The remains now designated Unknown X-7778 (USIC Saint Avold) were recovered from the civilian cemetery at Hochmutting, Germany. At time of processing at Central Identification Point it was found that what was recovered as an individual remains was a mass burial and the case was segregated. The other remains was designated X-7775. The case of X-7775 was declared Unidentifiable and has been approved by CFIG. All efforts to associate this case with an individual or an air-crew has proved negative. In view of this it is recommended that this case be declared Unidentifiable.

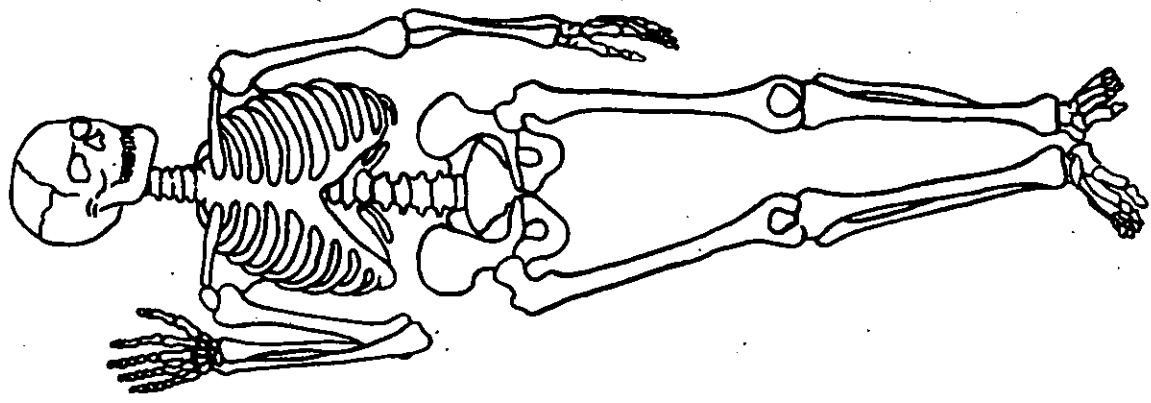

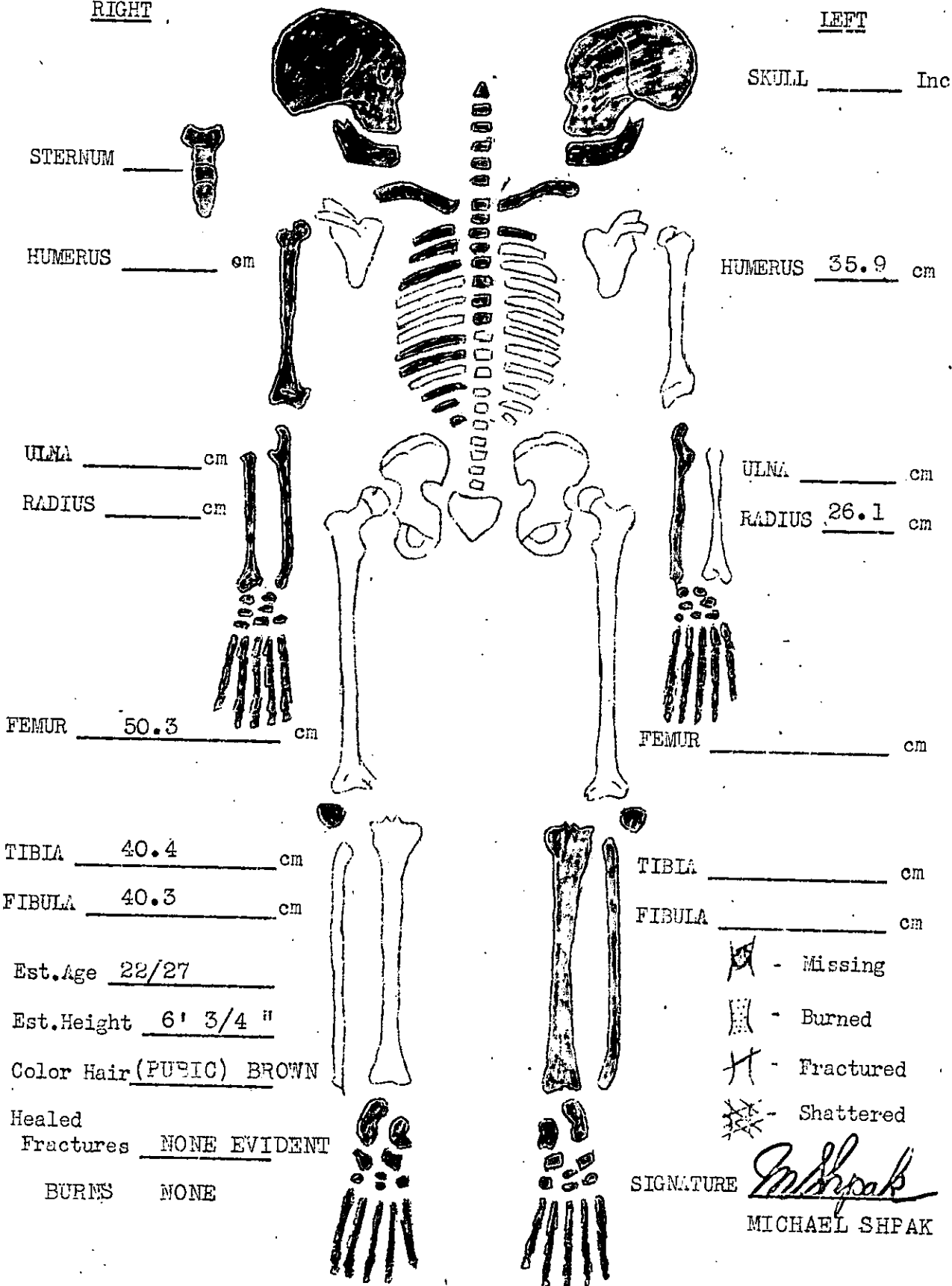
SKELETAL CHART

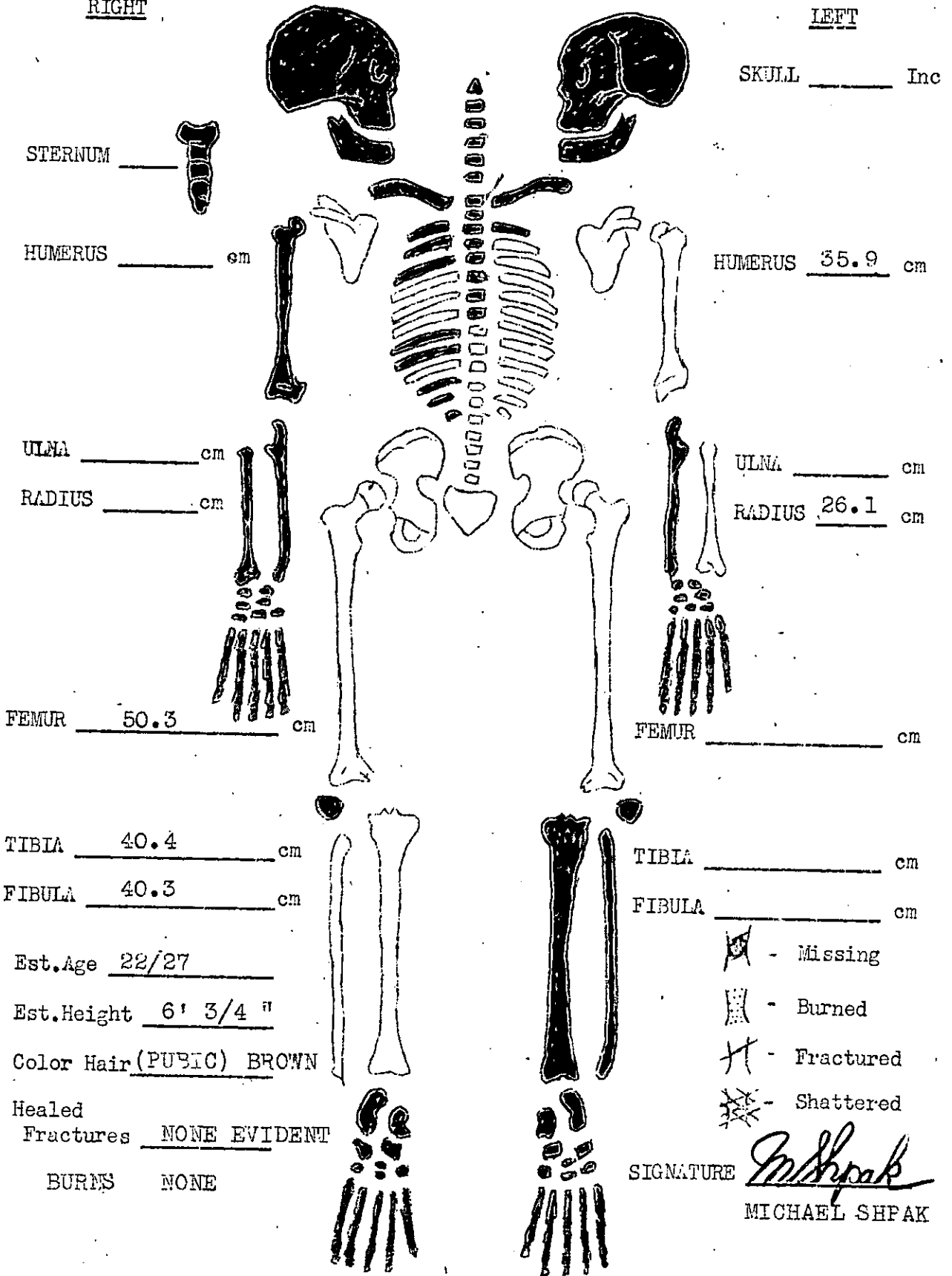
SKELETAL CHART
