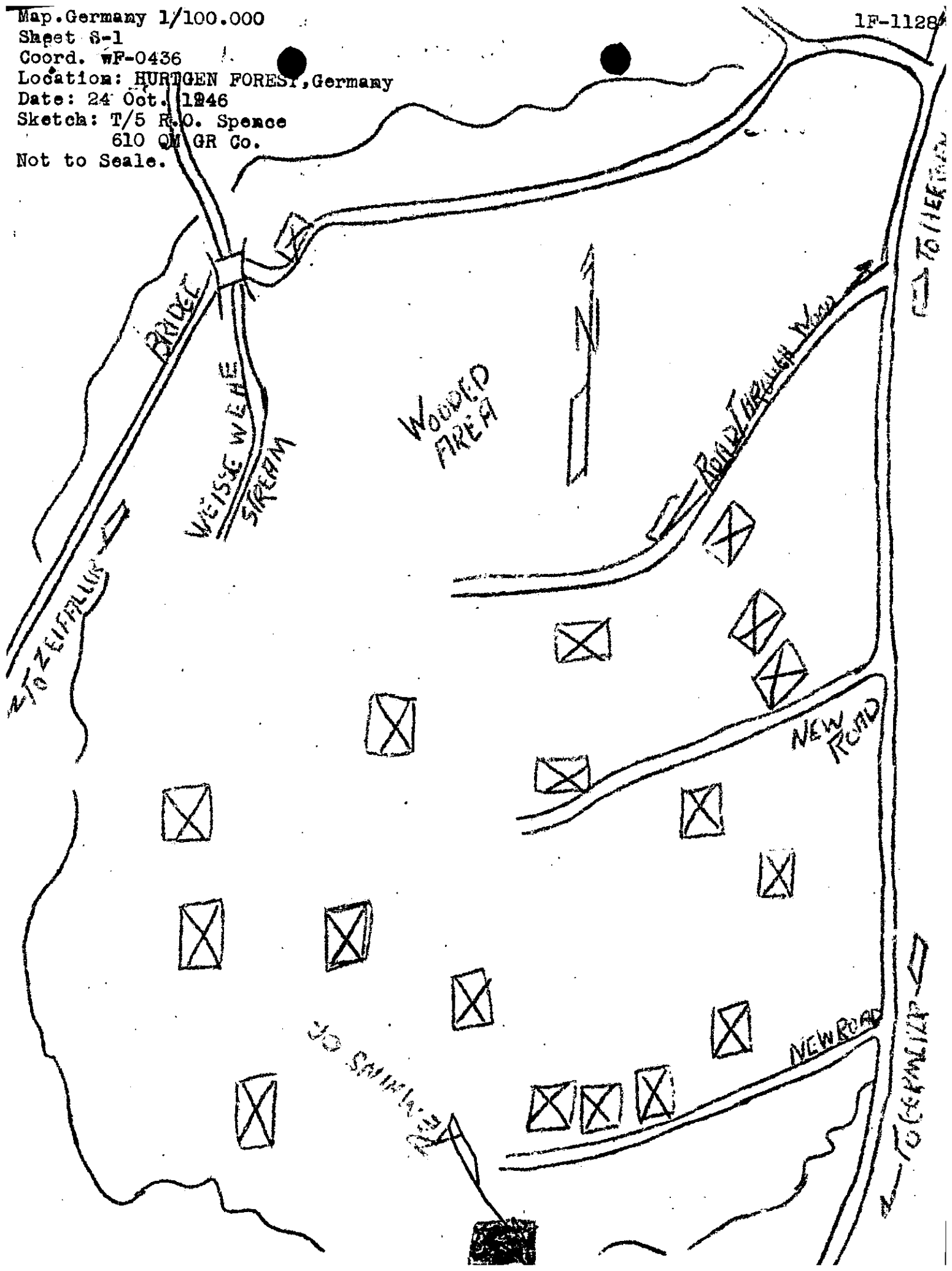

It is requested that when the proceeds of redemption of foreign currencies listed on CIP lists 102 through 110 are forwarded to this Bureau, an itemized break-down of the amount due each individual from proceeds of foreign currency be furnished. This information is necessary in view of the differing types of currencies listed, redemption at less than full value due to presence of mutilated currency and the fluctuation of exchange rates.
5. It is further requested that any foreign currency found to be non-convertible by your office be forwarded to this Bureau for transmittal as souvenir currency and in such denominations as will enable transmittal to the individual recipients.
