

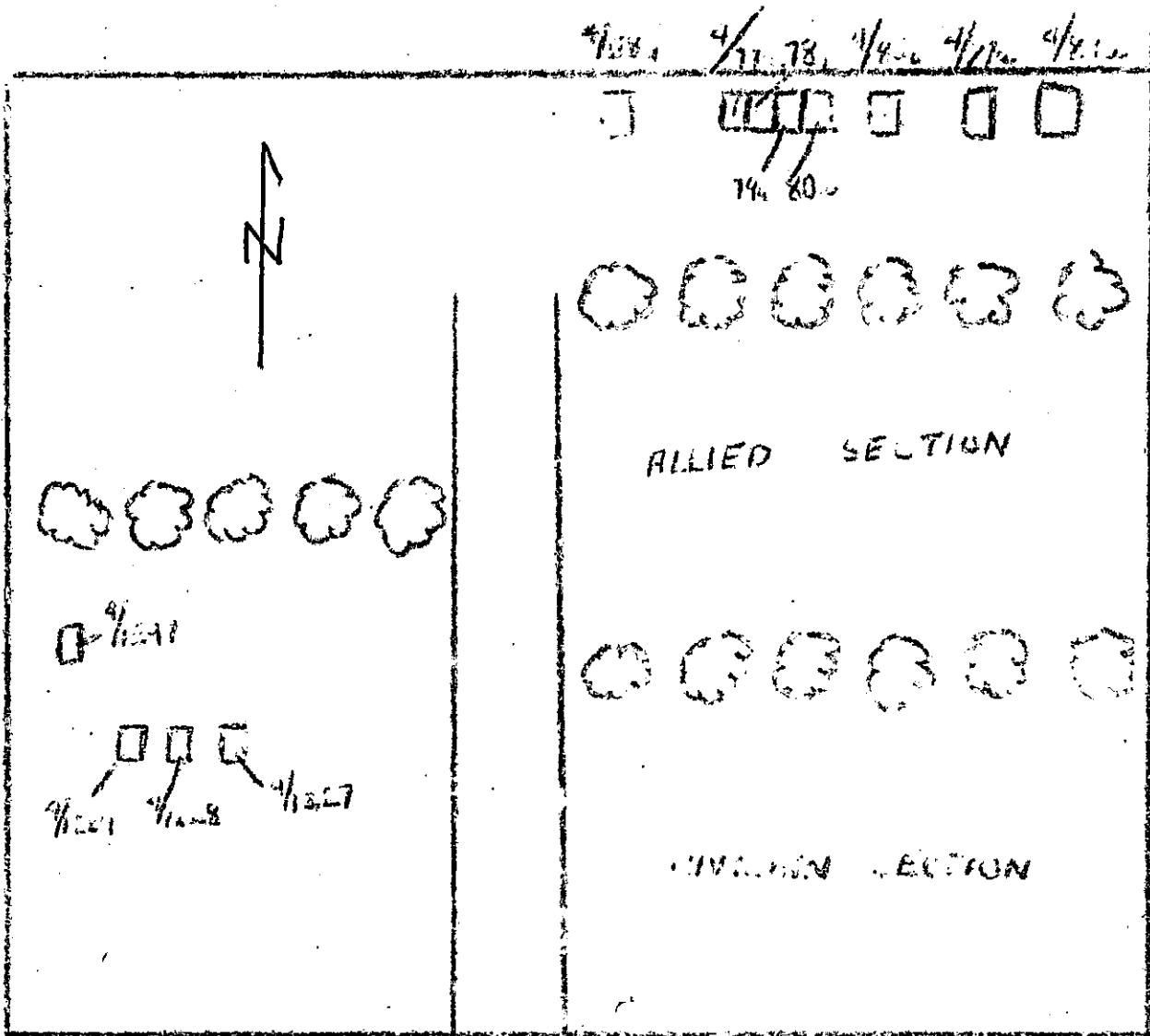

Team # 3, 95th CM Bn. (M) reached Halle on the night of 28th August 1946 and proceeded to the Gertruden Civilian Cemetery, Halle, Germany (M 52 D 92 1/250.000) on the morning of the 29th August. Ten single graves were located which were marked by crosses with U.S.A., last name of American, and date of death. Disinterring operations were started immediately.

The report of investigation stated that two other graves, 4/1227 and 4/1229 were American although marked by crosses as English. These were also disinterred. Between these two graves was one of the ten American graves, 1/1228, which was marked as Weinstein.

- 4/1228 contained one American flyer, marked as Weinstein.
- 4/1229 contained one American flyer, marked as Ulanowa, but who had the identification tag of Bernard Weinstein.

All crosses were obviously placed over the graves at a much later date than the burials.

Request that the thirteen remains from Halle be give priority in processing so operations in the town of Halle may be resumed as soon as possible. Would like a report on how cases resolved.

1. The records pertaining to Unknown X - 7391, Plot K00K
Row 12, Grave 283, USMC ST. AVOLD, France,

have been reviewed and it is the opinion of this Office that sufficient evidence is not available at the present time to establish the identity of the deceased concerned. The remains concerned should be classified as unidentifiable at the present time.

2. Report of Reprocessing of remains was forwarded to your Office by Transmittal Letter No. 4217, dated 12-8-49.

3. Remarks: All the available dental information for the subject 10 deceased in Halle Bombing have been compared with tooth charts obtained for X-175, X-7384, X-7391, X-7428 St. Avold, and X-5913 Neuville, and no definite association to establish identification could be made.

1. Reference is made to Burial Reports for Unknowns E-175, 190, X-7394, Y-7391 and X-7428 USMC St. Avold, France and X-5913 USMC Neuville-on-Candros, Belgium. These are the only remains recovered from Fortrauden Cemetery, Halle, Germany as yet unidentified, or for whom a tentative association does not exist.

2. Previous investigation has resulted in the tentative association of all known dead resulting from the Halle bombing, with the exception of the following seven (7) men:

Efforts of this Office to associate any of the men referred to in paragraph 2 with the Unknowns listed in paragraph 1, above, have been unsuccessful to date; however, there is no record of a recent reprocessing of Unknowns X-175, X-190, X-7391 St. Avold, or X-5913 Neuville.

4. It is requested that an investigation, to include reprocessing if necessary, be conducted by your Headquarters and if any identifications can be established that the facts be presented to a Field Board of Review and the findings forwarded this Office.
