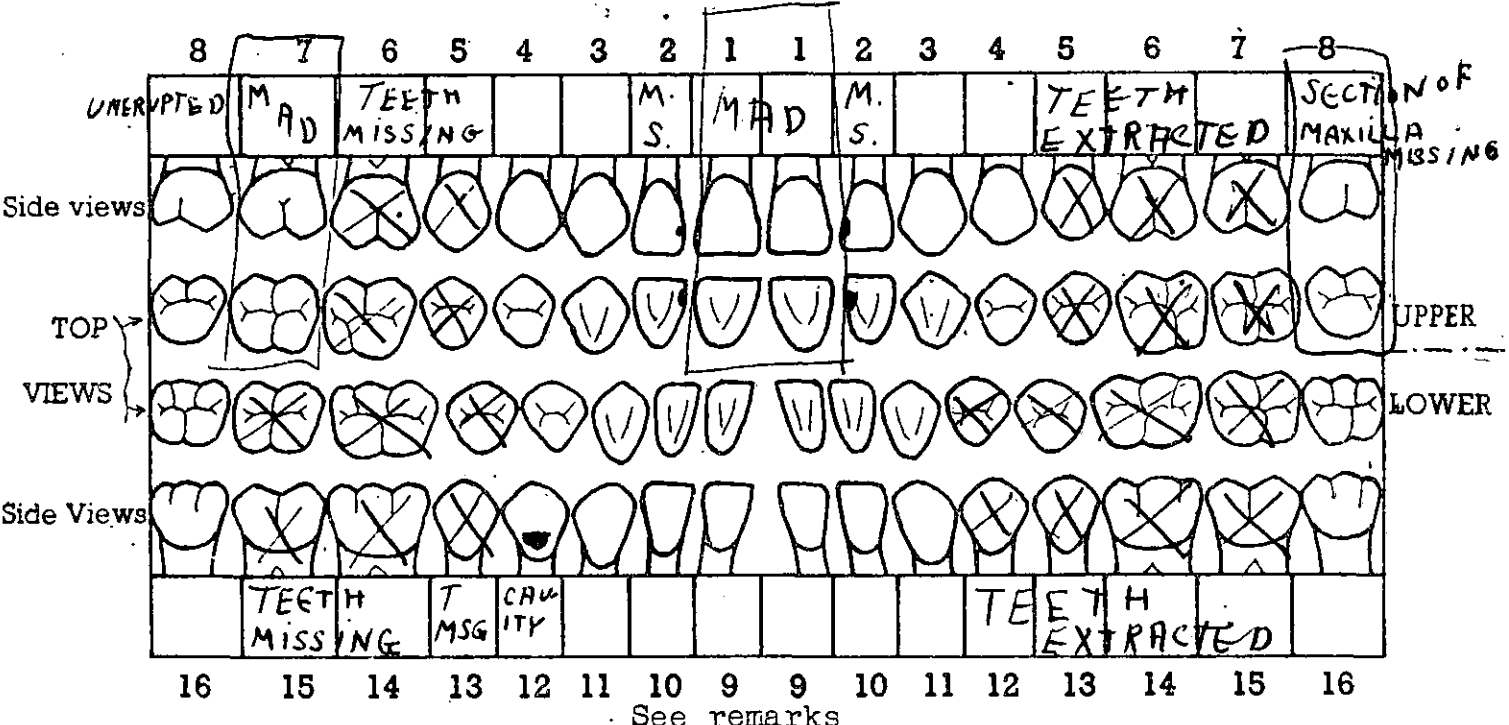

This dental chart is very important and should be filled in with great care. There are 32 teeth to be accounted for, as shown by the numbers on the chart. Beginning at the middle line in both upper and lower jaws, the teeth are arranged symmetrically on either side and classed as incisors (cutting teeth), cuspids or canines (tearing teeth), bicuspids (chewing teeth), and molars (principal chewing teeth). An examination should be made and findings charted to cover the following basic conditions: Lost teeth, crowned teeth, bridge work, fillings, caries (cavities of decay), dentures (plates), and any deformity of jaws found. 

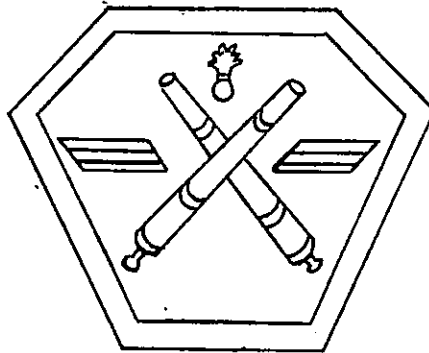

REPORT FOR LABORATORY

It is the opinion of the writer that the brass type military badge in question which bears the combined insignias of Air Corps, Artillery and Infantry (Grenadier) is of Italian nationality. The insignias of the Spanish Army are composed of a lion and the turret of a castle.

The insignia in question could also be of some new division which was organized during the Spanish war and also fought during the war in 1940. These divisions were composed of both Italian and Spanish Nationals.

The printed papers which were found in the personal effects on this body were written in Spanish and contain data given to navigators. They were notes on navigation and also information regarding most of the ports in Europe and the United States.

The following was read from the loose sheet of note book paper. The writing was in Spanish.

This dental chart is very important and should be filled in with great care. There are 32 teeth to be accounted for, as shown by the numbers on the chart. Beginning at the middle line in both upper and lower jaws, the teeth are arranged symmetrically on either side and classed as incisors (cutting teeth), cuspids or canines (tearing teeth), bicuspids (chewing teeth), and molars (principal chewing teeth). An examination should be made and findings charted to cover the following basic conditions: Lost teeth, crowned teeth, bridge work, fillings, caries (cavities of decay), dentures (plates), and any deformity of jaws found.
