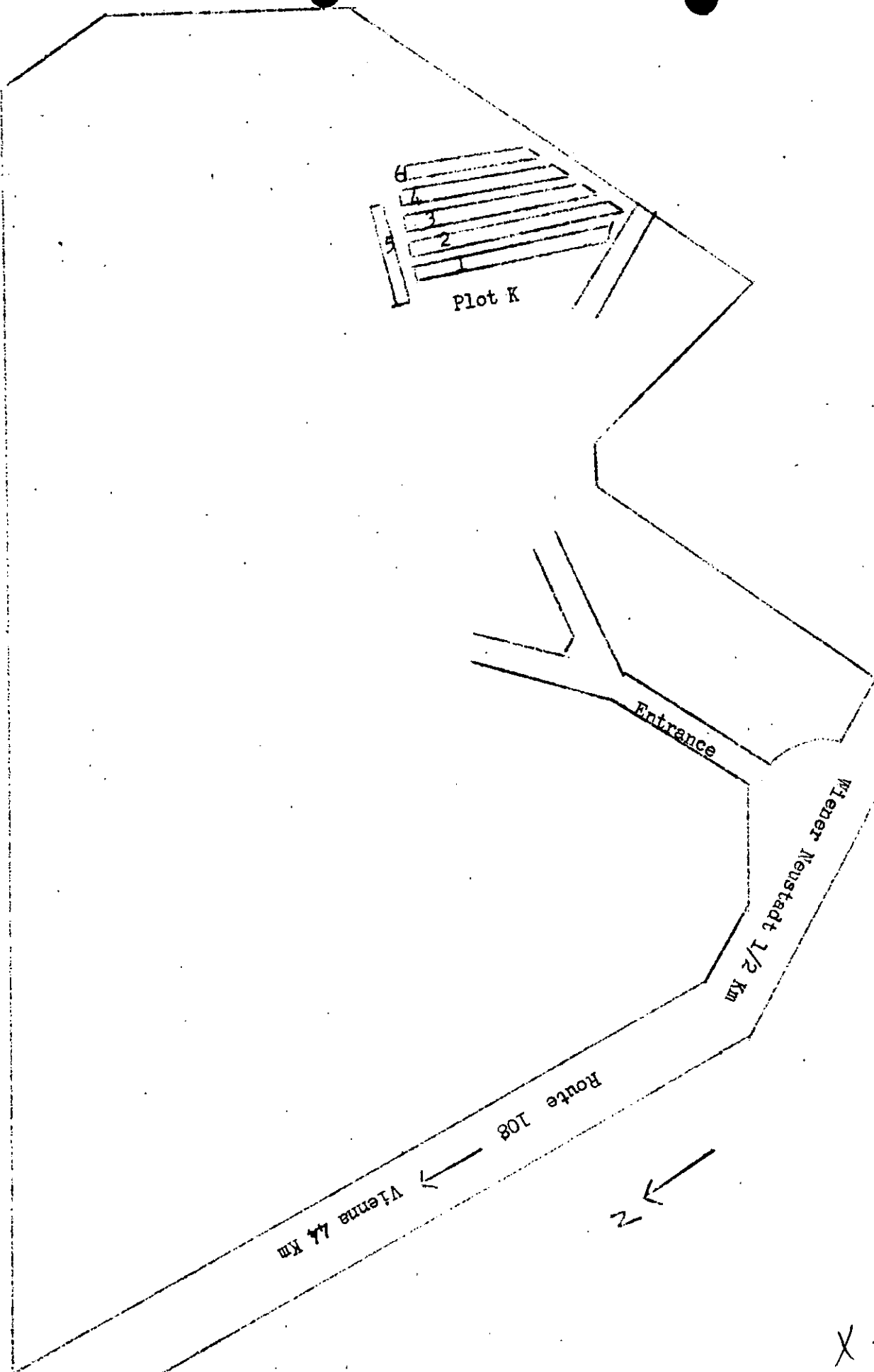

1. Unknown X-7031 was disinterred from a common grave in the civilian cemetery of Wiener-Neustadt, Austria, with the remains of thirty-three (33) other American casualties. A total of twenty-three (23) of subject casualties have been interred as Knowns in USMC at St. Avold.
2. Laundry mark, "P-9053", found on OD Wool Trousers of X-7031 has been checked in the world casualty book this Hq and is in agreement with last initial and last four digits of ASN of T/Sgt. Prescott C. PIPER, 16079053 who is interred in USMC Neuville, Plot GG, Row 3, Grave 71.
3. Reprocessing of the remains of X-7031 revealed no further identifying clues or associating factors.
4. Tooth chart obtained for X-7031 has been checked against the tooth charts for Known casualties in Austria (Map Sheets O-48 & O-49), insofar as possible, with negative results.
5. It is recommended that X-7031 St Avold be made Unidentifiable.
